Deacon Initiative

The leadership at HMCC is committed to establishing and developing a Deacon Ministry, one that reflects the biblical model of servant leadership and equips faithful men to serve Christ's Church with excellence.

The position of Deacon is defined according to 1 Timothy 3:8-10 and Acts 6:1-6; 7. A Deacon is called to assist the Elders in the work of shepherding, service, administration, and training Christ's Church for effective ministry. As we study Scripture, it's clear that deacons hold an essential position and function in the church. The first deacons are possibly revealed in Acts 6, where faithful servants were chosen to meet the needs of the growing church. One of those servant leaders, Stephen, preached the longest sermon recorded in the New Testament (Acts 7)! The apostle Paul also greets the leadership at Philippi, writing: "To all God's holy people in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons." Philippians 1:1 (NIV). In 2026, our Elders will begin prayerfully seeking and equipping men who are called to serve in the role of Deacon.
