## Missional Support

We give thanks for our ongoing partnerships with ministries in **Ethiopia** and **Zimbabwe**, where your giving continues to make a tangible difference. Quarterly support is sent to Ethiopia to strengthen local church ministries and leadership development, while we also remain committed to supporting our missional partners in Zimbabwe. These partnerships embody our shared call to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth.

## Financial Overview

The financial position of the conference remains strong, with healthy balances and consistent stewardship. Connectional giving continues to reflect the faithfulness of our churches and their shared commitment to the mission of the Gospel.

A special note of gratitude is extended for the generous gift from the **Virgil E. and Mildred I. Fussell Estate**. These funds have been transferred to the **Mississippi Foundation** to ensure proper management and long-term growth. In accordance with the wishes of the donors, the committee is working to establish a scholarship fund that will provide educational support aligned with the mission and values of the estate and our annual conference.

## Administrative Progress

The committee continues to develop and refine key forms and administrative policies to better serve our churches and clergy. These include updates to clergy compensation guidelines, vacation and family leave policies, parsonage inspection forms, and moving procedures. Once finalized, these materials will be available through the conference website and distributed through presiding elders as needed.

We were honored to attend the District Meetings for the Southern Oklahoma District, the Tulsa District, and the OKC District. ## Committee Updates:

### 1. Purpose and Mission

The Heartland Camping Ministry Oversight Committee was created last year (2024) to equip, resource, and support local churches and leaders in offering transformational camp experiences where children, youth, and adults encounter Christ, grow in faith, and live out the mission of the Church. Our primary goal is to ensure that every camp connected to the Heartland Conference reflects the values of the Global Methodist Church, rooted in Scripture, centered in Christ, and committed to making disciples who pursue holiness of heart and life and spread Scriptural holiness in our communities.

### 2. Responsibilities

This committee exists to

- Provide endorsement and oversight by approving and supporting camps within the Heartland Conference that align with conference standards for safety, theology, and leadership.
- Assist camp leadership by providing resources such as policies, sharing curriculum, and best practices.
- Provide evaluation and feedback to ensure healthy and sustainable camping ministries.

### 3. Highlights

Over the past year, we

- Met 3 times on Google meets
- Developed and implemented the Camping Endorsement Policy.
- Approved and promoted 4 camps across the conference that served 135 campers and 65 leaders.

### 4. Looking ahead

- We want to create a network of endorsed camps throughout the conference, working with local churches to develop camps in their region.
- Create a Camp Leadership Resource Hub with downloadable curriculum and forms.

# Church Planting Committee Quarterly Report

## Committee Updates:

The Church Planting Committee met for a two-day meeting on August 12-13 at Asbury Church in Wichita, Kansas. The purpose of the meeting was to respond to the Annual Conference motion to develop a church planting strategy for the Heartland Annual Conference. A Vision for Church Planting document was presented which focuses on the principle of churches planting churches in accordance with Biblical examples and the Wesleyan emphasis on Class meetings. Three types of church plants were addressed with documents supporting this emphasis. These models are Satellite Campuses, House Churches and Pioneer Churches. Another document was presented on funding church plants using matching funds. After thorough discussion the documents were amended and the Chair, Chris Tiger agreed to put these documents together to form one document on church planting strategy. A 26-page document has been completed which will be distributed to leadership groups in the Heartland Conference.

The need for church planting is increasingly evident as areas within the Heartland Conference are identified as having no presence of a GMC church or that there is not a strong presence of the GMC in larger cities and major county seat towns. Churches are seeing the need to expand to neighboring towns that do not have a GMC presence. Also, there are those who are being called to plant new churches in our midst. It is hoped that the strategy of planting new churches in the Heartland Conference will multiply disciples and churches.

### Committee Updates:

The GMC is committed to its mission. Holding church leadership accountable is vital to achieve our goal. Accountability should be truthful, just, and fair. The Administrative Review Committee helps uphold these values and our mission.

Thankfully, the Administrative Review Committee has not met for its official purpose. It met during annual conference for training and review of its responsibilities. An overview of the accountability timeline and required notices has been produced and provided to the Committee on Investigation and Conference Leadership Committee. The remainder of this report consists of a minimal overview of the accountability procedure and review.

There are two categories of leadership failures that may be alleged: 1. Misconduct, professional and/or personal; and 2. Administrative performance, including incompetence, ineffectiveness, or unwillingness or inability to complete the task and responsibilities required. Many situations may be resolved by the local church. But some require or should involve the inclusion of conference leadership.

Administrative matters are considered in a different manner than misconduct allegations. The final step involving an administrative matter is a review by the Administrative Review Committee. Resolutions should be just, and processes should be fair. The committee does its part by reviewing the record of proceedings to assure that all people involved were given a proper form of notice, within the proper timeframes, and were given an opportunity to be heard. The review is important to help safeguard the integrity of the process and to keep the trust of every member of the GMC.
