

## Heartland Cabinet Quarterly Report

---

### Committee Updates:

Once again we who make up the Cabinet of the Heartland Conference consider it an honor and a privilege to serve as Presiding Elders under the leadership of our Conference Superintendent Jordan McFall, and our Bishop, Jeff Greenway. And I, as the Dean of the Cabinet, am so very grateful for the labor of love by the men and women who oversee our 15 districts in the conference.

It has been a very busy 4th quarter as one of our main tasks was to oversee the Church/Charge Conferences in our respective districts. Some of the Provisional Elders (PEs) met with each individual church. Some met as a whole district. And some broke up the districts and met together to better address geographical proximity. No matter, the reports from the PEs were wonderful. The development of relationships, the building of trust, and the feelings that the local church was being heard were shared by many.

We continue to work together to identify clergy (or CLMs) to fill open churches, whether full time or part time. At times the process moves quickly. Other times, there is a call to be patient. We still need to fill a PE position in the West Central Kansas District. We hope to have that position filled soon. Please be in prayer about these openings.

We (and the churches) recognize that some of the “newness” is wearing off and that there is the reality that the emphasis on ministry lies within the membership of the local church, not from a staff on the conference level. That is still taking some time for churches to live into that reality as it at times has been too easy to want to call the conference to “fix” a problem, or “address” a concern. So churches are being challenged to identify and raise up leaders in the local church, to pray, to discern, to vision together as the body, and to be willing to step out of the way it’s always been done, into that which God is calling the church to do.

As a cabinet we have been reading and discussing a book entitled Hero Maker by Dave Ferguson and Warren Bird. In the book it identifies Five Essential Practices for Leaders to Multiply Leaders. So we are spending considerable time discussing and looking at ways we can help our churches move from an “addition mindset” to that of “multiplication.” There is a difference. Stay tuned. You’ll hear more about it.

As mentioned in the last report, nothing replaces face to face meetings and conversation. Thus, we will be meeting February 2 and 3 at New Covenant Church in Wichita to meet, fellowship, pray, worship, and vision together as we live into 2026. Keep us in your prayers. We promise to do the same for you.
