1. Introduction

The Ethiopian Nazrawiyan Annual Conference of the GMC is actively advancing the kingdom of God in Ethiopia through the preaching of the gospel. ENAC serves people in such a way that it lets them grow in their lives by preaching the gospel, winning new souls into the kingdom of God, teaching basic Bible doctrine, encouraging them to grow in their spiritual lives, and encouraging people to grow in their lives toward becoming like Christ and manifesting the life of Christ. The ENAC actively plants 100 churches every year, with a goal of 500 in the next five years, with the help of the Jesus Film ministry, local missionaries or church planters, and public evangelism in various places, particularly in areas with few or no churches and those hard to reach. The church has been actively disciplining a new member through educational programs and discipleship ministries over the past three months, from October to December 2025. We have also been preparing pastors and leaders for their respective roles at both the local church and district levels through various discipleship classes. Below, we present a detailed overview of the work accomplished during this period.

2. Major accomplishments

- Cascaded History Makers training at local church level for pastors, local church leaders, ministry coordinators as well as the general church.
- Planted 17 preaching points and churches through our evangelism and church planting ministry.
- During the quarter, 369 individuals accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior, and 455 people received water baptism across all districts.
- By mobilizing church members, the Debub Bench District has acquired land for five local churches and is constructing district centers. Additionally, Sodere from the Central District and the Hawasa 7th Camp from the South Central District are both building their own worship halls.

- By hosting revival conferences, engaging in fasting and prayer, celebrating the Lord's Supper, sharing meals, and enhancing regular worship services, we are witnessing a significant spiritual revival in our local churches.
- The Christmas holiday was celebrated with children in worship of the incarnate Lord, with children presenting songs, poems, and verses.
- A strong tradition of discipleship is being established.

3. Accomplishments during the quarter

3.1. Cascading History makers module one training

As mentioned in our last quarterly report, we conducted a three-day History Makers Module One training for 50 leaders and ministers and equipped to share this training with their local church pastors, ministry coordinators, and general church members, thanks to the financial support from the Global Methodist Church in Bishoftu. Therefore, all the trained leaders and ministers have cascaded the History Makers Module One training with local church and district ministers and leaders. The delivery of Module One has paved the way for the upcoming Module Two training in the History Makers series. Consequently, the 50 trained leaders and pastors cascaded the training to 392 ministers within the church.

Additionally, various trainings on financial literacy, church doctrine, and holy life training topics were provided for newly planted churches, as well as for church youth, choirs, and prayer leaders, to equip local ministers and foster church growth.

In general, the regular training offered, including the History Makers training, has had a positive impact on church growth, deepened intimacy with God, and inspired leaders and ministers to advance the kingdom while preparing the next generation. ENAC is committed to continuing these training initiatives for ministers, leaders, and future successors of the church.

3.2. District and local church visits

Over the past three months, the conference superintendent has successfully visited the East, Southwest, Central, and West Central districts, while the presiding elders have been actively encouraging and regularly visiting their respective local churches, especially the newly planted ones.

3.3. Evangelism and Jesus Film Ministry

The evangelism and Jesus Film ministry continued to strengthen its efforts in spreading the gospel to unreached areas, particularly in regions dominated by Muslim and Orthodox communities. This evangelistic activity was conducted through various methods, including showing the Jesus Film in different languages, public evangelism, one-on-one evangelism, and church worship ministry.

According to the table below, the districts that screened the Jesus film as part of their annual evangelism plan include Aleta Chuko, South Central, South Omo, Bensa Bona, Semen Bench, and Southeast. They reached out to 4,056 individuals and 54 new souls added into God's family across these six districts. However, eight districts were unable to show the Jesus film and instead focused on other evangelism initiatives.

Furthermore, the district evangelism team has actively spread the gospel in public areas, through one-on-one approaches, and during evangelism conferences, complementing the Jesus Film ministry. Hence, in addition to those who made decisions for Christ through the Jesus Film, 369 individuals accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior through various evangelism methods including on the regular church worship services.

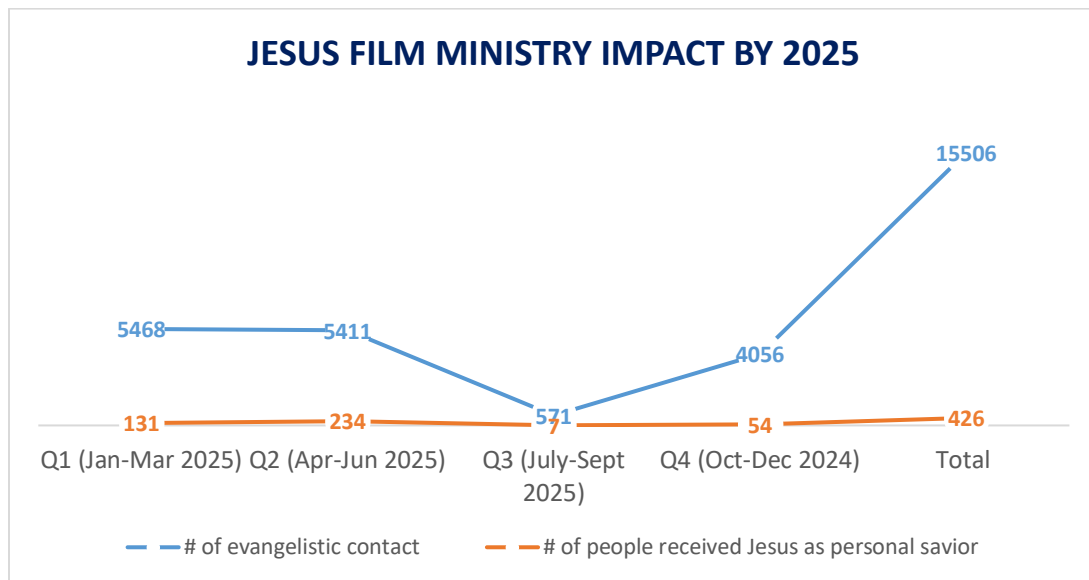


Figure1: Jesus film ministry trend by 2025

3.4. Church Planting movement

Our church is committed to fulfilling the mission given by the Lord Jesus and advancing the Kingdom of God in Ethiopia, particularly among unreached communities. In our effort to plant 100 churches in a year, we successfully planted 18 new preaching points and churches in the last three months of the 4th quarter.

This effort has resulted in the addition of 1195 new members to the church through the 17 newly planted churches and our evangelism movement across various districts. This growth reflects the effectiveness of our outreach initiatives and the commitment of our evangelism teams.

- Dehub Bench: 5 churches
- Omo: 2 churches
- Semen Bench: 1 churches
- South central: 1 churches
- West central: 1 church

Thus, our church planting efforts have resulted in the establishment of a total of 103 churches and preaching points in 2025 as the below graph depicts. The church planting movement will carry on into 2026 with great passion and a strong commitment to sustaining the planted churches, focusing on discipleship and firmly rooting them in Jesus Christ. We praise the Almighty and faithful God who has helped and guided us in evangelizing and planting 103 churches, exceeding our plans, and we ask for His continued blessings and more fruitful outcomes. We also express our sincere gratitude to the GMC Great Lakes and Heartland Conferences for their unwavering support.

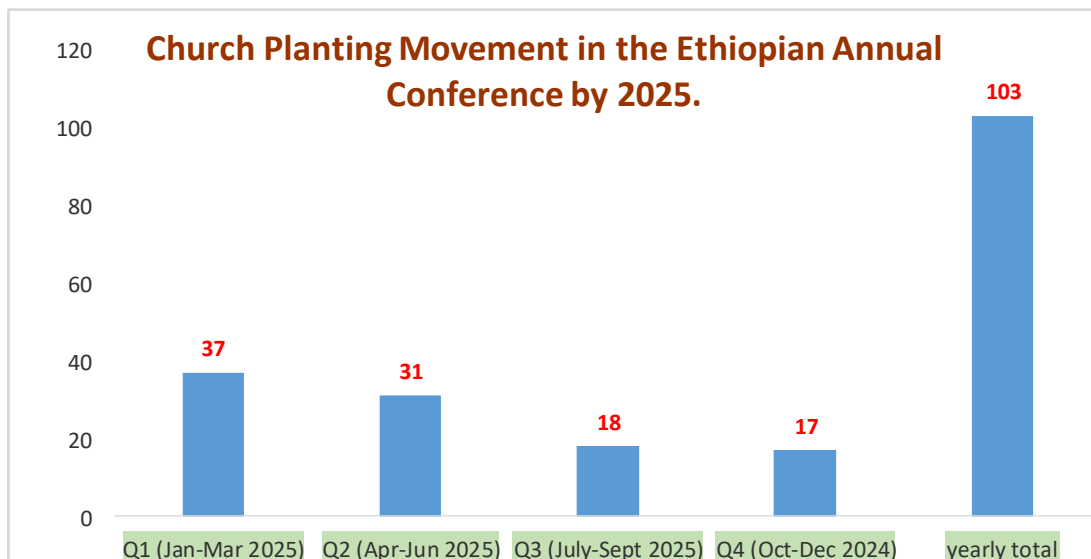


Figure 2: 2025 church planting trends by quarters

3.5. Revival conference at local church and district level

Revival conferences have been conducted in various local churches and districts of our church. The purpose of these conferences is to encourage members, strengthen fellowship, and worship God together. The district reports indicate that these conferences have been highly beneficial in comforting, encouraging, and nurturing unity among leaders, believers, and ministers. In particular, revival conferences are being organized in the Central and Debub Bench Districts of local churches during the quarter.

These revival conferences, conducted at the local church level with the facilitation of the local pastors and leaders. Therefore, ENAC will continue to enhance these efforts across all local churches, districts, and on a national level in a wide variety of areas.

3.6. Discipleship ministry

The discipleship ministry has seen significant strengthening compared to previous quarters. Strong efforts are underway in each local church to create various platforms for new believers, long-standing members, and those who are struggling, ensuring that all church members can grow into true disciples of Jesus Christ. To further enhance this ministry, the Education

Department and the district discipleship coordinators are working in collaborating with the district and local church discipleship coordinators.

The ENAC superintendency committee and the district discipleship coordinators have been following the ongoing Bible study sessions, engaging newly baptized individuals in discipleship courses, as well as children's and adult Sunday school ministry. Accordingly, most districts are integrating and providing all discipleship services for both newly baptized and existing church members to cultivate a Christ-like and spiritually fruitful life. Hence, 1,351 church members, including newly baptized believers, are successfully progressing in their discipleship journey with their pastors at their local churches.

The discipleship ministry includes Bible study, adult and children's Sunday school, training sessions, counseling, partaking in Holy Communion, sharing meals, supporting the poor and recognizing elders, group fasting, prayers, and worship within the church. To enhance this ministry, the Education and Discipleship Department is actively working to strengthen efforts and establish a robust tracking system at all levels.

3.7. Local church and district center Construction

As a church, what we have observed during this reporting period that our districts and local churches are unveiling great enthusiasm in actively mobilizing their members to acquire land for the church, construct worship halls, and establish district centers. This shift is due to some presiding leaders and pastors successfully inspiring their congregations to move from a mindset of dependency to one embodying the spirit of "We can do it ourselves; God will help us." Currently, local churches and districts those constructing their churches and district centers are mentioned as follows for prayer and encouragement.

1. **Sodere local church under central district:** The Sodere local church is actively constructing their worship hall by mobilizing their congregation. This effort has been supported by small contributions from individuals through GMC. The church members are coming together, demonstrating a collective commitment to building their place of worship, showing their determination to grow and strengthen their church through this construction.

2. **Hawasa 7th camp local church:** As noted in our last quarterly report, land has been purchased for this local church, and the church members are now in the process of constructing their worship hall. This development reflects the commitment of the congregation to establish a dedicated space for worship and community activities.



3. **South Central district center:** The district leaders are actively mobilizing the local churches within their jurisdiction to construct a standard fence in compliance with the government's corridor development campaign. This initiative demonstrates their commitment to adhere to regulations while ensuring a safe and organized environment for their community activities.

4. **Debub Bench district:** This newly established district is located southwest of Ethiopia, approximately 700 km from Addis Ababa. The district advisory board is actively mobilizing their local churches to begin collecting materials such as iron sheets, nails, and wood to construct their district center. They have also purchased land for five local churches, reflecting their commitment to strengthening the church and establishing a solid foundation for future growth.

3.8. The Church Regular ministry and its results

In the church's regular services, pastors, presiding elders and district advisory boards work hard and together. This ongoing spiritual activity helps the church achieve its mission, tend to its flocks, and get ready for the Lord's Day. At the local and district levels, our churches have been collaborating with members to hold regular worship services, conferences, training sessions, holy communions, evangelism efforts, prayer and fasting, and visits among congregations regularly.

Our statistical data, as shown in the table below, indicates that there are 218 local churches with 30,447 full church members across our 14 districts. During the reporting period, 369 individuals accepted Jesus as their personal Savior, 552 attended doctrinal classes, 534 were baptized, and 1,351 participated in discipleship classes.

This success has been achieved primarily through the help and guidance of the Holy Spirit, then, the strong commitment of our conference superintendent, presiding leaders, and local church pastors and the support of GMC. Their leadership and dedication have been instrumental in driving our evangelism efforts and church planting movements, enabling us to reach and transform many lives in the community.

Therefore, during the total number of church members increased by 2412 due to intensive evangelism, Christ-centered preaching, and church planting efforts across various districts, supported by the GMC and the commitment of the national office.

The impact of evangelism, church planting, and education ministries empowers the church to grow in all dimensions, aligning with the mission given by Christ. These efforts not only increase numerical growth but also deepen spiritual development, strengthen church ties, and equip individuals for discipleship, ultimately fulfilling the church's mission in spreading the Gospel and advancing the kingdom.

The following graph presents an overview of active churches, preaching points, and organized churches across various districts. In total, there are 218 active churches, with 32 preaching points and 186 organized churches. This data highlights the varying stages of church development and outreach across the districts, indicating both strengths and areas for further growth in different districts.

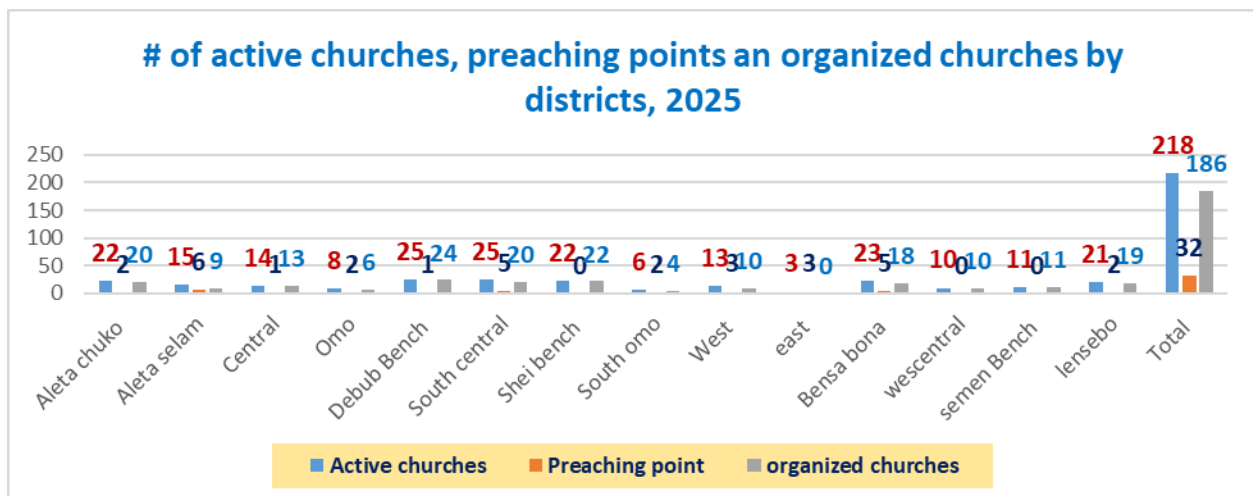


Figure 3: # of active churches, preaching points an organized churches by districts, 2025

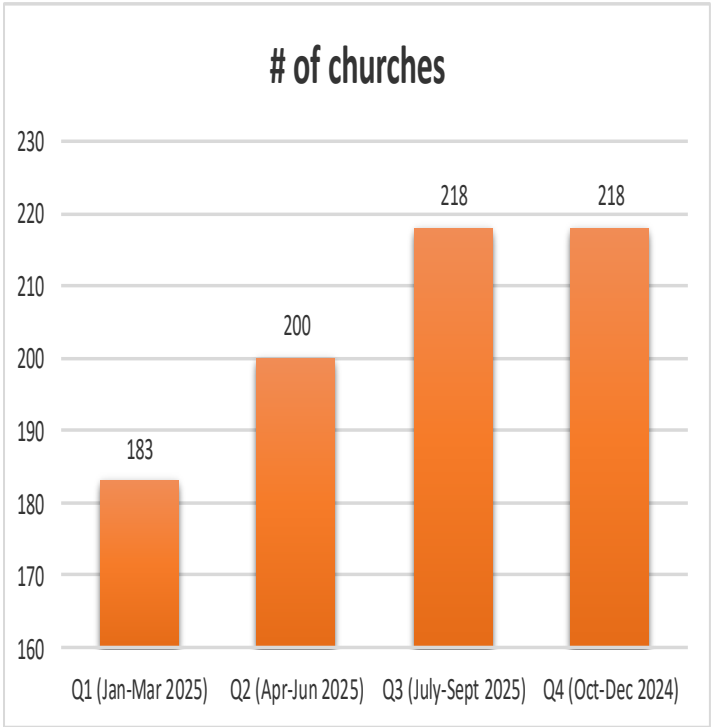


Figure 4: Church growth trends by quarter

This data demonstrates a progressive increase in the number of churches until Q3, followed by a stabilization in Q4. The growth reflects a positive trend in church planting. Since the 4th quarter marks the end of the year, we have completed a review of the active church numbers and identified those churches that have joined other denominations or shown a lack of interest in remaining under our leadership. As a result, 28 churches and preaching points are no longer under our leadership, despite having been affiliated with the national church for many years.

The data shows a consistent upward trend in church members over the specified quarters.

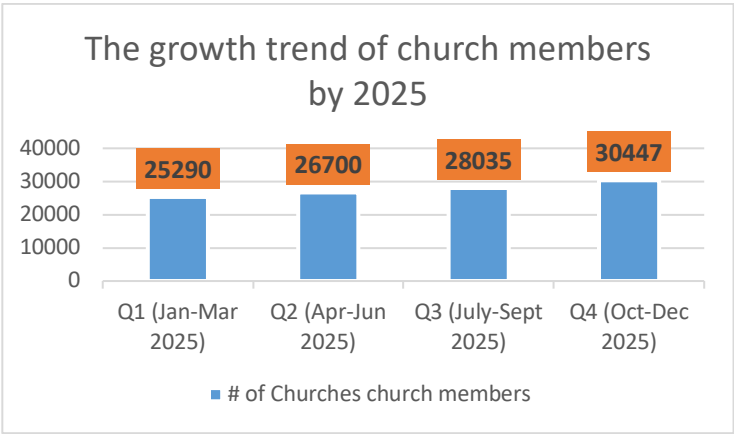
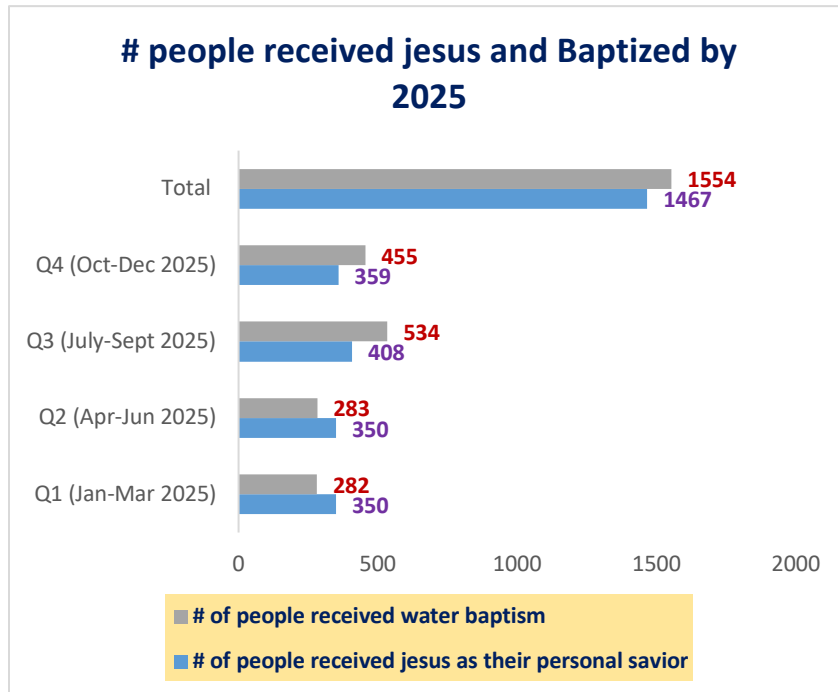


Figure 3: Church members growth trends by quarters

With this understanding, local pastors and district leaders are committed to ensuring that all ministry structures within the local church are active and thriving, especially those that require attention such as pastoral care, counseling, and home visits.

3.10. Ministry progress review

The annual conference council reviewed the quarterly ministry progress based on reports presented by the presiding elders and ministry coordinators. During this review, they discussed the major achievements of the quarter, shared valuable experiences, addressed significant challenges faced by the districts, and identified solutions while outlining strategies for future improvement. Additionally, a business meeting was conducted to discuss various agendas related to future ministry frameworks, and it concluded successfully.
