SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Jeremiah 2:13 describes two crimes: forsaking God as the fountain of living water and digging our own cracked cisterns that can't hold water. What is the pull of the cracked cistern even after we've experienced its emptiness?
2. The Hebrew word *hebel* means vapor or mist that dissolves into nothing — and those who pursue worthless things become worthless themselves. Where do you see modern-day *hebel* — vapor-gods that feel like living water at first but deliver nothing?
3. Eugene Peterson wrote, "The people's lives are as good as their worship." What does it mean that we become like what we treasure and pursue?
4. The hymn *Come Thou Fount* confesses: "Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it." Jeremiah's call is ultimately a call to return. What does it look like to turn our face, rather than our back, to our loving God?
