SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What's the difference between simply wandering through life and walking with intention as a pilgrim along ancient paths?
2. The ancient paths Jeremiah mentions allude to not only God's Word, but also God's path through the Red Sea that led Israel like a flock from captivity to freedom. How might God's ancient and time-tested paths lead us forward to a new future?
3. Jesus, who called Himself the way, also said "This is the way, walk in it." How is following Christ different from simply admiring Him from a distance or agreeing with His teachings intellectually?
4. Verse 16 says that the old paths provide "rest for your souls." What tends to rob you of that soul-rest, and how might walking in God's way restore it?
