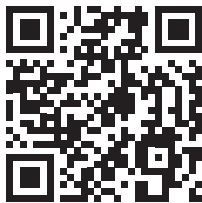

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. *Why do you think God speaks to Jeremiah a second time in prison rather than changing his situation first?*
2. “Call to Me, and I will answer you and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known.” *Why might God in this situation wait for us to approach Him, rather than taking the initiative Himself?*
3. Marcel Proust wrote, “The real voyage of discovery consists not in seeking new landscapes, but in having new eyes.” Jeremiah is essentially called to see Jerusalem’s rubble with new eyes—not denying the destruction, but not being defined by it either. *How do we hold present reality honestly while still expecting something more?*
