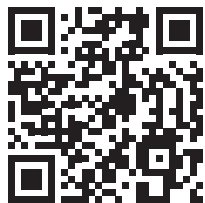

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. In verse 7, Jeremiah accuses God of deceiving and overpowering him. Other translations include: duped, enticed, seduced, tricked, or made a fool of. What do you make of this kind of raw, accusatory language directed at God? Is this a failure of faith? Or could this be a sign of a deep relationship with God?
2. Verse 9 describes God’s word as “a burning fire shut up in my bones.” Why do you think Jeremiah couldn’t simply stop speaking, even when it cost him so much?
3. Jeremiah’s emotions are all over the map in this lament (complaint, confession, trust, petition, confidence in being heard, thanksgiving, and then doubts). In verse 13, he bursts into praise. Then in verse 14, he regrets he was born. What do you think is going on?
