1. God <u>designed</u> life to be lived in fellowship with Him. – vv. 1-13

Three Principles:

- Sorrow is better than laughter vv. 1-4
- Patience is better than being in a hurry vv. 7-9
- Today is better than yesterday v. 10
- 2. Sin <u>distorted</u> God's design vv. 14-22

3. The gospel <u>restores</u> us back to life by God's design. - vv. 23-29

1. Do you know what's good for you, especially in times of adversity? How does Solomon answer that question in chapter 7?
2. Verse 15 introduces a vain or absurd truth. Why is it wrong to pretend to be righteous? Why warn the wicked?
3. In verses 19-29 Solomon highlights the strength of wisdom (19-22), the search for wisdom (23-25), and the disappointment of wisdom (26-29). What do you learn about wisdom in these verses?
