A Note Before You Begin

From August 9 through August 29, Sinai Church is fasting and praying together as one congregation — and doing it alongside the Mercy Without Measure series in Matthew 18:21-35.

Sundays are for gathering and hearing the message preached. There's no devotional reading on those days — just a short focus to help you walk in ready to receive. Monday through Saturday, this guide walks deeper into the same passage from that week's sermon, one day at a time, the same king, the same servant, the same debt, turned over from a different angle each day.

Every day also carries two things forward: a weekly prayer thread — the 7 C's of Killer Confrontations in Week 1, our families and marriages in Week 2, and the discipleship road ahead in Week 3 — and a standing list of ten requests we're asking every household to pray through as a congregation.

This isn't about perfect attendance. If you miss a day, just pick back up where you are. What matters is that our whole church is turning its heart toward God together for these three weeks.

How to Use This Guide

Element	Purpose
Sunday	A short focus to help you walk into worship ready to receive that week's message.
 Scripture	The anchor for the day. Read it slowly — twice if you can.
Reflection	A few sentences written to meet you where you actually are.
► Carry This Today	One line to carry into the rest of your day.
◆ Prayer	A short closing prayer. Read it aloud if you're able.
This Week, Also Praying	A weekly thread: Confrontations (Week 1), Family & Marriage (Week 2), Discipleship (Week 3).
Standing List	Ten ongoing requests to carry as a congregation throughout the fast.

Three weeks, seven days each — one Sunday message and six days of devotional reflection. Twenty-one days in all.

Read alone, with your spouse, as a family, or in a group. Miss a day? Don't try to catch up. Just pick up where you are.

Every Day, Also Pray For

Alongside each day's specific focus, carry these ten standing requests through all 21 days as a congregation.

1 Timothy 2:1-2 (NKJV)

"Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence."

- **Government & National Leaders** — City leaders, state leaders, and federal leadership — pray for policies that bring better welfare for our communities.
- **Family & Marriages** — That every believer would intentionally focus on strengthening their relationship with their family and marriage through God.
- **Health & Healing** — For those needing healing — and that we would all be good stewards of the temple God has given us.
- **Sinai Church & Our Unity** — Koinonia — that we would be led together by the Holy Spirit.
- **Church Leadership & Pastoral Staff** — Covering, strengthening, and rest in Him; that our leaders would remain in Him; and for new leaders and co-laborers to rise up.
- **Finances & Provision** — Faithfulness with what God has entrusted to us, and returning to Him what is His.
- **Missions & the Lost** — Strategies to reach lives in our community — and for new ministries launching, including a homeless ministry, street evangelism, and school sponsorships.
- **Youth, Children & the Next Generation** — Against depression, anxiety, and deception — for renewal of mind and real encounters with God.
- **The Persecuted Church** — Endurance in their suffering, and that they would remain in God's joy, grace, and peace.
- **Schools & Education in Our Community** — For leadership, teachers, and students in our high schools and middle schools — wisdom over the social issues they face.

An Unpayable Debt, Canceled

Matthew 18:21-27

A servant owes more than he could ever repay in a hundred lifetimes. This week is about facing the size of what you've already been forgiven.

SUNDAY — AUG 9

Today We Gather

Part 1: The Debt — Matthew 18:21-27

This morning we begin Mercy Without Measure. Peter asks Jesus how many times he has to forgive — and the answer will reshape everything. Walk in ready to face the size of a debt you could never repay.

- **Pray** — for a heart ready to receive what God wants to say to you this morning.
- **Pray** — for Pastor Dennis as he preaches — clarity, boldness, and the Holy Spirit's presence.
- **Pray** — for anyone walking in for the first time, that they would encounter God's mercy today.

CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER

OPEN

- Thank God for His mercy — we are here because we need Him, not out of habit
- He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, full of unfailing love

THIS WEEK — CONFRONTATIONS · THE 7 C'S

- **Conviction** — search our hearts before we examine anyone else's
- **Confrontation** — courage to go directly to people, not around them
- **Clarification** — listen before we defend
- **Confession** — own our part first
- **Check-Up** — follow through on relationships we assumed were healed
- **Commitment & Commission** — guard what is being restored; release what cannot be

OUR RELATIONSHIPS RIGHT NOW

- The conversation being postponed; the family member no longer called
- Protection from bitterness taking root in this church

DAY 1 — MONDAY

The Number You're Keeping

✚ MATTHEW 18:21-22

"Then Peter came to Him and said, 'Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven.'"

Peter thought seven was generous. You probably have a number too — even if you've never said it out loud. A point where you've quietly decided someone has used up their chances.

Jesus doesn't give Peter a bigger number. He takes the calculator out of his hands completely. Seventy times seven was never a quota to reach. It was a way of saying: stop counting.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Name the number you've been keeping for someone — and let them off the hook today.

✦ PRAYER

Lord, show me where I've been counting instead of releasing. Teach me what it means to stop keeping score. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for courage to have honest, loving conversations instead of avoiding them — the first C, Conviction, from Killer Confrontations.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 2 — TUESDAY

The Reversal

† GENESIS 4:24

| *"If Cain shall be avenged sevenfold, then Lamech seventy-sevenfold."*

Long before Peter asked his question, Lamech bragged about a different kind of math — vengeance multiplied without limit. Every wrong paid back with interest.

Jesus takes Lamech's own number and rebuilds it for the opposite purpose. What fallen humanity built for revenge, Jesus repurposes for mercy. Same number. Completely different heart underneath it.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Where Lamech's math still feels natural to you, choose mercy instead — today.

♦ PRAYER

Father, rebuild in me what vengeance tore down. Let mercy be my instinct, not my last resort. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for the courage to go directly to people instead of around them — Confrontation, the second C.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 3 — WEDNESDAY

A Debt You Can't Outrun

✚ MATTHEW 18:23-25

"One was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made."

Ten thousand talents wasn't a bad month. It was a debt that had already outrun the man's entire lifetime. No strategy, no hidden resource, no appeal to fairness could touch it.

That's the picture of where every one of us stood before God — not slightly behind, but hopelessly over our heads. The gospel doesn't start with "try harder." It starts with "you can't."

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Let the size of your own forgiven debt actually sink in today — don't rush past it.

✦ **PRAYER**

Lord, I can't pay what I owe You. I stop pretending I can. Thank You for meeting me here. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for ears that listen before they defend — Clarification, the third C.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 4 — THURSDAY

Vengeance Isn't Yours to Keep

✝ ROMANS 12:19

"Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, 'Vengeance is Mine, I will repay,' says the Lord."

Forgiveness doesn't pretend justice doesn't matter. It hands justice to the only One qualified to deliver it perfectly.

Holding on to the right to "get even" can feel like protection. But it's really just carrying a weight God never asked you to carry. He didn't say vengeance is nobody's. He said it's His.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Hand over one debt you've been holding onto — vengeance was never yours to keep.

✦ PRAYER

Father, I release what I've been holding onto. Vengeance was never mine to keep. It's Yours. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: for humility to own our part first — Confession, the fourth C.

STANDING LIST: government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.

DAY 5 — FRIDAY

Moved With Compassion

✚ MATTHEW 18:26-27

"Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt."

The Greek word behind "moved with compassion" is the same word Matthew uses for Jesus' own gut-level compassion toward the crowds, the sick, the hungry, the blind. This king's mercy looks like Jesus because it's meant to.

Notice what the king actually does: he doesn't just feel bad for the servant. He releases him. He forgives the debt. Mercy isn't a private emotion here — it moves. It changes the servant's whole situation.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Let mercy move today — not just be felt, but actually given to someone.

✦ PRAYER

Thank You for compassion that moves, not just compassion that feels. Let mine move too. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for the discipline to follow up on relationships we thought were resolved — Check-Up, the fifth C.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 6 — SATURDAY

Forgiven As Christ Forgave

✚ EPHESIANS 4:32

"And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you."

Neither this verse nor its parallel in Colossians 3:13 says "forgive because they earned it." They say "forgive as Christ forgave you." The source was never their deserving. It's always been His mercy toward you.

As you head into tomorrow's service, carry one sentence with you: you were forgiven a debt you could never repay. Not partially. Not on a payment plan. Completely.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Extend today the mercy you've already received — completely, not partially.

✦ PRAYER

Lord, let the mercy I've received become the mercy I give. Mercy doesn't keep score — and neither will I. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for our church to guard every relationship being restored — Commitment — and for grace to release what can't be restored — Commission. The sixth and seventh C's.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

WEEK 2 · THE DENIAL

Forgiven, Yet Unforgiving

Matthew 18:28-31

A servant forgiven everything turns and refuses to forgive almost nothing. This week is about the gap between receiving mercy and passing it on.

SUNDAY — AUG 16

Today We Gather

Part 2: The Denial — Matthew 18:28-31

This morning's message turns the mirror on us. A man forgiven everything refuses to forgive almost nothing. Walk in ready to see where that story is closer to home than we'd like to admit.

- **Pray** — for eyes to see any place you've received mercy but withheld it from someone else.
- **Pray** — for Pastor Dennis as he preaches — clarity, boldness, and the Holy Spirit's presence.
- **Pray** — for our church's unity, that this message would bring healing, not defensiveness.

CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER

OPEN

- Thank God for His mercy — we are here because we need Him, not out of habit
- He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, full of unfailing love

THIS WEEK — FAMILY & MARRIAGE

- **Fathers and children** — reconciliation; fathers' hearts turned home
- **Mothers and children** — healing, restored honor and tenderness
- **Husbands and wives** — offenses kept in silence brought into the light
- **Our children** — a real, personal encounter with God — not secondhand faith
- **Our marriages** — God put first, before career, comfort, convenience
- **Our spouses** — that they would meet God deeply and be renewed

OUR HOMES RIGHT NOW

- Where there is distance, that God would close it; where silence, that He would break it
- Protection over marriages under strain in this room

DAY 7 — MONDAY

Same Tools, Opposite Heart

✚ MATTHEW 18:28

"But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!'"

The ink isn't even dry on his own forgiveness before he's got his hands around someone else's throat. He's using the same directness we'd teach in any healthy confrontation — but stripped of the heart that should carry it.

Right technique. Wrong heart. That combination is possible, and it's worth being honest about where it shows up in you.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Check your heart before your next hard conversation — same tools, right heart.

✦ **PRAYER**

Search my heart, Lord. Let my confrontations carry mercy, not just correctness. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for fathers and children — that broken relationships between them would be reconciled, and that fathers would turn their hearts home.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 8 — TUESDAY

The Echo

✝ MATTHEW 18:29

"So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.'"

Read that plea again. It's word-for-word what this same servant said to the king one scene earlier. He's hearing his own prayer for mercy, in his own words, coming out of someone else's mouth — and somehow, it doesn't register.

Unforgiveness makes us deaf to our own testimony. You've begged God for patience. When someone else needs the same thing from you, don't let it fall on deaf ears.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Listen today for your own testimony echoing in someone else's plea.

✦ **PRAYER**

Open my ears, Lord, to recognize my own story in someone else's plea. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: for mothers and children — that wounds between them would be healed, and that honor and tenderness would be restored.

STANDING LIST: government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.

DAY 9 — WEDNESDAY

Real Debts, Right Proportion

✚ MATTHEW 18:30

"And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt."

A hundred denarii was real money — a real debt, owed by a real person. This isn't a story about pretending debts don't matter. It's a story about proportion — remembering the size of the mountain you were forgiven before you measure someone else's molehill.

"He would not" is a decision, not an inability. Worth sitting with honestly today.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Remember the size of what you were forgiven before you measure someone's debt today.

✦ **PRAYER**

Lord, give me eyes for proportion. Help me see the size of what I've been forgiven. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for husbands and wives — that offenses kept in silence would be brought into the light and reconciled.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 10 — THURSDAY

Mercy Triumphs

✝ JAMES 2:13

"For judgment is without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment."

James doesn't say mercy ignores judgment. He says mercy is stronger than judgment — but only where it's actually been received and passed on.

Mercy that stays locked inside you, that never moves toward anyone else, isn't really functioning as mercy at all. It's just a memory of something that once happened to you.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Let mercy triumph in one relationship today — actually give it, don't just remember it.

✦ **PRAYER**

Let mercy triumph in me, Lord — not just as something I remember receiving, but something I actively give. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for our children — that they would have a true, personal encounter with God, not just inherit our faith secondhand.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 11 — FRIDAY

The Community That Wouldn't Look Away

✚ MATTHEW 18:31

"So when his fellow servants saw what had been done, they were very grieved, and came and told their master all that had been done."

The other servants don't shrug this off as none of their business. They're genuinely grieved — and they go to the one person with authority to act. That's not gossip. That's the body of Christ working the way it's supposed to.

Sometimes the people around you see your unforgiveness more clearly than you do. That's not always an attack. Sometimes it's love, refusing to look away.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

If someone gently names something in you today, let it in instead of pushing it out.

✦ **PRAYER**

Give me a soft heart toward correction, Lord — even when it's uncomfortable to hear. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for our marriages — that God would be put first in every home, before career, comfort, or convenience.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 12 — SATURDAY

Release the Debt

✚ MATTHEW 7:2

"For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you."

As this week closes, here's the whole story in one sentence: a man who was forgiven everything refused to forgive almost nothing. Don't let that be your story.

You've been forgiven a debt with a comma and six zeros in it. Somebody around you owes far less. Release it — not because it wasn't real, but because you've already been released from something far larger.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Release one debt tonight, before tomorrow's service.

✦ **PRAYER**

Lord, let me walk into tomorrow having already let go of what I was never meant to keep. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for our spouses — that each one would encounter God personally and deeply, and be renewed in Him.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

WEEK 3 · THE DEMAND

Mercy From the Heart

Matthew 18:32-35

The king calls the servant back in. This week is about what God actually requires — a heart, not just words.

SUNDAY — AUG 23

Today We Gather

Part 3: The Demand — Matthew 18:32-35

This morning we close the series. The king calls the servant back in, and Jesus makes clear what He actually requires — a heart, not just words. Walk in ready to let this reach further than your words already have.

- **Pray** — for forgiveness that reaches your heart, not just your mouth.
- **Pray** — for Pastor Dennis as he closes this series — clarity, boldness, and a strong sending.
- **Pray** — for hearts across our church ready for what's next: the Mentor School, and the discipleship pathway it begins.

CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER

OPEN

- Thank God for His mercy — we are here because we need Him, not out of habit
- He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, full of unfailing love

THIS WEEK — DISCIPLESHIP · MENTOR SCHOOL

- **Teachable hearts** — across our church; pride that resists being disciplined broken
- **Those being trained as mentors** — faithful, humble, with endurance for the training
- **Each mentor and their three members** — groups knit together in real trust
- **Wisdom for our leaders** — for Pastor Dennis and every leader shaping this
- **Multiplication** — that what begins here would go far beyond this first class

WHAT GOD HAS ALREADY DONE

- Thank Him for these three weeks — debts released, conversations begun, homes softened
- Ask Him to make this church one that receives mercy and passes it on

DAY 13 — MONDAY

You Wicked Servant

✚ MATTHEW 18:32

"Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me.'"

Not "foolish." Not "shortsighted." Wicked. God takes presuming on grace you never intend to extend seriously enough to call it exactly what it is.

Every framework for reconciliation you've ever learned assumes a forgiven heart underneath it. Without that heart, even the right steps become hollow performance.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Check today whether your forgiveness is performance or heart change.

✦ **PRAYER**

Lord, don't let me settle for performance. I want the real thing — a heart actually changed by Your mercy. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for teachable hearts across our church, ready to be trained, corrected, and shaped for what's ahead.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 14 — TUESDAY

The Standard

✚ MATTHEW 18:33

"Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?"

The king doesn't measure the servant against an abstract rule. He measures him against the mercy he himself just received. The standard was never distant — it was personal, and it was recent.

That's still the standard for you and me. Not "be a good person." Just — remember what you were just given, and let it shape what you give.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Let the mercy you received set today's standard — not your own sense of fairness.

✦ **PRAYER**

*Let the mercy I've received set the standard for the mercy I give — not my own sense of fairness.
Amen.*

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for those who will be trained as mentors — faithful, humble, teachable men and women.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 15 — WEDNESDAY

Presuming on Grace

✚ MATTHEW 18:34

"And his master was angry, and delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt."

This isn't a technicality getting reinstated. It's what happens when mercy that was received is treated as though it belonged to you alone — as if it were yours to keep and never yours to give away.

Forgiveness was never meant to end with you. It was always meant to move through you, to the next person who needs exactly what you needed.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Let mercy move through you to someone today — don't let it end with you.

✦ PRAYER

Don't let Your mercy stop with me, Lord. Let it move through me to someone who needs it today. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for the multiplication model — each mentor discipling three members — that these groups would be knit together in trust.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 16 — THURSDAY

From the Heart, Not Just the Mouth

✝ MATTHEW 18:35

"So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses."

Jesus doesn't say "forgive on paper." He says from the heart. Procedural forgiveness — going through the motions without any real release — was never what God asked of the servant, and it isn't what He's asking of you.

This isn't about manufacturing a feeling on command. It's about genuine, inward willingness — even if it has to be renewed again tomorrow.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Ask if a forgiveness you've spoken has actually reached your heart yet.

✦ **PRAYER**

Reach all the way into my heart, Lord. Don't let my forgiveness stop at my lips. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for wisdom for every leader shaping the Mentor School and the discipleship pathway ahead.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 17 — FRIDAY

Twice More, So You'd Remember

✚ MATTHEW 6:14-15

"For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses."

Jesus doesn't say this once and move on. He says it again in the Lord's Prayer. He says it again standing at prayer in Mark 11. This wasn't a passing warning — it's a consistent thread through everything Jesus taught.

If it mattered enough for Jesus to repeat, it's worth more than a passing thought from us.

➤ **CARRY THIS TODAY**

Pray the Lord's Prayer today like you mean the forgiveness line.

✦ **PRAYER**

Lord, let this truth stop being background noise. Let it actually shape how I pray and how I forgive. Amen.

THIS WEEK, ALSO PRAYING: *for courage in those being paired with a mentor — to be honest, open, and sharpened.*

STANDING LIST: *government, family, health, our church, leadership, finances, missions, next generation, persecuted church, schools.*

DAY 18 — SATURDAY

Mercy Doesn't Keep Score

✚ MATTHEW 18:27

"Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt."

Three weeks ago, we started with Peter's question: how many times do I have to forgive? The answer was never a number. It was a King who forgave everything, and asked you to let that mercy move through you.

As this series closes, don't leave with a technique. Leave with an identity: you are someone who was forgiven a debt you could never repay — completely, out of pure compassion, no payment plan attached.

➤ CARRY THIS TODAY

Name one debt you've released this series — and one you're still holding. Bring both to worship.

✦ PRAYER

Thank You for mercy that doesn't keep score. Let that same mercy live in me, today and every day after this. Amen.
