EXPERIENCING REAL JOY

Dear Parents,

I am so excited your family is joining the Loma Vista family as we study the book of Philippians! This short take-home resource is designed to invite your children into the journey. Our goal is to start meaningful conversations and, hopefully, keep them going throughout the week. Here's how to make the most of these family study times:

- Start with prayer. Pray together as a family before you begin.
- Open God's Word. Show your children where the book of Philippians is located. Model for your children that all Scripture comes from God and that God's Word is our ultimate source of truth. Each week, we will start with the passage from Philippians that we studied in service.
- Adjust the reading as needed. I have rewritten it in language that should be easier for young elementary-aged children to understand. Since I cannot adapt the wording for every age and developmental level, please make adjustments or provide additional explanations as needed for your child. For older children, I highly encourage you to read directly from Scripture, either alongside the rewritten paragraph or in place of it.
- Use the questions as a starting point. Please treat the questions as a jumping-off point rather than a checklist. Keep the conversation flowing, encourage your children's curiosity, and use this time to build a routine of opening God's Word together.
- Discuss the Big Idea. I've kept the Big Idea wording exactly as our Pastors presented it in service. Take time to explain what it means in a way your child can understand.
- Make Scripture memorization fun. If the verse feels too difficult for your child to memorize, ask them to help keep you accountable as you memorize it. Invite them to remind you throughout the week and test you on it. Seeing you practice the discipline of Scripture memorization is incredibly valuable!

As you work through these studies together each week, make them a time of connection and joy. My hope is to encourage families to talk about what they learned in church, pray together, and memorize Scripture together. After you share what you learned in Big Church, ask your child what they learned in Kids' Church, too!

I am praying for all of you as we go through this series. My prayer is that it will draw you closer together, strengthen your relationships as a family, and deepen your relationship with God. Please reach out if there is ever a specific way we can pray for you and your family. Our LVKids team prays for all of you weekly, and we love knowing how to pray more intentionally.

(Philippians 1:1-6)

Hello, friends! I'm so happy when I think about you. Every time I pray, I smile because you are such good helpers. Family Discussion Questions:

What good things does God do in our hearts after we trust in Jesus?

Paul said God will keep working on it, what does that mean? Does God ever stop helping us grow? (It's only finished in heaven!)



Sermon Big Idea:

God will never give up on the “good work” of sanctification in you by the power of His Holy Spirit until the day Jesus Christ returns.

Memory Verse:

[I am] confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

Philippians 1:6 NIV

Paul's message this week:

(Philippians 1:7-11)

It is good that I think about you with so much love and keep you in my heart. Whether I am in prison or telling people about Jesus, we're all part of God's family together. God knows how much I care about you. I love you the way Jesus loves you!

This is what I pray for you: I pray that your love will grow bigger and bigger. I pray that you will learn more about God and understand Him better. I pray that you will be able to choose what is right. I want you to live in a way that follows what God says is good, so that when Jesus comes back, you will be ready. I pray that your life will be full of doing good things. That you will have the kind of good fruit that comes from knowing Jesus. When you live this way, everyone will see how great and wonderful God is!

Parents, take a few moments to share with your children about what you learned about this passage from this week's sermon.

What was your biggest takeaway?

Family Discussion Questions:

When Paul prays for his friends, what kinds of things is he praying for? How can we pray for our friends?

Paul tells us to follow what God says is good and right. How does that help others to see who God is through us?



Sermon Big Idea:

Our salvation in Christ produces deep affections for one another and a growing, fruitful faith that brings glory to God our Father.

Memory Verse:

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Romans 12:2

Paul's message this week:

(Philippians 1:12-19)

I want you to know something important: Even though I'm in jail, more people are learning about Jesus! All the guards at the jail know that I'm here because I love Jesus. My friends who follow Jesus have become braver and are telling more people about Jesus too!

Now, some people tell others about Jesus for good reasons. They do it because they love Jesus and want to help others know Him. But some people tell others about Jesus for wrong reasons. They do it to show off or to make me feel bad while I'm in jail.

But it doesn't matter why they're doing it! What matters is that people are hearing about Jesus! And that makes me really happy! I'm going to keep being happy because I know God is taking care of me. You're praying for me, and God's Spirit is helping me. Everything is going to be okay!

Parent Share Time!

Parents, take a few moments to share with your children about what you learned about this passage from this week's sermon.

What was your biggest takeaway?

Family Discussion Questions:

It must be hard to be in jail, but is Paul happy or sad? Why do you think he feels that way?

What good news is still being talked about?

What helps Paul be brave and joyful?



Sermon Big Idea:

We can rejoice in whatever happens in our lives because God is using it to reveal the gospel of Jesus Christ through us.

Memory Verse:

The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice.

Philippians 1:18

Paul's message this week:

(Philippians 1:20-26)

I hope that I will be brave and always make Jesus look great! Whether I live or die, I want everyone to see how wonderful Jesus is.

For me, living means knowing Jesus and telling others about Him. And dying means I get to go to heaven and be with Jesus forever! Both are good! If I keep living here on earth, I can keep doing God's work and helping people. I really don't know if staying here or going to heaven is better!

Part of me really wants to go to heaven to be with Jesus. That would be the best! But I think you still need me here to help you learn and grow as you come to know Jesus more. So I believe God will let me stay alive and keep teaching you, so that you can have the joy that comes from knowing Jesus. Then when I see you again, you'll be so excited about Jesus and all He's done!

What was your biggest takeaway?

Family Discussion Questions:

What good thing will happen if Paul dies?

What good things can Paul do if he stays alive?

Paul wants to make Jesus look great whether he lives or dies. How can we make Jesus look great in our lives?



Sermon Big Idea:

Jesus Christ can fill you with His joy and hope, while helping you realign your ambitions so that your life increasingly makes His name great.

Memory Verse:

I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain.

Philippians 1:20-21

Paul's message this week:

(Philippians 1:27-2:2)

I want you to live in a way that shows you love Jesus. Whether I get to visit you or just hear news about you from far away, I hope to know that you're all like a team, working together to share about Jesus and not being afraid of people who don't like what you believe. Being part of God's family means you believe in Jesus, and sometimes that can be hard. Sometimes you will struggle just like you have seen happen to me. But remember how much Jesus loves you and let that encourage you!

Please bring me joy by getting along, loving each other, and working together. You all have the same goal, which is to love Jesus and help others to know Him.

Parents, take a few moments to share with your children about what you learned about this passage from this week's sermon.

What was your biggest takeaway?

Family Discussion Questions:

Paul says to live in a way that shows we love Jesus.
How can we do that?
(look at the rest of his message for help)

How can our family work together "like a team", the way Paul talked about?



Sermon Big Idea:

The traits of a worthy life reflects our citizenship in heaven and mirrors the character of Christ, which is made possible through the Holy Spirit.

Memory Verse:

Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ.
