- A. This will go against popular opinion.
 - Life is not about conforming to the laws of men, but about obeying to the laws of God. (Exodus 20:4)

 - 1. When you rationalize, you tell rational lies.

II. We must live according to the <u>Word</u> not the world. (v. 16-18)

- It does not matter what the majority thinks; what matters is what God thinks and what God thinks has been revealed in His Word.
 - A. This will require courage. (v. 16; Acts 4:13, 29)
 - Courage comes from the conviction that God is in control.
 - B. This will require <u>confidence</u>. (v. 17)
 - 1. They had an unshakeable confidence in God's ability.
 - (II Corinthians 9:8; Hebrews 2:18; 7:25; I Timothy 1:12; Jude 24)
 - 2. Far too often we follow our gut instead of God.
 - C. This will require commitment. (v. 18)

- 1. The issue is not God's ability; it's His sovereign will.
- 2. Our faith isn't based on what we think God is going to do or on what we hope He will do; our faith is based on who God is. (Job 13:15; Esther 4:16; Phil.1:21)

III. We must live according to the <u>promises of God</u> not the protection of men. (v. 19-30)

A. He will never <u>leave</u> us. (v. 19-25; Joshua 1:5-9; Matthew 28:20)

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD your God..." Isaiah 43:2-3a

B. He will deliver us. (v. 26-28)

"But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us again. On him we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us." II Corinthians 1:9-10

- 1. Sometimes God delivers us from our troubles.
- 2. Sometimes God delivers us in our troubles.

C. He will <u>honor</u> our obedience. (v. 29-30)

"The Lord declares: Those who honor me I will honor." I Samuel 2:30

- 1. Obedience always brings glory to God.
- 2. Obedience always brings blessings from God. (Deuteronomy 11:26-28)
