• God's goal for me is that I will KNOW, GROW and LIVE for God.

"From the very beginning God decided that those who come to Him should become like His Son." Romans 8:29 (LB)

I. God uses pressure at work to teach me responsibility.

- A. Responsibility is doing the right thing: (Ephesians 2:8-10; 4:11-16)
 - 1. Even when you don't feel like it.
 - 2. Even if no one is looking.
 - The One who matters is always looking.
 - 3. Even when it costs you.
- B. Four ways you can develop or increase responsibility at work:
 - 1. Keep your word. (Psalm 15:1-4)
 - 2. Meet <u>deadlines</u>. (Proverbs 18:9)
 - 3. Realize you are working for <u>the Lord</u>. (Colossians 3:22-24)
 - 4. Handle money properly. (Luke 16:10-13)

II. God uses people at work to teach me relationships.

A. One of the most important skills you can learn is <u>how to get</u> <u>along</u> with others. (I Corinthians 16:14)

- B. Six traits you need to get along with people at work:
 - 1. Cooperation (Romans 12:16a)
 - 2. Humility (Romans 12:16b)
 - 3. Flexibility (Romans 12:16c)
 - 4. Honesty (Romans 12:17)
 - 5. Compromise (Romans 12:18)
 - 6. Forgiveness (Romans 12:19)

III. God uses problems at work to teach me character.

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so you will be mature and complete." James 1:2-4

"We can rejoice when we run into problems and trials for we know they are good for us – they help us learn to be patient. And patience develops strength of character." Romans 5:3-4 (LB)

- God is more interested in your <u>holiness</u> than your <u>happiness</u>.
 - A. God wants me to have the fruit of the Spirit.

- B. 3 ways to handle problems at work: (II Corinthians 1:8-11)

 - 3. Ask others to pray for you.
