I Kings 18:1-19:7

• Doubt is <u>not</u> the enemy of faith; it's a <u>pathway</u> to a deeper, more meaningful faith.

### I. Doubt can lead to <u>courage</u>. (I Kings 18:1-19:2)

A. Even though we are surrounded by:

1. <u>Compromise</u> as seen in Obadiah. (I Kings 18:1-15) "Don't you know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? So whoever wants to be the friend of the world becomes the enemy of God." James 4:4

- 2. <u>Corruption</u> as seen in Ahab and Jezebel. (I Kings 18:16-18; 19:1-2; II Timothy 3:1-5)
- 3. Complacency as seen in the people. (I Kings 18:19-21)
  - 1.) The biggest fool is not the one who says there is no God, the biggest fool is the one who says there is a God but doesn't fully commit to Him.
  - 2.) People need a demonstration of the gospel more than they need a definition of the gospel. (Romans 1:16)

- B. Even though we should be motivated: (I Kings 18:22-46)
  - 1. To <u>act</u>. (I Cor. 16:33; Phil. 2:13; Colossians 4:5)
  - 2. To come together. (John 17:1-25)
- 3. To <u>stand alone</u>. (Ephesians 6:11-14) "Come out from them and be separate, says the Lord." II Cor. 6:17
  - 4. To sacrifice. (Romans 12:1-2)

- 5. To pray for God to be glorified so: (Exodus 33:18)
  - 1.) Sin can be forgiven.
  - 2.) People will feel conviction.
  - 3.) Lives are changed.

#### II. Doubt can lead to comparisons. (I Kings 19:3-4)

- Comparison results in burnout. What causes it?
  - A. We give in to fear. (v. 3a)
    - 1. Whether it be fear of criticism, fear of missing out, fear of falling behind, or the fear of not mattering, fear causes us to run, forget or despair.
    - 2. Fear either gets the best of you or brings out the best in you.

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10

- B. We <u>run</u> ourselves into the ground & are worn out (v. 3b)
- C. We are isolated. (v. 3c-4a)
  - 1. Life is better connected with God, your family, your church and with others. (Ephesians 4:25)
  - 2. You need the church and the church needs you.
- D. We focus on our <u>feelings</u> rather than the facts. (v. 4b)
  - Feelings aren't reliable.

#### III. Doubt can lead to Christ. (I Kings 19:5-7)

• Theologians call this a "<u>Christophany</u>" – a pre-Bethlehem appearance of Jesus Christ. (Daniel 3:1-30; 6:1-28)

#### **ACTION POINTS:**

- 1.) Make sure your doubt leads you on the <u>narrow path to heaven.</u>
- 2.) Is your faith stagnant or growing?
- 3.) Give God the benefit of the doubt.
