### **Food Pantry**

Pastor Bea's heart for the church and community saw a physical need the church could help meet. The pantry started small with only few volunteers and relying on food donations. Over time the pantry has been growing. Each week, more and more families visit the pantry for food. Each month, more and more volunteers help at the pantry by picking up food, passing out food, and even the kids doing bottle drives to raise money to purchase food items. Each year new partnerships are formed. In 2023, we saw Living providing Resources volunteers, Albany Law school donating food, and the Regional Food Bank providing access to affordable food like fresh fruit and vegetables, meat, and canned goods.

Over the last three months the pantry provided food over 1,700 times. The pantry not only supports the physical needs, but it also provides opportunities to meet spiritual needs. It allows the church to encourage those who are hurting, pray with those from the community, and share Jesus with whoever comes through the church doors. We have even seen people commit their lives to Jesus while at the food pantry.
