Seeing Farther...

THE TWO MOST IMPORTANT EVENTS IN JESUS' LIFE INVOLVE HUMILIATION AND GLORY.

Never forget the promise of Easter.

Most of us put the emphasis on only one of those events.

On Easter Sunday churches have to put extra chairs in the aisles.

On Good Friday only the diehards come to worship. We prefer the glory of Easter to the humiliation of Good Friday.

Surely at least part of the reason that we are resurrection people rather than crucifixion people is our innate American optimism. We are a people oriented toward success and progress. We simply do not connect with humility, poverty, and failure. We see the world as our oyster. We see ourselves as a nation in control and on the move.

At least that's the way it was ... until now. The COVID-19 pandemic has stopped us dead in our tracks. We haven't seen anything like this in our lifetimes. (Granted, we Americans have largely been spared the tragedies that much of the world knows on a regular basis.) The most recent analogy in American history may well be the Great Depression. And maybe it's no coincidence that the Great Depression came on the heels of the most prosperous decade America had ever known up until that point – the "Roaring Twenties."

For the foreseeable future it seems that you and I will be living in a Good Friday world rather than the Easter world we would prefer. Let us never forget the promise of Easter – that our God is in the business of bringing life out of death. But meanwhile, as we wait and hope and pray for our world to come to life again, let us be alert to the blessings God is giving us even now. Maybe this alertness is what the Apostle Paul means by "boasting in our sufferings."

One of the things you notice when you walk in the woods is that in winter you can see farther. As much as you miss the green grass and leaves, you find that in winter you can see things that you can't see in summer. Just so, it may be that in this time of crisis God is helping us to see things that our hurry and worry wouldn't let us see before. Maybe God is blessing us with the opportunity to appreciate the simpler things of life that we took for granted – dinner table conversations with family, time with our neighbors, time to pray, etc. And then maybe, by God's grace, when life gets back to "normal," it will be a new kind of "normal." Maybe "normal" will include a deeper appreciation for God, for God's creation, for each other, and, yes, even for our sufferings.

Reminder of the Month: Over 18 Rule

No one under the age of 18 will have sole responsibility, nor be alone with children. A youth may assist with children only when two adults are present.

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for. Substitutes and "fill-in" workers with children must be on this list.


