A sense of place is distinguished from a sense of space.

As I prepare for this trip with great anticipation, I am mindful of Dr. Brueggemann's classic study of the meaning of land in Scripture. The land is of supreme importance to the people of Israel. Indeed, as Brueggemann says, the land is one of the main "characters" in the Bible:

"It is now clear that a sense of place is a human hunger that the urban promise has not met. And a fresh look at the Bible suggests that a sense of place is a primary category of faith.... There are no meanings apart from roots ...

"A sense of place is to be sharply distinguished from a sense of space ... 'Space' means an arena of freedom, without coercion or accountability, free of pressures and void of authority.... Place is space in which important words have been spoken that have established identity, defined vocation, and envisioned destiny. Place is space in which vows have been exchanged, promises have been made, and demands have been issued. Place is indeed a protest against the unpromising pursuit of space. It is a declaration that our humanness cannot be found in escape, detachment, absence of commitment, and undefined freedom.....

"The land for which Israel yearns and which it remembers is never unclaimed space but is always a place with Yahweh ... It will no longer do to talk about Yahweh and his people but we must speak about Yahweh and his people and his land." -Walter Brueggemann, The Land

Land represents embodiment – the solid materiality of life on this earth. For some religions of the world this is unimportant; indeed, the material side of life is to be regretted and as much as possible avoided. Not so for the Judeo-Christian tradition. At every step along the way of the creation story in Genesis 1, "God saw that it was good." We Christians worship largely through sacraments, which are ways God uses physical matter to bless us. And then when we get to the end of our creeds we do not say that we believe in the immortality of a disembodied soul; we say, "I believe in the resurrection of the body."

Dr. Brueggemann suggests that our modern urbanized culture may be losing touch with the land. I fear he may be right, yet most people that I know still maintain a connection to place and land. Many families go back to their roots – often a small, rural community – for a family reunion every year. Many of us can still see the stained glass windows and hear the hymns being sung in the little church where we grew up. Even city dwellers often keep a small garden or even just a flower box hanging from their window.

What is your "place"? Is it the land you grew up on? Is it the church in which you exchanged your marriage vows? Is it your state or nation? Is it the cemetery where your loved ones are buried? Let us give thanks to God for the gifts of land, bodies, and place. And let us take good care of these wonderful gifts. -Grace and peace, Smoke

SHANDON'S CHILD & YOUTH ABUSE PREVENTION PROCEDURES

Reminder of the Month: Reporting Suspected Abuse

Anyone associated with Shandon UMC who observes abuse, or has reason to suspect abuse, should immediately report these observations or suspicions directly to the Shandon UMC clergyperson or staff director of the relevant program. The Senior Minister or Acting Senior Minister should be immediately contacted and will be personally responsible for executing the initial response procedures. Observe confidentiality for both the alleged victim and the accused throughout the investigation. The Senior Minister will be the church's sole spokesman with the media, public, and congregation.

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for. Substitutes and "fill-in" workers with children must be on this list.

Accessibility at Shandon

A CHURCH BUILT IN 1949 OFFERS SOME CHALLENGES THAT WERE NEVER ANTICIPATED 70 YEARS AGO, SO WE'RE WORKING HARD TO MAKE OUR BUILDINGS AS ACCESSIBLE AS POSSIBLE.

Here's an update on what we've done and what we'd still like to do.... Accomplishments:

- **Dubose Building Ramp.** This ramp means that all our buildings are now accessible under shelter.
- Automatic Doors. Automatic doors have been added to the north (center) doors of the Bruner Building and the east (parking lot) entrance of the Knox Building. Although not handicapped accessible, the east (parking lot) entrance to the Bruner Building now has an automatic door system.

The Wish List:

- More Automatic Doors. Automatic doors are needed at the south and north (center) entrances of the Dubose Building and the main entrance to the Leisure Ministries Center. We are also evaluating the need for automatic doors at the west (Adger Road) entrance of the Dubose Building.
- **Covered Drop-Off.** Several years ago the Church added a drive-through on the Adger Road side of the Betty Bruner and Dubose Buildings to assist with passenger loading and unloading. Plans called for covered drop-off areas at both the Bruner and Dubose Building entrances. In coordination with other recent accessibility improvements, this will give sheltered access to all our buildings. An additional covered drop-off is being investigated for the east (parking lot) entrance to the Bruner Building.
- Entrance Ramps. We are investigating options to install an accessibility ramp at the east (parking lot) entrance to the Bruner Building. This access is truly needed but is also the most difficult to achieve.

The improvements we have been made have come from generous contributions, for which we are very grateful. We welcome your suggestions as we continue to try to make Shandon accessible to all. -Donald Tudor, Chairperson, Property Committee
