COOKIES NEEDED – KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY

Kairos Prison Ministry is a short course in Christianity for prisoners at state correctional institutions. Expressions of Agape (God’s unconditional love) are an important part of the weekend, where prisoners recognize that they are part of a global Body of Christ, and people that they don’t know are praying for them.

The Kairos Prison Ministry for MCCI in McCormick, SC is having its next “Walk” on March 18–22. A typical Kairos Weekend will go through 6,000 dozen cookies which are distributed to residents, correction officers, support staff and volunteers.

Acceptable types of cookies: oatmeal, peanut butter, chocolate chip, molasses, ginger, lemon. Cookies that are uniform in size (no larger than 2 ½”) pack best and resist breakage. Very important: NO icing, sugar toppings, sprinkles, fruit, powdered sugar or any coating/glaze on outside of cookie. Use creamy peanut butter in PB cookies. Place baked cookies in clear bags and, if possible, in a box to prevent breakage during transport.

Bring cookies to Wesley Hall on March 15 and no later than March 16. There will be a table with a sign marked – Kairos

Special Needs Classroom

HEALTH AND WELFARE THANKS YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS RESPONSE BENEFITTING THE WONDERFULLY MADE – SPECIAL NEEDS CLASSROOM.

Early in February, Sarah Myers and Margaret DiBiase spoke about our intentions to re-imagine The Wonderfully Made Classroom during a Ministry Moment in all three worship services, and an Amazon “Needs List” was sent to everyone through Shandon email. Thank you so much for your generous support!

The projected start date for the class is Sunday, April 5 and is dependent on fulfillment of all preparations. Painting the classroom, reorganizing the room, and the fulfillment of Amazon “needs list” orders must be completed before April 5.

Families of special needs children suffer many extra pressures, including financial burdens that may influence the astounding 95% divorce rate documented of such families. In addition, the majority of families having a special needs child do not attend church which limits them from life-giving community and faith-based support. Thanks to your generosity, past and future, this vital ministry has an opportunity to come alongside these families and be the “hands and feet of Christ.”

We encourage you to continue your support of this vital ministry and continue to seek ways to be involved.

SOCIAL CONCERNS – THE BIBLE, THE UMC AND YOU

The issue of Gun Violence concerned the large number of people who attended the January conversation. Ideas and viewpoints were exchanged around these questions: 1) How have guns affected you personally? 2) Discussion about what common sense gun laws should be. What do you say? Some of the responses were:

- Many are affected by the residual pain of others, from suicide, accidents, shootings in schools, a high school friend shot and killed, etc.
- Parents are concerned for their children in school and in houses of friends where guns are.
- Several grew up in more rural areas where guns are for protection, food, entertainment, tools for hunting and gun ranges. Gun safety classes are normal. But in urban areas, guns = danger. Education about gun safety and protection is crucial, at home and in schools.
- Politics has tainted and skewed perspective. No one will give an inch for fear of a mile.
- Regardless of legislation, we can never recover all the guns. Best to legislate ammo or have retailers/wholesalers make decisions not to sell certain ammo.
- Require training/classes to purchase guns, along with extensive background checks, mental health evaluation, vouching for someone wanting to purchase a gun.
- Associated problems need to be addressed: drugs, alcohol, belonging, how to deal with emotions (especially boys).

The next discussion will focus on Religious Freedom in our Society: March 29 at 9:45 in Player Hall.
