BEING AN INVITING CHURCH IN 2002

As faithful United Methodists we began 2002 with Holy Communion and a Wesleyan Covenant Service in our two traditional services. During these services we renewed our commitment to worship and Sunday school participation, to regular prayer and Bible study, to service and acts of caring. As faithful United Methodists and in this year of continuing our inviting church emphasis, the various ministry areas have proposed, and the Council on Ministries has approved, means to be more inviting, ways of becoming better acquainted as a congregation and of staying in touch with our membership.

To begin accomplishing these goals, there will be some changes this Sunday, January 13. Our long-waited NAME TAGS are here! Wearing your name tag says to our visitors and to others around you hat you are glad that they are at Shandon and that you want to know who they are and want them to know you. You may even be surprised at how many names you will finally put with a face, people who have been sitting near you for months or, perhaps, even years. Pick up your name tag Sunday in the Great Hall, in the gym for LifeLine, or in Sunday School, and wear it faithfully and proudly. Keep your name tag with your BIBLE and bring both of them with you on Sunday mornings. Errors are inevitable when producing 2500 name tags, so let us know if yours needs correcting. Name tags for our visitors will be available in the pew pockets in the sanctuary and in the gym.

REGISTRATION PADS will be back on Sunday also. Accurate attendance records will enable us to be a more caring and inviting congregation. The Registration Pad design gives us helpful information in integrating visitors and members alike into our ministry opportunities. When you enter the sanctuary, the pads will be on the center aisle of each pew. Fill in your name and the pertinent information and then pass it to the person sitting next to you. The person sitting closest to the outside aisle will pass the pad back down the pew. As it passes you, look to see who is sitting on your pew. Be sure to note visitors so that you can say a word of welcome to them after the service. The person sitting closest to the center aisle will tear off the sheet(s) with names and hand it to the person collecting the registration information during the Offertory.

PRAYER REQUEST CARDS and redesigned RESERVATION CARDS are available in the pew slots on the back of the pews and may be turned in during the Offertory or directly to the office.






