

CHURCH BELLS PLACED IN BELL TOWER ON TUESDAY

Tuesday, Jan. 22 was a long awaited day for Shandon United Methodist Church. Twenty-one



new bells were lifted by crane into the bell tower while 50 or so c h u r c h members and f r i e n d s looked on and cheered.


Representatives for om Van Bergen, the bell company, and The Crane Co. converged on Shandon Monday

morning in dreary, cold weather, parking two large cranes on the front lawn. Preliminary work was done in the bell tower Monday, and the bells arrived Tuesday morning, along with a beautiful sunny day. After more work in the tower, readying it for the bells, the crew began lifting the bells in at 1:00 pm.


Many SUMC families donated money to make this project a reality, and several members came to see their bells up close before watching them being lifted into the tower.

"We hope the community will embrace the bells with open arms," said Tim Hein, Director of Music and Arts. "The bells are the voice of the people, and they will be ringing in celebration and in mourning"

The bells will be dedicated during the Feb. 24 church service. While they will be tested periodically, this date will be the first time they will ring out in the community.




