In 1982, a little movie appeared that became one of

E.T., the Extra Terrestrial, is the story of two lost souls, one a young boy lost in a broken family and suburban America, and the other, an alien from another planet, millions of miles from home, left behind by his crew to survive on Farth, Their friendship resonated with all those who saw it in 1982, and it became one of the highestgrossing films ever, landing a warm spot in the hearts of children and adults alike.

Methodist Church will relive the magic of *E.T.* on Friday, Feb. 8th, along with a special guest. **Dee Wallace Stone** played Elliott's mother in the movie, and has since gone on to many other movie and television roles. But perhaps her most important role is that of motivational speaker. She will be here Friday to talk about her lifelong spiritual journey in her discussion, "Creating the Life You Want."

Ms. Stone grew up with an alcoholic father in a lowerincome household in Kansas. She has worked on Broadway and in television, movies and commercials, most notably as the mother in *E.T.* Throughout her career, she has relied on her faith in God to sustain her.

"I'm the girl next door who learned how to make life work the hard way," says Ms. Stone. "I lived it. Victim to Victory. When you find the joy, you have to share it."

The fun festivities begin on Friday with a light supper in the LMC at 5:30 pm. Ms. Stone will then speak at 6:15, and the movie will be shown at 7:00. At 8:30, Ms. Stone will answer questions in a Q&A session.






