#### LENTEN SEASON — TIME TO "TAKE ON"

The Lenten season may not be the longest season of the church year but it is one of the most important. It is a time of spiritual preparation for Easter through repentance and growth in faith. It is the time of the year when the passion and death of the Savior come into focus. It begins with a special day of repentance, Ash

Wednesday, and ends in the depth of sorrow and tragedy on Good Friday. The disciplines of growing spiritually during Lent have traditionally included a deepening prayer life, confession of our sins, self-denial and Bible Study.

Because of the emphasis on self denial, one of the questions Christians are frequently asked during Lent is, "What are you giving up for Lent?" During Lent many people deny themselves particular pleasures in order to identify with Christ's suffering. In today's world such denial includes giving up things like sugar, chocolate, french fries, desserts, etc.

Such forms of self-denial may help persons identify with Christ's suffering, but I like to think of Lent as a disciplined time to take on something new in order grow in my faith. Therefore the question that I pose is this: "What are you taking

on for Lent?" I would suggest taking on a special Bible study. Our church is offering two during Lent this year. One focuses on the words spoken by those who watched Christ die on the cross. The other is a study that focuses

on the passion part of Handel's Messiah. Or you might want to set a goal to read through the four gospels during Lent.

There are many ways to "take on" this Lenten season. Some might want to adopt a shut-in to visit and share

time with. Patricia Warden can put you into touch with someone who would find your visit meaningful. Others might want to offer time to our church's Habitat for Humanity House. Still others might want to offer volunteer time to a community agency. Cooperative Ministry is always in need of volunteers; just give them a call. Others might want to set a goal to invite their friends, relatives, neighbors and co-workers to church during Lent.

Whether you give up something or Cross:"

take on something during Lent, it should be a season of focusing on Jesus Christ and the sacrifice He made for us all on the cross. During Lent let us be inspired by Isaac Watts' words in the great hymn, "When I Survey The Wondrous

Were the whole realm of nature mine that were an offering far too small; love so amazing so divine demands my soul, my life, my all.

The **Sanctuary Renovation Presentation** was a big success. Over 100 people attended the presentation Sunday, Feb. 10.
