

A special booklet has been printed for everyone's understanding of the history and technology of bells and also a listing of each bell, to whom and by whom it is given, and the selection of a

scriptural verse or hymn line which expresses their faith. These are keepsakes to mark a Shandon milestone for all of us.

As we dedicate these incredible gifts of the bells this Sunday, we again express our deepest gratitude to each donor to this endeavor who is sharing an immeasurable gift. We thank also the many other individuals who have had a part in its coming to fruition, who are truly too numerous to recount. However, one church staff member must be recognized. Bobby Douglas worked tirelessly, frequently laboring in the steeple in bitter rain and cold, to provide the electrical network necessary for the proper installation and use of the bells for years to come. We are deeply appreciate his unselfish efforts. So now we reach the goal which was born back in the spring of 1999 with an offhand comment by our retiring choir director and grew beyond our wildest dreams. "Praise God from whom all blessings flow!"


