John H. Dozier is Columbia College's 21st president. Dr. Dozier received his Bachelor of Science in marketing from South Carolina State University and was presented with a Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2015. He went on to earn both a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Education degrees from DePaul University in Chicago. He held a variety of leadership positions in the Chicago community college system, including vice president of academic and student affairs for Kennedy-King College and Wilbur Wright College; chief information officer for the entire system; and president of Kennedy-King College. He joined the University of South Carolina in 2013, where he served as the inaugural chief diversity officer and senior associate provost. Most recently he served as the Institute Community and Equity Officer at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Dr. Dozier is married to Victoria who is a mechanical engineer, and they have three children.

Shandon is involved in many ministries that "love mercy." Our partnership with MORE Justice gives us the opportunity to comply with God's directive to "do justice." We join 27 congregations in the Columbia area to address serious community-wide problems.

Shandon members involved with MORE Justice have decided to concentrate our efforts on affordable housing. Thousands of families in our community pay more than they can afford in rent and utilities, resulting in evictions, unsafe living conditions, and poor health and academic outcomes.

MORE Justice has made progress in the affordable housing campaign, and our own Sue Kanipe has played an integral role in this progress by serving on the Affordable Housing Committee. Richland County has allocated \$4 million to address this concern, and County Council has created a new committee to explore homeownership and rental affordability programs, but much more progress is needed. One great need is the creation of an affordable housing trust.

We need you! Politicians respond to numbers of individuals who collectively voice their concerns. Please talk to Biff Sowell, Claire Manning, Sue Kanipe or Rev. Smoke Kanipe if you have questions, and please join us for this important meeting.
