### A Love Worth Rekindling – Remembering the First Love by Pastor Godfrey Gakuru August 31, 2025

I grew up in rural Kenya, about 24 miles from Nairobi, the country's capital, and I always looked forward to visiting the city. I vividly remember my first trip there as a child—waking early with my family to attend my older brother's Thanksgiving celebration at his boarding school. The experience was full of joy and excitement, and its memories remain vivid in my mind to this day.

Transitioning from my childhood memories to today's reflection, we now consider the church in the city of Ephesus, a major commercial and religious center, famous for the great temple of Artemis—one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. The presence of this temple and the widespread worship of Artemis often weakened the believers' love for God in the church of Ephesus. Surrounded by a culture that celebrated Artemis, wealth, and trade, the believers were tempted and distracted, and their hearts became divided, no longer fully devoted to God's love. As this goes on, Jesus appears to John the Apostle in a vision while John was exiled on the island of Patmos. Jesus gave John a message for the church in Ephesus, calling them out for abandoning their first love. But Jesus' message is to the seven churches scattered all over Asia Minor, each church with a specific message. Many believers at the time were facing persecution and threats from the Roman emperor, who demanded total loyalty through emperor worship.

Despite facing these challenges, the church of Ephesus was also praised for being hard-working, patiently enduring, and doctrinally sound. They were diligent, persevering, and discerning, able to recognize and reject false preachers and apostles. Yet, despite all of this, their first love—their early, wholehearted devotion to Jesus and genuine love for one another—had grown cold. This shows us that there is a profound difference between routine service and true, passionate devotion to God and others. Outward ministry activity can continue even when inward love fades. We can be busy serving Jesus yet drift away from intimate love with Him.

To address this, there are three helpful steps— "the Three R's"—that can guide us in renewing our first love for Christ.

**The first R is Remember**. To **remember** is to intentionally look back—a spiritual flashback to earlier moments when your love for Christ burned brightly. What moments stand out to you? Perhaps it's the excitement you felt when you first gave your life to Jesus or the gratitude that overflowed when God rescued you from a difficult season.

Remembering where we started and how God has been faithful helps rekindle our first love.

The second R is Repent. Repentance is often misunderstood as meant to mean judgment or shame, but repentance is a gift—an invitation to return to God's best for us. It originates from the Greek word *metanoia*, meaning a complete change of mind and direction: to turn 180 degrees, to walk away from what leads us away from God and back toward God's love. It can also mean turning from good to better, or better to best, meaning we all have room to grow deeper in love of God and one another. Repentance is not God scolding us—it is God calling us closer.

**The third R is Repeat**. Doing the same good practices that once stirred our love for God and others: prayer, worship, reading Scripture, and acts of service or just sharing our gifts and resources with others.

**In conclusion,** God is calling us today to remember, just as the writer of Hebrews urged the early Jewish Christians, to remember, repent, and continue in those works of love. Let us rekindle our love for God and for one another, and let us continue in good works, trusting that in due time we will reap the rewards.
