If you have been following the flyers in our weekly bulletin lately, then you already know **October 12 is MISSION SUNDAY at Hope.** This is a special day in the life of our congregation, a time when we can share many things into our Midwest Mission Distribution Center in Jefferson, Iowa. Danielle Curtis will be with us, and will explain all the



activities going on at MMDC <u>AND "What Happens"</u> beyond there. Our bus garage serves as a regional depot for collecting these items awaiting transfer MMDC, but on October 12, we will be both collecting and sending these items to the Jefferson location.

First are the school kits – what a huge difference those make! Also, if you have medical equipment in good condition that you no longer need, like wheelchairs, walkers, crutches or canes – bring them to Hope! Sports equipment, like soccer, volley or basketballs, and MMDC reconditions good bicycles and sewing machines – especially treadle type sewing machines that operate without electricity. They really make a positive difference where they are placed! Lastly, if you have lawn rakes, shovels, hoes and/or hand saws in good condition, those will be used! Beginning now, as you read this, bring any of these items in. We will check daily, so you can stack or lean on the outside of bus garage. They will be safe every evening awaiting October 12.

"It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not.

They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23 KJV

This is the biblical inspiration for the Chorus of the beloved hymn, Great is Thy Faithfulness, written by Thomas O. Chisholm. He was an American hymn writer (born in Ky in 1886), and Methodist Episcopal minister who served in the pulpit only 1 year before resigning due to poor health. He was a prolific poet and hymn writer. He wrote "Living for Jesus" in 1917, and his most famous hymn was "Great is Thy Faithfulness," written in 1923. He wrote the words which were set to music by William M Runyon of the Moody Bible Institute.

The lyrics of the chorus reach out to us with reassurance:

Great is Thy faithfulness,

Great is Thy faithfulness

Morning by morning new mercies I see

All I have needed Thy hand hath provided

Great is Thy faithfulness. Lord. unto me

God is faithful to us! That means we can rely on God to keep promises given to us, to love us and always stand by us.
