TIME OF CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: We take this time now to do some self-reflection. We need to ask ourselves, "How am I doing inside?" We all have areas in our lives where sin's power seeks to lead us away from God. Now is a good time to be honest with ourselves and own up to the sinful thoughts, attitudes, actions, reactions, and the omissions that have kept us from being the faithful disciples God desires us to be in Christ. Let's confess now in silence and come to repentance.

We have given You only a part of ourselves in service and worship and have let other things take our attention away from that which is most important. Forgive us, Lord, for not always striving toward a higher level of Christian maturity. Forgive us, Lord, for not letting our lights shine over the darkness of this world. Forgive us for the sake of Jesus Christ, to whom we look for grace.
- P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, be confident in the promise from our Lord that your sins are forgiven. This gift of grace was clearly shown on the cross when Christ shed his blood for the world. As the church, it is our duty to make this message known so that others may come to know Him as Savior and Lord. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 66:18-23

Bible page(s) 1166-1167

Even several centuries before Jesus, the Lord made it plain that people of all nations – not just the people of Israel – would know his salvation.

"And I, because of their actions and their imaginations, am about to come and gather all nations and tongues, and they will come and see my glory.

I will set a sign among them, and I will send some of those who survive to the nationsto Tarshish, to the Libyans and Lydians (famous as archers), to Tubal and Greece, and to the distant islands that have not heard of my fame or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory among the nations. And they will bring all your brothers, from all the nations, to my holy mountain in Jerusalem as an offering to the LORD--on horses, in chariots and wagons, and on mules and camels," says the LORD. "They will bring them, as the Israelites bring their grain offerings, to the temple of the LORD in ceremonially clean vessels. And I will select some of them also to be priests and Levites," says the LORD.

"As the new heavens and the new earth that I make will endure before me," declares the LORD, "so will your name and descendants endure. From one New Moon to another and from one Sabbath to another, all mankind will come and bow down before me," says the LORD.

EPISTLE: Hebrews 12:4-24

Bible page(s) 1877-1878

Enduring hardship and difficulties does not mean that we are not loved by God, but in fact, it's just the opposite. God disciplines those he loves, treating them as children for their growth and maturity of faith and life.

In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. And you have forgotten that word of encouragement that addresses you as sons: "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son."

Éndure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his sons. For what son is not

disciplined by his father? If you are not disciplined (and everyone undergoes discipline), then you are illegitimate children and not true sons. Moreover, we have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of our spirits and live! Our fathers disciplined us for a little while as they thought best; but God disciplines us for our good, that we may share in his holiness. No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.

Therefore, strengthen your feeble arms and weak knees. "Make level paths for your feet," so that the lame may not be disabled, but rather healed.

Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one misses the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many. See that no one is sexually immoral, or is godless like Esau, who for a single meal sold his inheritance rights as the oldest son. Afterward, as you know, when he wanted to inherit this blessing, he was rejected. He could bring about no change of mind, though he sought the blessing with tears.

You have not come to a mountain that can be touched and that is burning with fire; to darkness, gloom and storm; to a trumpet blast or to such a voice speaking words that those who heard it begged that no further word be spoken to them, because they could not bear what was commanded: "If even an animal touches the mountain, it must be stoned." The sight was so terrifying that Moses said, "I am trembling with fear."

But you have come to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God, the judge of all men, to the spirits of righteous men made perfect, to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 13:22-30

Bible page(s) 1621

Jesus shocks his hearers as he tells them that many of those who think that they will be saved will not be, while many who are thought to have no chance, will be!

Narrator: Then Jesus went through the towns and villages, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him,

ALL: "Lord, are only a few people going to be saved?"

Jesus: "Make every effort to enter through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able to. Once the owner of the house gets up and closes the door, you will stand outside knocking and pleading, 'Sir, open the door for us.' "But he will answer, 'I don't know you or where you come from.' "Then you will say, 'We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets.' "But he will reply, 'I don't know you or where you come from. Away from me, all you evildoers!' "There will be weeping there, and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of

God, but you yourselves thrown out. People will come from east and west and north and south, and will take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God. Indeed there are those who are last who will be first, and first who will be last."

NICENE CREED LSB p. 191

C: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

- Will I, with a grateful heart, and in loving obedience, allow God's Holy Spirit to improve my attitudes, and empower me to live for Him?
- Do I share the confession and therefore unity with this congregation?

If you answer "No" to any question or if it is your first time at Good Shepherd or if you have any additional questions, please speak with the Pastor.

If you wish to commune, please check the box next to your name on the attendance card and place it in the offering plates.

When you are ushered to the front for communion, you are welcome to either kneel or stand. Gluten-free wafers and white grape juice are available to those that for health reasons cannot have wheat wafers and/or wine.
