The meeting was opened with prayer at 11:01am.

Staff Report

Pastor Ryan: Lots of pastoral care and home visits. Pastor Ryan is grateful for the support of the church.

Deacon Katie: Half of the handbells have been sent off for refurbishment. It may take a few months for them to return. The organ is officially out of warranty. A few minor issues have arisen and we need to be mindful of potential upcoming costs.

Treasurer's Report

Giving is up 13% compared to last year however it is still \$1,000 below budget per week.

Ongoing Business

1. Ministry Spending Plan: committee updates needed by Finance Committee by September 20

2. Committee responsibility documents: due by September 5 (original attached)

3. Time and Talent survey: Please follow up with people who took the time to fill these out and want to be involved in the church.

4. Mission statement: Council will pray and vote at the next Council meeting.

New Business

1. Endowment Committee proposed a vote to raise the percentage of money disbursed for grants from 2% to 3%. The money is well invested and growing on average at a greater rate than that. All members voted in favor.

2. Endowment Committee proposed a new committee member. Richard Davis was put forth as a candidate. **All members voted in favor.**

3. Fellowship Committee 5th Sunday Potluck, Rally Day. Help is needed for 5th Sunday potluck on September 29th. Fellowship is exploring having small groups

4. Property Committee: Family Life Center has issues with water intrusion that need to be addressed. Trees need to be trimmed to prevent potential issues. Redeemer preschool has offered to cover half the cost. The church received a quote for \$5,000. A proposal was put forth to approved spending \$2,500. It was put forth by Pastor Ryan and seconded by Erik Kreutner. **All members voted in favor.**

5. Worship and music put forth a proposal to switch to smaller vases on the altar. The old ones have become dented and worn. The cost for two will range between \$300-\$600 and will be paid out of the memorial fund. **All members voted in favor**

6. Neal Cook and Kim Cumbie will be ending their term on council at the end of the year. Jeff Sechrest will be up for a vote for his second term.


