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A NEW SCHOOL YEAR

Like many of you, my family moved to Stafford for the home values and, more importantly, for the highly rated school system. A Virginia community with reasonable home prices and quality public schools? Jackpot! It was an easy sell in the early 2000s.

Since then, Stafford has experienced tremendous growth bringing with it both blessings and challenges. Like many communities, we wrestle to find enough funding for our schools and have experienced various rounds of redistricting.

However, I remain hopeful. I am hopeful because I worship in a church alongside county and school board members, school administrators, teachers, and staff. I watch them do their jobs with boundless dedication and passion. I am also hopeful because I have a front row seat for Ebenezer's developing relationship with local schools.

Ebenezer has always been in the business of supporting education. After participating in the program at Margaret Brent Elementary School, we launched Stafford Junction's Brain Builder program at Hampton Oaks Elementary School. The program is a great way to serve students, but we wanted to do more. Our goal was to develop a relationship with Hampton Oaks, listen to their needs, and determine how best we could support teachers and students alike.

You and I, as part of Ebenezer Church, have had a real impact on our students and community. In the last few years we have provided after-school tutoring, funded the Phoenix Award for an outstanding graduate at the county's Alternative Education program, underwritten the Cooking Class for the autism program at Hampton Oaks, supported Challenge Day at North Stafford High School, provided over 300 filled backpacks to under-resourced students, hosted Family Literacy Nights for the county's Head Start program, and helped teachers and staff move in to new classrooms during the summer.

With recent rezoning, Moncure Elementary emerged in our community with some of the greatest needs. As an early step in fulfilling our vision, Ebenezer is working with Moncure's amazing staff to address those needs.

We have created a launch team for our new Hope Night ministry to help folks in Stafford who need support and healing. We will begin sharing those details this fall with the hopes of launching Hope Night early in 2020.

Closer to home, we've seen the advent of a Young Adult Ministry Team to help create the most amazing young adult discipleship and fellowship possible. We have a team tasked with creating a plan for extending our parking and adding a new entrance to our campus. We hope to have that plan ready for the congregation to review and approve by the middle of next year.

Further away from Stafford, I cannot wait to share the developments on the horizon with Helping Children Worldwide, our partner organization in Bo, Sierra Leone. That is a conversation we'll have this fall in worship.

There are more initiatives to launch and much work to be done. 

Plus, we financially support organizations like Stafford Junction and Stafford Food Security who are serving Stafford students.

As part of Ebenezer's Focus 2025 Transforming Stafford initiative, we plan to continue to build relationships with our current partner schools and develop new ones. Brisben's food and nutrition program is wholly provided by community donations. As part of this, a group of volunteers from Ebenezer Church prepares and serves a Saturday evening meal each month. At Brisben, we find no strangers, only new friends and family. It's an Ebenezer tradition to make the meal special through both a great menu of options and an investment of love in the preparation and serving. Our goal is to make dinner feel like you're are attending a family reunion. This kind of fellowship is a blessing to all involved.

Whether visiting people in their homes, in the hospital, or at the local coffee shop, the simple act of connecting with others is filled with powerful possibilities. The act of love and friendship is an inroad to someone's heart, creates trust, and provides incredible potential for ministry.

By the numbers alone, in a church our size, there are likely many people who have unmet needs for a variety of reasons. Illness or age may compromise a person's ability to get around. Sometimes, medical conditions leave people on a short tether to their home or hospital. Our pastors visit and call many people during the week, but wouldn't it be wonderful if a well-trained group of volunteer visitors can spend extra time and check-in more regularly with our friends?

Those who want company will be loved and cared for in a special way. Most importantly, we ensure our friends don't become isolated. Jesus set the example when it comes to love. He calls on us to love as He has loved, symbolically giving our lives for others. That is precisely what we want to accomplish in Visitation Ministry.

The Visitation Team needs spirit-filled and Christ-centered people who are committed to the long-term ministry of loving and caring for others. Ebenezer Church is looking for volunteers who will make monthly visits to anyone who could benefit from encouragement, comfort, or a sense of belonging.

You could visit in homes, hospitals, nursing homes, a coffee shop, in church, or anywhere convenient. Ebenezer's Visitation Team members will be asked to make visits once a month. Team members will receive training and support materials to use during their visits.
