NEIGHBORING

Jesus told us that loving God and loving our neighbors are the two most important things for Christians. What if we put some skin on that? What if we loved God so much that we let that love change and ground us? What if we loved our neighbors...our actual neighbors: the people who live beside us; the people we see at school; the people we see at ballgames; the people we see at the grocery store? What would it look like to be there for our neighbors and neighborhoods in new and practical ways - in ways that meet them where they are? And what if we did this not only as individuals but also as a church? Let's see what scripture says about growing relationships right outside our door.

COMMITMENTS THAT WILL CHANGE YOUR LIFE

How do we grow in faith? We often grow through commitments we make in the vital ways we live out faith: worship, prayer, service, small groups, missions, and giving. Each week, we will hear personal stories about how individuals are growing in these ways. How will you commit to grow? How will God use that commitment to change you and change your life? Each person will receive a card of invitation to mark the commitments we make. A new small group this year? A commitment to local missions? Praise Band? Office volunteer? Daily prayer? Tithing? Weekly worship? To what is Christ inviting you? We will celebrate these commitments in worship in November. Watch the fruit that grows when we offer ourselves more deeply to Jesus.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR JEFF

Beautiful Sisters and Brothers of Ebenezer,

A new season is approaching—the season of autumn! Some of my fondest memories take place in this season, a time when the leaves are changing colors, the weather is turning colder, the aroma of apples is in the air, pumpkins are laying in the field, and houses are decorated with cornstalks and straw bales.

For some, a new season brings hopefulness, but for others, the stress of change is overwhelming. Are you starting a new school year or new job, or transitioning from working at home to commuting? Maybe you are getting ready to move to a new house, a new city, or a new part of the world. Possibly, you are entering a new season of life with or without a loved one. Whatever it may be, transition is actively upon each of us.

In the Gospels, Jesus taught by telling stories, usually ending with a tagline about needing the right "eyes to see," or "ears to hear." It's as if Jesus was telling folks that life was happening all around them, but it was going overlooked.

Where are we focused during the changing season? Are we able to see and hear how God is working in, with, through, and around us? Or are we like Jesus' audience, missing the fullness of life, even as it walks right past us?

As the leaves begin to change color and fall to the ground over the next couple of weeks, I am reminded of one of my previous neighbors, John, who daily would break out his leaf vacuum and suck up all the leaves in his yard, and even some that fell in ours. Every day throughout the summer, John would always tend to his yard, by either watering his lawn, pulling weeds in his flowerbeds, or mowing his grass.

Now, as we enter the season of autumn, I imagine he will be outside yet again, vacuuming the hundreds of leaves and countless sticks that have fallen in his yard. The funny part is, he has no trees in his yard! The leaves and sticks are all carried onto his property from nearby yards thanks to the bustling wind. Rather than blowing the leaves and sticks back into the surrounding yards, he picks them up.

A couple of years ago, after coming home to find that our grass had been cut and leaves picked up, I went over to his house to thank him. John's response was, "That's what neighbors do." But it wasn't just an act of being neighborly for John, it was an act of being a good steward. His caring, meticulous, and neighborly nature is all grounded in his stewardship.

What does stewardship mean to you? How do your interactions with your neighbors flow from your call to be a good steward? Do they come naturally, or are they still works in progress? Loving our actual neighbors—the ones who live directly around us, and the folks we interact with daily, is one of the

simplest things we can do to impact our communities and our world. Plus, loving our neighbors is what Jesus told us to do. "Love God with everything you've got, and love your neighbor as yourself."

Over the next couple of weeks, I hope you'll make a commitment to be more neighborly, to stop and take in the crisp autumn air, to pray for your neighbors and your church, and reflect on how we can more deeply, and more fully, live out our call from Jesus to Love God and Love Our Neighbors.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MONICA

The Northern Virginia Missional Hub, functionally known as the Love Your Neighbor Network, is off to a great start! I have much gratitude and appreciation for our leadership team and the microchurch members, who have committed themselves to being church where life happens and loving neighbors as God commands. I invite you to join me in praying for and over them and this ministry.

Because a small number of disciples could see a vision for church outside of the walls and are taking a risk to put flesh around the Gospel in these contexts, we are witnessing the planting and watering of seeds, as well as God birthing fruit. It is a true labor of love that will take time, patience, commitment, and an investment in relationships.

And the work has only just begun!

Over the next two months, we will be seeking to identify and train a handful of potential "Dinner Church" leaders or those interested in supporting a Dinner Church. What is Dinner

Church? It is an expression of church that commits to meeting weekly or regularly around the table. In traditional church settings, we gather in a sanctuary. However, Scripture is full of stories and lessons that occur around tables. Jesus was often found eating and drinking.

Breaking bread. Washing feet. Sharing stories. Learning God's Word. Seeing God in a new way. Seeing our neighbor in a new way. Confession. Forgiveness. Mercy. Prophecy. Feasting. Remembering God's goodness. All things that happen around tables!

Life happens around tables, and our thought is that church should happen around tables too. We would love to add a few Dinner Churches (or Breakfast Churches if that's your thing) to our Love Your Neighbor Network.

The meal doesn't have to be fancy. You could rotate homes or tables. You could even meet in a local diner. The main idea is to gather regularly around a shared meal, and in that space you will be invited to share real life together. Not just your own lives, but the life of Jesus which was broken and poured out for us.

We will provide training and equip you with resources such as prayer, Scripture, liturgy, music, or any other "church" elements you would like to include. Dinner Church can be contextualized to your preferred setting. It could be more liturgical or more conversational, but at its heart it will be inherently relational. Just like God!

If the thought of sharing a meal and sharing life together sounds warm or inviting to you, perhaps God is calling you to be part of the movement. Could this be you? I would love to connect and see how we can work together to share God's love around some tables.

GOLD AWARD BRINGS GAGA BALL TO EBENEZER

When Kait Priest began bouncing around ideas for her Girl Scout Gold Award project, a gaga ball pit immediately came to mind. Ask anyone in Student Ministries: this twist on dodgeball is a favorite activity at the Axis Fall Retreat, but there aren't many places to play in Stafford. Building a gaga ball pit at Ebenezer would fill that gap and provide a way for fans of the game to share it with the community.

A senior at Colonial Forge High School, Kait began scouting in first grade and is now an Ambassador in Troop #5033. Her scouting career has had many highlights, including her leadership of the Northern Border Day Camp, but the Gold Award has been in her sights since entering high school.

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award a girl scout can earn and requires approximately 80 hours of research, planning, and execution. To support her proposal for a community recreation opportunity at Ebenezer, Kait investigated not only the nuts and bolts of constructing a gaga ball pit, but also the benefits of physical activity, delving into exercise patterns among high school students and how COVID has affected them.

Ebenezer Church member Elise Pailthorpe became Kait's Gold Award Guide after her project was approved by the Girl Scout Gold Award Review Board. Kait then made a presentation to the Ebenezer Board of Trustees, which greenlighted construction of the pit on church property and allocated funding for necessary building materials from the Bridge to Tomorrow Fund.

On September 4, members of Kait's small group pitched in to help install the gaga ball pit on Ebenezer's rear parking lot, and it was the main attraction at

the Student Ministries bonfire the following night. Its 30-inch octagonal walls are made of pressure-treated lumber, held together by metal brackets, and topped with protective plastic covers. The rules of the game are posted on the side, and balls are available in a nearby bin.

A grand opening is in the works, and Kait also plans to contact the homeowners' associations of the Autumn Ridge and Embrey Mill neighborhoods to let them know that the gaga ball pit is available.

Looking back, Kait recalled that the most enjoyable part of the project was sharing the news with the superfans in Student Ministries. "Everyone said, 'Thank you so much!' There's a lot of joy and excitement about being able to play this game here at the church."



Axis Summer Mission Trip

In July, 42 teens and adult leaders traveled to Wilmington, NC for the Axis Summer Mission Trip. Thanks to the incredible generosity of our church family, the students were able to participate at a reduced rate and have a wonderful experience growing in their faith.

To prepare for the trip, participants were assigned to small groups with three to four other students and an adult leader. The groups met four to six times to study the Bible and get to know each other, a process that was vital to building community and ensuring that students were focused and ready to serve upon arrival.

Our theme for the week was Neighbors, with a scripture focus on the Good Samaritan in Luke: Go and Do Likewise. Throughout the week, we put this into practice by opening our eyes to see the needs around us and having the courage and willingness to help meet those needs.

Students and adults were divided into four work groups: one group worked with Habitat for Humanity and a food bank; the other three groups worked with Wilmington Area Rebuilding Ministry (WARM) to provide free home repairs to those in need. Students learned carpentry skills and installed flooring, while building relationships with those they served. Groups were challenged to pray for homeowners and others at their work sites and were blessed as they watched hearts open.
