A NOTE FROM PASTOR JEFF

Beautiful and Beloved People of God,

The season of Advent is upon us. This season is both a time of preparation and an Adventure. Year after year, we prepare to welcome God's son, Jesus, into the world to be Emmanuel - God with us in human flesh. Every year, we prepare our homes, our church, and most importantly, our hearts to celebrate what happened some 2,000 years ago and what it means for us today.

Anyone who has ever traveled knows how much time is spent preparing, from packing clothes for every kind of weather to making sure you have that special pillow or candle. One of the most important items on our family's packing list is a white noise machine for Xavier. However, as Alacia, Xavier, and I were traveling last year...yes, you guessed it...I left it at home, right on the counter with fresh batteries. We plan and plan, and still things go awry.

How has your year been? Did you make plans this year only to have everything fall apart? Did you get down on yourself when plans changed? The past 20 months have truly kept us on our toes. Each day is a constant reminder that things are always changing, whether we are ready or not. There are just some things we cannot prepare for. But that too is much like our journey as followers of Christ.

The weeks and months leading up to the first Christmas have much in common with the past 20 months. Things may have started out normally, like January and February of 2020, but they quickly turned chaotic. Mary and Joseph were dating, betrothed, and planning to wed (Plan A), but then things took a strange turn: Mary became pregnant, and the baby was not Joseph's! Joseph planned to call off the wedding and quietly dismiss Mary (Plan B), because he knew that if he exposed her, she would be disowned by her family and possibly even stoned.

But an angel appeared to Joseph and told him to reconsider and go forward with the wedding (Plan C). Then a census was called, and Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem before the baby was born (Plan D). Mary realized that her time had come as she was riding on the back of a donkey (or a colt, depending on your Scripture translation), so they searched for an inn (Plan E), but to no avail. With no room at the inn, Mary and Joseph had to settle for giving birth in a stable with "clean" straw and warmth from a few animals. (Plan F).

If you tend to get down on yourself when plans go awry, take heart! Think about Mary and Joseph, who went from Plan A to Plan F in the days before the first Christmas. None of those changes fouled up God's plan to bring salvation to all the earth, and none of those changes upended God's plan to bring hope to all humankind and healing to all nations. God's plan to send his Son into our world was not foiled at all. Instead, the angels sang, the shepherds saw and heard, and a child was born into this world with all its suffering. Good news of great joy for all people.

Plans may change, but God's plan for each of us remains the same: for us to know God, trust God, let ourselves be loved and forgiven by God, and in turn, let that love and forgiveness be seen in us. So, whether or not your Christmas plans work out this year, let there be room in your heart for God's Christmas plan: joy to the world, peace on earth, and good will to all.

LESSONS AND CAROLS – DECEMBER 19, 7:00 PM, SANCTUARY

Usher in the joy of the season at our service of Lessons and Carols, featuring the Ebenezer Choir. The Christmas story will come to life through the reading of Scripture passages along with performances of sacred music. Reflect on the meaning of the Word, sing along to your favorite carols, and enjoy seasonal arrangements by the choir at this very special start to Christmas week. LIVING NATIVITY – DECEMBER 22, 7:00 PM, BACK PARKING LOT

Bundle up, bring your lawn chair, and get ready to travel back in time to the very first Christmas. The Nativity will come to life as you've never seen it before, with firsthand accounts from Elizabeth, Mary, Joseph, the Innkeeper, a Wiseman, and a Shepherd, accompanied by live barnyard animals. We'll end our evening at the manger by taking communion, lighting candles, and singing Silent Night. Afterward, you may warm up by the fire, visit the animals, and enjoy a cup of hot chocolate. A NOTE FROM PASTOR MONICA

What is The Love Your Neighbor Network? Now that our fledgling network of small expressions of church has a few months under its belt, I thought it might be helpful to explain who we are and why we exist, and also invite you to consider how you might be called to Love Your Neighbor this Advent season and beyond.

Who are we? We are disciples of Jesus Christ who have felt called to love our actual neighbors in tangible ways. By taking everyday activities that we love, such as sewing, walking, playing soccer, or gaming, and simply incorporating one or more faith practices into those regular meetings, we are learning to stretch ourselves and put our faith into action where life is already happening.


For example, a group of people walking together could also involve a time of prayer or scripture meditation. Several people sewing together may also take time to pray over their creations and those who will receive them. A group of folks who regularly gather for basketball or soccer may also start each gathering by checking in with one another and asking how things are going. The gathering may end in prayer and with an invitation to attend our monthly outdoor evening of worship, which is less formal than worship in the Sanctuary and allows room for dialogue and discussion.

Why do we exist? We exist because our call as the church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We do this by committing to love our neighbors in the places and spaces where life is already happening. This is important because our call does not change, even in the face of trends and statistics that tell the story of a western population that is less and less familiar with even the basic tenets of Christianity. When many of our neighbors are not coming to church, we must figure out how to be the church where they already are.

What about you? As we move into the Advent season, what are some ways God might be inviting you to love your actual neighbors? Could it be a dinner gathering? A game night? Christmas caroling in your neighborhood? Offering to run errands with or for a neighbor unable to complete the task solo? If you feel called to love your neighbor this Advent season or beyond, please connect with me. I'd love to pray with, encourage, and support you in any way I can.

We had a perfect fall morning and a wonderful turnout for our 11th Annual Go For Bo 5K. 1-Mile Fun Run and Tot Dash on October 9. A total of 328 runners signed up to run either in person or virtually. Over 50 volunteers from Ebenezer and many area schools came out to support the race and make sure our new course was safe and fun for all. Our generous sponsors donated \$50,000 to Helping Children Worldwide (HCW), our mission partner in Sierra Leone. These funds will enable HCW to expand the reach of the work being done in the villages surrounding Bo, providing safe drinking water and expanded infrastructure to allow for a sustainable economy. THE PRAISE BAND IS BACK!

The Ebenezer Praise Band returned this fall with a new leader. Preston Hardage became Ebenezer's Director of Worship in September, bringing a lifelong love of music and a commitment to spirit-filled worship to the Sanctuary stage.

"I want there to be a dialogue between the people up there playing music and the congregation," Preston said. "The band is there to create an atmosphere for the Spirit to work in people. The rhythm, harmonies, and lyrics all speak to people in different ways."

Preston's roots in the United Methodist Church date back to his childhood in St. Louis, Missouri. "It was never an option to not go to church," he recalled. He taught himself to play guitar and embarked on a musical path that included leading worship in his youth group, forming a band with friends, and serving as a trombonist in "The President's Own" U.S. Marine Band.

Along the way, he was invited to join the worship band at Christ Crossman UMC in Falls Church and later became its worship leader. He also struck up a friendship with Ebenezer's former Director of Worship Allan Paquette, which eventually led him to apply for his current position.

"This was a God thing that had been in motion for a while and I didn't realize it," he said. "A door was opening. I just had to get the message."

Preston is excited to invite new members to join the praise band team. Auditions are now open for vocalists and electric and acoustic instrumentalists; even instruments not normally associated with the praise band are welcome.



"It's definitely a team effort. One of my philosophies is to delegate and give each person - especially those with a microphone in hand - a voice," he explained. "What I look for in volunteers are people who want to contribute and have a heart for service and a heart for worship music. My job is to lead and to teach and help people grow."

MAKE A JOYFUL NOISE WITH THE EBENEZER CHOIR

Do you enjoy singing? Have you ever thought about joining the choir but always put it off? The choir could become your musical small group!

The Ebenezer Choir returned to the Sanctuary in September, not a moment too soon for Choir Director Dwayne Miller. "It feels so good to be together again after such a long separation," he said. "There

is nothing like making music together with people LIVE."

Dwayne and his wife Amy began singing with the choir in 2003. Dwayne became director in 2015 and now encourages others to join.

"We welcome anyone who likes to sing, and as with many music groups, men are most especially welcome. We sing a wide range of traditional music - sometimes a cappella - including hymn arrangements, classical music, spirituals and more," he explained.

While reading music and previous choir experience might be helpful, they are not required, and auditions aren't necessary. The choir rehearses on Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:00 PM and warms up on Sunday mornings at 7:45 AM in preparation for the 8:15 AM traditional service.

"Come give us a test drive! You could jump in the deep end with us Wednesdays and Sundays, or just attend rehearsals for a few weeks until you feel comfortable enough to give Sunday a go," Dwayne said.

The choir is currently devoting the last 20 minutes of its weekly rehearsal to preparing for its Lessons and Carols service on December 19. Dwayne invites those who may be interested in a shorter-term commitment to consider joining for the Advent season and being part of this event.
