A NOTE FROM PASTOR JEFF


Beautiful and Beloved People of Ebenezer!

Counselor's Corner



How long has it been since you've looked at Moses' interaction with the burning bush? I want to provide a brief recap in case you're unfamiliar with the story. In Exodus 3:1-4:17, God instructs Moses to go and address the Pharoah, to be the instrument God has chosen to set His nation free. Moses responds by providing God with four different reasons why he cannot complete the task. Moses questions his own identity, his faith, and his abilities, as well as God's authority. Beyond this, Moses ultimately asks God to choose someone else.

I love this story because if we are being honest with ourselves, each of us struggles with the same things that Moses named. When we are facing the trials and challenges of life, the noise of our circumstances may rise above the fact that we are called "Masterpiece" by our Father who created the universe. WOW! There may be times when we question our own abilities. We may struggle with obedience or ask God to send someone else when we know He is calling us into uncomfortable situations.

God wants to equip us the same way He equipped Moses. We are called to pray in all things. Do not be afraid to share your doubts with God, just like Moses did. He wants us to accomplish far more than our perceived limitations may allow us to accomplish. God calls us into community as well. We can see this in God's direction for Moses to take his brother Aaron with him. In a similar fashion, God will use those around you to support you wherever He is calling you. We are truly never alone when we seek Him with all of our heart, soul, and

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MONICA

"Did you try your best?"

"Have you pushed as hard as you could?"

"Did you get the grade, make the deal, or win the race?"

You may hear these phrases regularly. You might even use them regularly. The idea of hard work leading to success, or even favor in God's eyes, seems as American as apple pie. And to be clear, I do believe God desires that we steward our gifts, talents, efforts, time, and resources wisely and toward aims that glorify God.

However, there is also a shadow side of this "work harder" message. The shadow side often whispers that we must earn our worth, that our value is measured in our output or credentials, and that if we are not constantly striving or succeeding, we are somehow not valuable in God's eyes.

That message, brothers and sisters, is inconsistent with the Good News of Jesus Christ. It can lead to burnout, guilt, shame, and destruction.

As we creep toward the two-year mark of Covid throwing our lives, rhythms, and norms into a continual tailspin, I cannot help but wonder if God is asking us to reevaluate the metrics we have often used to evaluate our worth. No matter how hard one is trying right now or how frequently one is adapting to ever-changing guidance, success - or even footing - seems elusive.

Could this be an invitation to find our footing in God's goodness, mercy, promises, rest, and grace? Could it be an invitation for us to reconsider what the Gospel asks of us? Invites us into? And dare I ask, could it be an invitation to do something completely countercultural?

If the world's message has often been "try harder," I wonder what it might look like in your life, in your neighborhood, and in the life of our church to instead try softer.

Remember, you are God's beloved. The prophet Isaiah reminds us, "Even if the mountains walk away and the hills fall to pieces, my love won't walk away from you, my covenant commitment of peace won't fall apart." (Isaiah 54:10)

"UMM is a fellowship of men who dedicate themselves, their time, their talents, and their resources to building the Kingdom of God and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ," Bob said. "It is designed to assist men in managing their ever-changing relationships, roles, and responsibilities in the family setting, workplace, and community."

Built on the premise that men are at their best when they model Jesus Christ in their thoughts, words, and deeds, UMM offers programs that help build men spiritually and

provide opportunities to serve. One of UMM's primary goals is to support the pastors and ministries within the church, but individual members also participate in community service programs, such as the Woodcutting Ministry. Most importantly, the organization provides a safe place for men to "take the mask off" and be themselves.

"As a rule, men don't like to share their struggles with others," Bob explained, drawing on two decades of experience managing individual and family support programs for the U.S. Coast Guard. "UMM offers ways for men to realize that they are not the only ones dealing with a myriad of life's challenges, that at times it is okay to not be okay, and that they can address and overcome those issues by working and sharing with other men."

UMM membership is open to any man who has a desire to belong to and participate in the ministry of the church. Church membership is not required. FITNESS GROUPS

FITNESS + FELLOWSHIP = FAMILY

The Ebenezer Exercise Group is back in action, bringing fitness and fellowship to the Ministry Center basement four mornings each week. The group is open to participants of all ages and fitness levels with free classes, free childcare, and a welcoming environment where everyone feels like family.

"The family and community built within these walls is unlike any other," said Alyse O'Steen, a certified fitness instructor who helps coordinate the program, along with Patrice DeBord and Lauren Hamilton.



The group originated as an informal gathering of friends doing exercise DVD's but has since become a comprehensive fitness program with eight certified instructors and a full range of classes including Zumba, HIIT, Boot Camp, RYZE, and HIGH. Many of the current instructors started as participants and were encouraged to pursue teaching by Patrice, whose own fitness career began in an unexpected way.

"I believe I was God-directed. I didn't get into teaching until my 30's," she explained. "A friend said, 'There's a class I want you to take,' and I found my calling."

The Exercise Group meets on Mondays and Thursdays at 9:15 AM. Classes are free of charge and open to the public. Childcare is also free, courtesy of Ebenezer KidzCare. Participants can view the schedule and sign up for classes via the group's Facebook page.

Patrice is also leading classes for Active Older Adults on Tuesdays and Fridays at 9:15 AM. These sessions emphasize coordination and practical exercises to improve agility, flexibility, and motor skills. No registration is required, and anyone is welcome to drop in.

The instructors are excited to be able to return to in-person classes with Covid safety precautions in place. "One of the fun things about a large group is that you get caught up in the energy. It becomes an integral part of who you are." Patrice said. "Within a few minutes, I can feel my funk being lifted. They're sharing their joy."

"We're here to lift each other up. I never realized how important that was until we didn't have it anymore." Alyse added. At the end of each class, participants gather for a prayer circle. "The instructor begins, then everyone goes around and says what's on their hearts and minds," Alyse explained. "It's a raw and beautiful moment. You learn that you're not alone. There's always somebody that can relate to your experience."



"In a God-graced group, the truth comes out." Patrice agreed. "It reaches to the heart of where women are. Women like to support each other."
