What's in a Name?

(Advent series: Nov 27-Dec 18)

What's in a name? Much, as it turns out. A name is how we come to know ourselves and how we are known to others. What do the names given to Jesus tell us about who he is? Jesus is Emmanuel, Prince of Peace, Messiah, Word, Light of the World. It's hard to put all that on a birth certificate, and yet it's easy to put all that on our hearts.

New Year, Same God (Jan 1-Jan 22)

God was, is, and will be. Amidst all that happens, God is present. In the Old Testament, God shows up in a field of sheep, on a mountaintop, and by a river. In the New Testament, God shows up at a well, in the synagogue, and on a road to Damascus. In 2023, God will show up at the grocery store, on the soccer field, and in the living room. It's a new year, and the same God will lead us through it.

Different Words

(Jan 29-Feb 19)

There is always a silver lining. Time heals all wounds. God doesn't give you more than you can handle. Someone has probably said those words to you, or you've said them to someone else. However, what if we could offer something more meaningful? How does God invite us to offer different words of hope, comfort, and promise?

This is Jesus

(Lent & Easter - Feb 26-Apr 9)

Who do you say Jesus is? Jesus gives us the answer in the Gospel of John. He states repeatedly, I am...giving us different ways to think about who he is and how he relates to us. Many of our small groups will study Matt Rawle's book Jesus Revealed: The I Am Sayings during this series.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR JEFF

Beautiful and Beloved People of Ebenezer!

During a recent optometry appointment, I read a pamphlet which stated that the human eye can see a candlelight flame in the dark of night thirty miles away. That is a long way! God created us in such a way that our eyes are drawn to light. Our eyes and our souls seek light amidst darkness.

When I was in college, my former youth pastor called to tell me that his newborn son, Caleb, had developed RSV, a serious illness for infants. Twice while I was visiting the family at the hospital, the crash cart was wheeled into Caleb's room in the neonatal intensive care unit. Later, when Caleb was out of the hospital and on the mend, I received a card from my youth pastor which said, "At one of the darkest moments, you stopped by. You offered prayer. I don't remember the words. I don't remember the phrases. I just remember the warmth, the light, the presence. Thank you for being a light in the darkness."

Friends, God has called us to be Children of Light. If we open our eyes, the Spirit will show us points of light all around: when we share our resources with ministry partners from Stafford to Sierra Leone or when friendship goes deeper than skin or history. Light warms. Light gives vision. Light is God's gift to the world. As Christians, we are God's gift of Light.

As winter approaches, the days get shorter, the nights get longer, and the morning chill bites at our noses. In worship, we focus on our need for a Savior and our need for light amidst the darkness. Singer-songwriter Leonard Cohen, best known for his song "Hallelujah" once said, "Pay attention to the cracks, because that's where the light gets in." As disciples, we look for the cracks. We look for the places when God's heavenly light is bursting into the earthly dark. As followers of Jesus, we acknowledge the darkness, but only because it enables us to see the light.

When disaster, death, and darkness come, look for the light. We are called to see the goodness and greatness of God's glory as the Kingdom light breaks forth into this

Counselor's Corner



Johnny Cash is credited with saying, "Close the door on the past. You don't try to forget the mistakes, but you don't dwell on it. You don't let it have any of your energy, or any of your time, or any of your space.'

It's common to struggle with allowing our past actions, hurts, or experiences to define our future. I wish I could reclaim the hours I've spent wondering what would have been different if I had said this or done that. I am guilty, as many of us are, of allowing my past to have far too much of my energy. I need reminders, such as the Johnny Cash quote, or maybe the cast of Frozen singing "Let it Go" to help me realize our heavenly Father loves us too much to leave us in the wreckage of our past.

Paul captures this sentiment in Philippians 3:12-16. I am drawn to verses 13 and 14: "Brothers I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead. I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." This message is inspirational and so accurate about what it means to follow Jesus. Our faith is not designed to be sedentary; we are a people of action, a people defined by our willingness to strain forward. We are called to action in community, in prayer, in the study of Scripture as well as our service to others. These actions should cause us to experience a healthy growth from where we currently are to where Jesus is leading us.

If you are not experiencing this growth because of past actions, or maybe you have grown content with where you are in your faith, please contact me. I would be honored to see if we can partner with the Spirit and grow through these circumstances.



DENOMINATIONAL UPDATE

As our United Methodist denomination prepares for the next worldwide General Conference in 2024, we will continue sharing updates. We recently hosted a Town Hall with about 80 in attendance to provide information. We also held four Listening Sessions to invite further feedback and conversation; 28 people participated in these, facilitated by Governing Board members and pastors. We are always open to questions through ebenezerinfo@ebenezerumc.org. We would love to hear from you.

Ebenezer is part of the Virginia Conference which is within the Southeastern Jurisdiction (SEJ). This covers a geographical region from Virginia to Florida. The SEJ held a conference November 2-4 at which a new bishop was named for Virginia. Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson begins serving on January 1, 2023. Our current Bishop Sharma Lewis will move to the Mississippi Conference at the end of 2022. Visit vaumc.org to learn more.

A special called Virginia Annual Conference was held October 29, 2022. This conference ratified the closure of three churches and the disaffiliation of ten churches, out of more than 1,100 United Methodist churches in Virginia. More information is available at vaumc.org.

FINANCE UPDATE

On October 21, the Finance Committee received the proposed 2023 budget, which projects a \$500,000 shortfall with expected giving of \$1,750,000. Just as we pay attention to our family's budget, our church must do the same.

For several years, excluding government assistance, Ebenezer has experienced deficit spending. The various government programs, coupled with COVID program assistance received by the Ebenezer Preschool and passed along to the church, have been very helpful to the tune of \$850,000, but that will no longer be available going forward. To restore financial stability, we must step up our giving if we want Ebenezer Church to continue to offer support to our members, the local community, and those throughout the world.

It's time to consider the blessings we as individuals receive and remember that God has provided all we have. In return, God asks us to tithe or give 10% of the annual blessing He has provided. November 13 was designated as Stewardship Sunday. You should have received a packet in the mail from Ebenezer that included an Estimate of Giving card and detailed information about how you can help Ebenezer return to a financially stable position.

If you did not receive a packet, it's not too late to make your stewardship commitment for 2023. Estimate of Giving Cards are available at the Connection Desk. A digital version is also available at ebenezerumc.org/treasures.

ADULT MINISTRIES

KidzRock Sunday School students are learning how to be followers of Jesus, with a different discipleship focus each month.


KIDZ R DISCIPLES!

COLD WEATHER SHELTER

This winter, Micah Ministries and a cohort of local churches will once again come together to host unhoused neighbors at the Cold Weather Shelter. The shelter is open nightly from mid-November through mid-March based on weather guidelines. It provides a safe place for homeless men and women who would otherwise be sleeping outside in freezing temperatures.

Clients are bused from Micah Ministries in Fredericksburg to the shelter, which is located at 750 Kings Highway in Stafford. The 3,000 square foot facility offers separate dorms for men and women, a handicapped sleeping space, three bathrooms, a small kitchen, and a gathering/intake area.



That's where you come in! Ebenezer will provide 4-5 adult volunteers on the first two Saturdays of each month from 5:00-8:00 PM. Volunteers help everyone get checked in for the evening by greeting clients, setting up cots, and providing light snacks and fellowship. It is a tangible way to serve those in need in your community and make meaningful connections over time.
