A NOTE FROM PASTOR JEFF

Early this spring, my family started planting seeds for our backyard garden in our basement. Every few days, I went down to check the timer on the grow light, make sure the plants had enough water, and check the status of the seedlings. By mid-March, the plants had outgrown their sprouting cells and were ready to be transplanted outside. Each night for months, I covered them to protect them from the cold. By the middle of May, I was already harvesting green beans and carrots. The tomatoes and peppers took a little longer to take off but once they did, they never stopped.

I thought I had planted "determinate" tomatoes, which means they only grow to a certain height and only produce a certain amount of fruit. However, I mistakenly planted an "indeterminate" tomato variety, which means they will continue to grow and grow and grow, producing an exorbitant amount of fruit. Thus far, we have harvested over 50 pounds of tomatoes in a small 4-foot by 6-foot section, with more still to come. As for the peppers, what we thought were run-of-the-mill bell peppers turned out to be a much-sought-after variety - Chocolate Bell Peppers. Make no mistake, they do not taste like chocolate. but they are sweeter and are even brown in color. My family and I have been feasting on fresh veggies all summer.

Growing the garden wasn't easy. It took daily care, and we didn't necessarily harvest exactly what we thought we had planted, but the fruits of our labor have been bountiful. Our spiritual lives are much the same. If we want to grow, we need to plant seeds, cultivate good spiritual habits, and share our harvest with others. Sometimes we will produce an abundance of fruit or even Chocolate Bell Peppers.

This fall, there are so many opportunities to plant spiritual seeds, through which the people of Ebenezer can grow in faith and

relationship with God and neighbors. From our Visitation Team to GriefShare to Small Groups to Disciple Bible Studies to our second annual Pumpkin Patch and Fall Festival, where is God calling you to plant, grow, and bear fruit this fall with Ebenezer?

I cannot wait to see what God is up to in this next season! I'm looking forward to growing with and alongside you.

God loves us too much to leave us where we are. This holds true not only in the valleys but also in the mountaintop experiences of life. God consistently calls us into deeper waters, challenging us to think beyond our capabilities and never be content with the status

During the Global Leadership Summit, Erwin McManus stated that each one of us has genius within us, and often the only thing keeping that genius from coming out is our own fear or perceived limitations. This is something that I have seen play out in numerous conversations and at various points in my own life. Fear that I may fail as I try to accomplish something spectacular prevents me from engaging.

Genesis teaches that the very God who created everything from nothing created us in His image, then breathed the breath of life into each of His children. A NOTE FROM PASTOR DONOVAN


There, there. All is well, my friends.



ANNUAL CONFERENCE UPDATE

The 2023 Virginia Annual Conference was held June 15-17 in Roanoke, Va. Andy and Linda Garlington attended as Ebenezer's approved to appoint a work group to analyze and give new lay representatives and provided these highlights. Read their full report at ebenezerumc.org/denomination-news.

The conference theme was based on Acts 1:8b. The VAUMC Delegation provided an overview of the Christmas Covenant, a proposal for regionalization and contextualization as a way forward for the UMC. If a regionalization plan passes at General Conference 2024, Annual Conferences will vote to ratify resultant constitutional amendments. The VAUMC Delegation unanimously supports the Christmas Covenant as the wisest and most hopeful way forward for the UMC, and the Annual Conference members voted to affirm their endorsement in advance of the 2024 General Conference. A total of 59 new faith communities have been planted in the conference since 2008. Of these, more than 70% remain active. This year, 13 churches were closed. Since October 2022, 107 churches have disaffiliated under Paragraph 2553, of which 70 have completed the legal closing process. The remaining 37 churches will be completed in the next several weeks. The final called session to consider disaffiliating churches under Paragraph 2553 in the Virginia Conference will be October 7. The conference projects that by year end, the Virginia Conference will comprise 900 churches with 268,000 members. During the Equitable Compensation report, there was discussion and a motion was made and approved to increase the minimum salary for full-time clergy in each category by \$1,000 for 2024. A motion was also made and recommendations on housing allowances.

The conference treasurer reported that 2022 apportionment receipts were \$23,398,006, a 3.75% increase from 2021. Secondmile benevolences increased \$55,000 from 2021. The 2024 budget was approved for \$27,362,000, a 1.33% reduction from

A Service of Remembrance was held for 75 conference clergy and laity who died since the last Annual Conference. A Retirement Service was held for 58 clergy members, with a combined total of 1,210 years of service. We also held a Service for the Ordering of Ministry, where our own Anji Budzynski became a licensed local pastor! She is serving the congregation at Andrew Chapel UMC here in Stafford.

Ebenezer will continue to share updates as United Methodists worldwide prepare for the 2024 General Conference to be held April 23-May 3. We have tentatively scheduled an evening session for May 20 entitled "What Just Happened" to review and unpack the results of the General Conference. FINANCE UPDATE

It is now August, more than halfway through the year. The financial results through June were reviewed at our July meeting. The good news is expenses are currently lower than what we planned; however, we also learned that offerings are below what we expected and that causes us concern.


The results of a midyear forecast completed by the church staff also show that while spending will be less than planned, offerings are also projected to be less than budgeted. The church is now planning for a deficit of about \$522,000, which is 5% more than originally thought (see graph below).

The church has planned for budget deficits since 2018, and the extraordinary circumstances of COVID and federal funding programs have both negatively and positively impacted our bottom line. As we sought to faithfully navigate the unpredicted challenges, we were hesitant to make major changes. COVID impacted many churches with a reduction in pre-COVID engagement and giving. We have felt that impact as well. Knowing that we have investment income as an added resource (though insufficient to cover all deficit balances), our leadership has intentionally approved budgets with an expected deficit to provide time to reassess priorities and

develop a measured approach. We are now some distance from the height of COVID and discern the time is now to reduce the projected deficit.

There are two ways to eliminate the deficit: increasing giving and reducing spending. We need to do both over the next several years to produce a balanced budget. Please prayerfully consider increasing your giving to help move us toward that goal. May peace be with you.

Our Strategic Planning Team has been working hard to delve into our core values, dreams, and community context. 
