Beautiful and Beloved People of Ebenezer,

"And what do you want for Christmas?" That is often the question floating through the air starting a week before Thanksgiving. Growing up, I enjoyed being asked that question, because I would hopefully get all the things on my wish list. Now I realize that question has trained us to have unreasonably high expectations for this time of year.

Unfortunately, the holidays rarely deliver all the happiness and love that we've been led to expect. There are a multitude of advertising campaigns trying to sell a lot of merchandise with images of romantic couples and laughing families, but they often mock the heartache felt by so many people at this time of year – perhaps even by some of you.

So, what should we do? Shove our expectations deep down like cold hands in the pockets of a winter coat? Put our hopes on long-term layaway? Pretend we don't really care? Here's a suggestion: Instead of trying to downplay our expectations, why not let our highest desires be ignited by this Advent season? That soaring hope is echoed in one of Charles Wesley's great hymns: "Come, Thou long-expected Jesus" (UMH 196)

"Come, Thou long-expected Jesus, Born to set Thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; Let us find our rest in Thee. Israel's Strength and Consolation, Hope of all the earth Thou art; Dear Desire of every nation, Joy of every longing heart."

No holiday can deliver everything we long for, but we will find our deepest longings fulfilled in Christ Himself. When Simeon saw Jesus, he praised God saying: "My eyes have seen Your salvation, which You have prepared in the sight of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to Your people Israel." (Luke 2:30-32) This Christmas, watch your expectations and see them wonderfully fulfilled in Jesus.

At this time of year, we may find ourselves overcommitted and overwhelmed. Work, social, school, and even spiritual commitments fill our calendars. If you find yourself here, I would like to offer two words that can transform your life: solitude and silence.

Solitude and silence appear counter to what we need at this time of year, but our heavenly Father calls us into these practices. Jesus exemplified this after his baptism. He was led by the Spirit to the wilderness where he spent 40 days in solitude preparing for the good work he was about to do. Jesus also instructed his disciples to seek solitude during the amazing ministry they were undertaking (Mark 6:31-32).

Solitude and silence help us identify what is imperative versus merely important. These practices help us experience God on His terms, and to feel His presence and guidance. As we lessen ourselves, He becomes greater within us. This is a true gift from God. Theologian Richard Foster states, "The purpose of silence and solitude is to be able to see and hear. The Spirit speaks to us when our heart is still and silent before the Lord – not when we're rushing about and doing our own thing in our own way."

German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer offers a helpful perspective: "We are silent at the beginning of the day because God should have the first word, and we are silent before going to sleep because the last word also belongs to God...Silence is nothing else but waiting for God's Word." As part of the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church, we are the spirit-filled, resilient, connected, missional, faithful, diverse, deeply rooted, committed, disciple-making, Jesus-seeking, generous, justice-seeking, world-changing people of God called The United Methodist Church. After disaffiliations utilizing Paragraph 2553, the Virginia Conference now has 875 churches, 261,484 members, and 2,230 clergy. Domestic and international mission in the Virginia Conference reaches over 1,400,000 people. A total of 227 churches disaffiliated in Virginia; the combined membership of these churches was 31,299 people. This represents 10.58% of the total membership of the United Methodist churches in Virginia. For more information, please go to the conference website at vaumc.org.

#### **COLD WEATHER SHELTER**

As it gets colder outside, let's provide a warm welcome for our neighbors at Micah Ministries' Cold Weather Shelter. With help from local churches, the shelter is open nightly through mid-March based on weather guidelines. It offers a safe place for those who would otherwise be sleeping outside in freezing temperatures.

Clients are bused from Micah Ministries in Fredericksburg to the shelter, which is located at 750 Kings Highway in Stafford. The 3,000-square-foot facility offers separate dorms for men and women, a handicapped sleeping space, three bathrooms, a small kitchen, and a gathering/intake area.



That's where we come in! Beginning in December, Ebenezer will provide a small team of adult volunteers on the first two Saturdays of each month from 5:30-8:00 PM. Volunteers help everyone greet clients, set up cots, and provide light snacks and fellowship. It's a tangible way to serve those in need in our community at a critical time of year. On behalf of Helping Children Worldwide (HCW), eight Ebenezer missioners traveled to Bo. Sierra Leone October 16-30. This was the first visit for most of us, but for two team members, it was a trip back to a place that had touched their hearts. Much has changed since the last Ebenezer team traveled to Bo almost five years ago. HCW continues to strengthen the bonds of community and family by transforming what was once an orphanage into a hub of trained counselors and family advocates serving impoverished families and children throughout the region. We immersed ourselves in the daily work of reaching out to vulnerable communities with compassion and hope as we listened to stories, celebrated births, taught basic hygiene and prenatal care practices, and prayed for their health and well-being. We were able to live into the harsh daily schedules of those who must travel many miles for food



and basic necessities by coming alongside HCW to deliver assistance and a caring smile to many of the families in the Family Empowerment Advocacy program. We will continue to tell our stories during Sunday worship services, small group presentations, and during our annual efforts to support our international mission partners. The team is grateful for all the support our congregation has given us over the year to make this trip possible. 
