The Watchmaker's Daughter: the true story of World War II heroine Corrie ten Boom

by Larry Loftis

If you have read *The Hiding Place*, you will love this biography of Corrie ten Boom, a Dutch watchmaker who saved the lives of hundreds of Jews during WWII—at the cost of losing her family and being sent to a concentration camp, only to survive, forgive her captors, and live the rest of her life as a Christian missionary.

<u>Sent: how one ordinary family traded the American Dream for God's greater purpose</u> by Hilary Alan

During their comfortable, successful all-American lives that included active church involvement, the Alans realized they rarely heard from God. Read the story of how ordinary Christians, who accepted Jesus' command to "follow me" at face value, found that doing so changed everything. For you, the particulars will be completely different, but no less significant. Prepare to be challenged!

What They Meant for Evil: how a lost girl of Sudan found healing, peace and purpose in the midst of suffering By Rebecca Deng

Follow the life of one of the first unaccompanied refugee children to enter the United States from South Sudan as Rebecca recounts her unimaginable journey as a Lost Girl. Her story is a lyrical, captivating portrait of a child hurled into wartime, and how through divine intervention, she came to America and found a new life full of joy, hope, and redemption.
