Big Idea: We are created to Praise God, commanded to praise God, and blessed when we praise God!

Where the Lord should be praised (v. 1)

Praise the Lord. Praise God in His sanctuary; praise Him in His mighty heavens. 1 Cor 6:19; 2 Cor 6:16-17; Gen 1:8

Why the Lord should be praised (v. 2)

Praise Him for His acts of power; praise Him for His surpassing greatness. Lev 23: Rev 4:11

How the Lord should be praised (v. 3-5)

Praise Him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise Him with the harp and lyre, praise Him with tambourine and dancing, praise Him with the strings and flute, praise Him with the clash of cymbals, praise Him with resounding cymbals.

Ex 15:20-21; 2 Sam 6:14-15

Enter into God's presence—into each day—with the proper posture of humble reverence. (Psalm 95:6)

Who should praise the Lord (v. 6)

Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord.

When the Lord should be praised

We should praise Him in the good times. And praise Him in the bad times.

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! (Phil 4:4)



How the Lord should be praised


