"Feasting Together"

1 Corinthians 11:20-34 New International Version

²⁰ So then, when you come together, it is not the Lord's Supper you eat, ²¹ for when you are eating, some of you go ahead with your own private suppers. As a result, one person remains hungry & another gets drunk. ²² Don't you have homes to eat & drink in? Or do you despise the church of God by humiliating those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? Certainly not in this matter!

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴ & when he had given thanks, he broke it & said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For whenever you eat this bread & drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

27 So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body & blood of the Lord. 28 Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread & drink from the cup. 29 For those who eat & drink without discerning the body of Christ eat & drink judgment on themselves. ³⁰ That is why many among you are weak & sick, & a number of you have fallen asleep. ³¹ But if we were more discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment. ³² Nevertheless, when we are judged in this way by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be finally condemned with the world.

³³ So then, my brothers & sisters, when you gather to eat, you should all eat together.
³⁴ Anyone who is hungry should eat something at home, so that when you

meet together it may not result in judgment. & when I come I will give further directions.
