# LEVITICUS

SERMON TITLE | And He Called...  
SERMON TEXT | Leviticus 1:1-2

## 1. The Lord Called and Spoke: God Reveals (1:1)

- God summons Moses.
- God's speaking indicates that He wants them to know how to relate to Him.
- Exodus 19:3
- Moses' role as mediator
- Hebrews 1:1-3; Matthew 17:5

## 2. From the Tent of Meeting: God Dwells (1:1)

- Leviticus is a continuation of Exodus.
- God's glory dwelling in the tent of meeting (Exodus 40:34; Psalm 26:8; Psalm 27:4)
- God desires to dwell with His people. (Exodus 25:22)
- From beginning to end, the Bible reveals God's desire to dwell with His people. (John 1:14; 1 Corinthians 3:6; Revelation 21:1-5)

## 3. You Will Bring: God Instructs (1:2)

- The problem: *from*
- Leviticus is the way for God to dwell among His people. (Leviticus 1:1--Numbers 1:1)
- "When": God's expectation
- "All of you": God's invitation
- Geoffrey Harper states, "Leviticus 1:2, an invitation is extended to anyone made in the image of God to draw near and offer his or her gift. Yet, at the same time, it is not a free-for-all. Yahweh gives strict instructions about what and how gifts are to be given."

### THE GOSPEL IS...

**God.** God is the Creator & King of all things. He is perfectly holy, worthy of all worship and will punish sin. (Genesis 1:1, 1 John 1:5, Revelation 4:11, Romans 2:5-8)

**Man.** All people, though created good, have become sinful by nature. From birth, all people are alienated from God, hostile to God (we chose to reject God's rule and rule our own lives) and subject to the wrath of God. (Genesis 1:26-28, Psalm 51:5, Romans 3:23, Ephesians 2:1-3)

**Christ.** Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully man, is the true King. He lived a sinless life, died on the Cross to bear God's wrath in the place of all who would believe in Him, and rose from the grave in order to give His people eternal life. (John 1:1, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 7:26, Romans 3:21-26, 2 Corinthians 5:21, 1 Corinthians 15:20-22)

**Response.** Because He is King, God commands everyone everywhere to repent of their sins, trust in Christ as the only King in order to be saved and live as though He is your King. (Mark 1:15, Acts 20:21, Romans 10:9-10)
