KNOW IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT

SERMON TITLE | The Gospel: Know It, Live It, Share It
SERMON TEXT | Colossians 1:21-23

DATE | January 4, 2026

1. What Did I Do? (1:21)

- Christ's honor and accolades (vv. 15-20).
- The change from "and he" to "and you."
- Describing our condition prior to Christ. (Ephesians 2:13; Ephesians 5:8; Titus 3:3; 1 Peter 2:10)
- Descriptions of our condition prior to Christ: Alienated (Ephesians 4:18), Enmity/Hostile in Mind (Romans 1:21; Romans 8:7-8), Doing Evil Deeds (Matthew 7:17-18)

2. What Did He Do? (1:22)

- "But now" (v. 22)
- The opposite of alienation: Reconciliation (Colossians 1:20; Romans 5:10; Ephesians 2:14-16)
- The language of Leviticus: present, holy, blameless (Leviticus 1:3; 1 Corinthians 1:8; Romans 8:1)
- Our condition after God reconciles us through Christ's atoning death.

3. What Must I Do? (1:23)

- "If indeed..." Self-examination. (Colossians 2:6; 2 Corinthians 13:5)
- We are reconciled to God by Christ through faith.
- There is no other way to be reconciled to God.
- "continue in the faith": Remaining. Enduring faith. Perseverance. (1 Corinthians 15:1-2; Hebrews 3:6; Hebrews 3:14; 1 John 2:19)
- Stable and Steadfast (Colossians 2:7; Matthew 7:24-27)
- Not shifting from the hope of the gospel (Matthew 13:20-22)

Application

Why did Christ have to die? (vs. 21) We are sinners.

What did Christ's death do? (v. 22) Reconcile us to God.

How do I receive the benefits of Christ's death? (v. 23) Through enduring faith in Christ.

Therefore...Know it, Live it, Share it

THE GOSPEL IS...

God. God is the Creator & King of all things. He is perfectly holy, worthy of all worship and will punish sin. (Genesis 1:1, 1 John 1:5, Revelation 4:11, Romans 2:5-8)

Man. All people, though created good, have become sinful by nature. From birth, all people are alienated from God, hostile to God (we chose to reject God's rule and rule our own lives) and subject to the wrath of God. (Genesis 1:26-28, Psalm 51:5, Romans 3:23, Ephesians 2:1-3)

Christ. Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully man, is the true King. He lived a sinless life, died on the Cross to bear God's wrath in the place of all who would believe in Him, and rose from the grave in order to give His people eternal life. (John 1:1, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 7:26, Romans 3:21-26, 2 Corinthians 5:21, 1 Corinthians 15:20-22)

Response. Because He is King, God commands everyone everywhere to repent of their sins, trust in Christ as the only King in order to be saved and live as though He is your King. (Mark 1:15, Acts 20:21, Romans 10:9-10)
