SERMON TITLE | The Superior Sitting Son
SERMON TEXT | Hebrews 1:3b-4

1. He Made Purification

- Why is purification needed? (Matthew 5:8; Revelation 21:27; Hebrews 9:22)
- Who is the one who makes purification? (1 John 1:7; Titus 2:14)
- What are the effects of purification? (Hebrews 9:14)
- 2 Corinthians 7:1; James 4:8; 1 John 3:3

2. He Sat Down

- What does Jesus do after making purification? He sat down. (Hebrews 8:1; Hebrews 10:12; Hebrews 12:2)
- Why does Jesus sit down? (John 19:30)
- Where does Jesus sit down? (Psalm 110:1; Revelation 3:21; 1 Peter 3:22; Ephesians 1:20-22)

3. He Is Superior

- The theme of superiority in the book of Hebrews. (7:22; 8:6; 9:23)
- Angels are glorious, but are not worthy of worship. (Revelation 19:10)
- Jesus is the superior revelation.
- Jesus is superior because of his NAME. (Acts 4:12; Ephesians 1:21; Philippians 2:9-10)

THE GOSPEL IS...

God. God is the Creator & King of all things. He is perfectly holy, worthy of all worship and will punish sin. (Genesis 1:1, 1 John 1:5, Revelation 4:11, Romans 2:5-8)

Man. All people, though created good, have become sinful by nature. From birth, all people are alienated from God, hostile to God (we chose to reject God's rule and rule our own lives) and subject to the wrath of God. (Genesis 1:26-28, Psalm 51:5, Romans 3:23, Ephesians 2:1-3)

Christ. Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully man, is the true King. He lived a sinless life, died on the Cross to bear God's wrath in the place of all who would believe in Him, and rose from the grave in order to give His people eternal life. (John 1:1, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 7:26, Romans 3:21-26, 2 Corinthians 5:21, 1 Corinthians 15:20-22)

Response. Because He is King, God commands everyone everywhere to repent of their sins, trust in Christ as the only King in order to be saved and live as though He is your King. (Mark 1:15, Acts 20:21, Romans 10:9-10)
