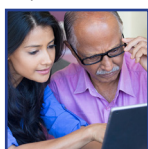

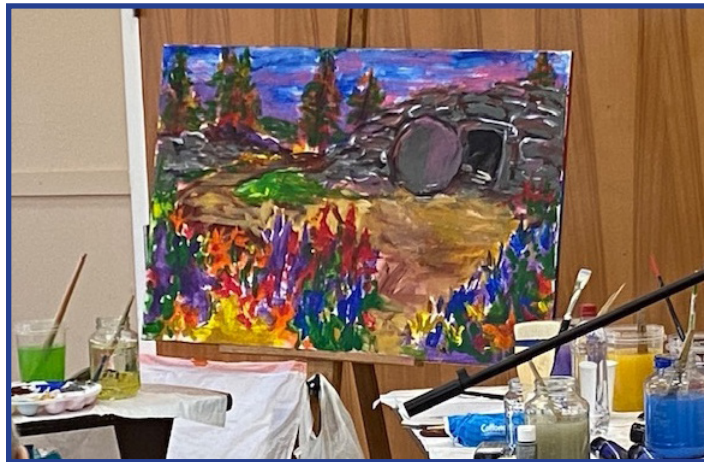

and contemporary theologians to deepen our appreciation for the divine mystery woven into the fabric of Creation.

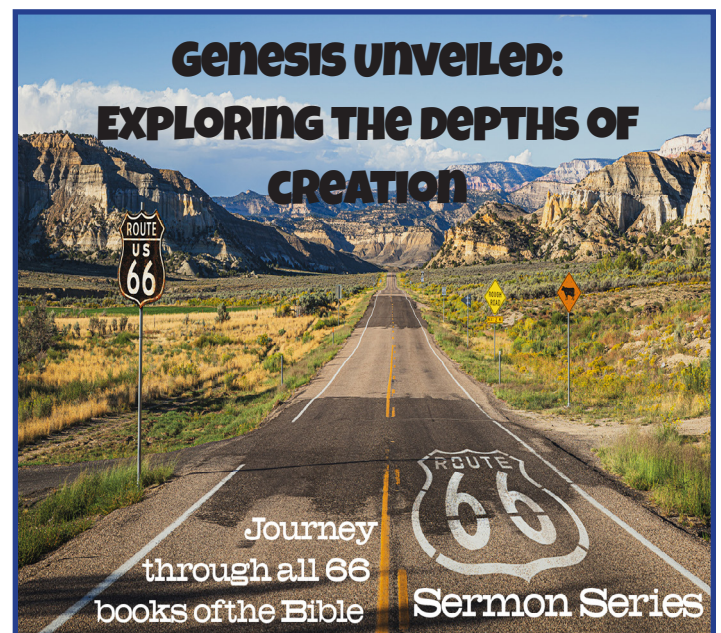

The Lake of the Woods Church uses its resources to care for and support the sick, the homeless, young families, youth, children, the elderly, and the unemployed. As we know, this cannot be accomplished without help. The Community Outreach Ministry continually needs volunteers to help and offer security to our neighbors in need, regardless of the cause. As Christians, God asks us to have a warm, loving heart to help our neighbors. Treat them as we would like to be treated.

We enthusiastically support and embrace the **LOWC 50th Jubilee** and our **TEAM** effort within our Ministries. Our Ministry Stewards spend time helping those in need while asking for volunteers to support the efforts to help your community. Listed below are our various Ministries and the Stewards that oversee their areas of helping our community.

FEEDING MINISTRY-BRISBEN CENTER

The Brisben Center is a homeless shelter that houses homeless families and single homeless residents until they can re-enter our neighborhoods. This Ministry cooks and serves two lunches per month (Brisben residents clean up), serving approximately 120 monthly meals. We also deliver clothing donated to the residents by the Lake of the Woods Churchgoers, plus a particular list is posted each month on the bulletin board of items the Brisben Center needs other than cooked meals. Volunteers are always needed for this vital Ministry.

RISE (RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN SPECIAL EDUCATION)

R.I.S.E. provides individuals with special needs and a Church based venue for fellowship, including prayer and Bible study. Every Thursday, the RISE group meets for dinner and an evening of wholesome activities (games), worship songs, praise, and prayers for their community and family.

Their Bible study stresses the importance of RISE as a family through the Holy Spirit's activity in and amongst them as they grow into a lifelong relationship with God and each other. The RISE family is present every Sunday morning during our 9:45 am service. We welcome their presence and thank each RISE friend who carries the cross each Sunday as an integral part of our LOWC traditional service opening and closing procession.

LIVING WATER COMMUNITY CLINIC

The clinic provides primary medical, dental, emotional, and spiritual care to the underinsured at no cost for eligible adults in the VA counties of Orange and Culpeper. MECHANICS MINISTRY

Starting in 2023, this Ministry was formed to assist neighbors in keeping their primary means of transportation working safely. From March through October, on a given Saturday, volunteers perform minor mechanical and routine maintenance on vehicles by top auto mechanics certified to do this work at no labor cost. HOME HELPS

This Ministry assists our neighbors throughout the LOW community who need repairs, maintenance on their homes, and yard work on their properties. This program exists to help those needy neighbors who find certain aspects of home maintenance have become unaffordable. During 2023, Home Help served over 74 homeowners with debris removal, emergency and routine home repairs, painting, and tree and bush trimming. I'm pleased to write this Ministry had more than 160 volunteers helping to complete the various projects by volunteer adults, teens, and Boy Scouts. Additionally, this Ministry visited homeowners to offer spiritual care. April 19 and 20 are the dates for our Spring Home Helps Event. Mission Partner of the month - Beauty for Ashes

Restoring Hope

Beauty for Ashes is a women's and children's home in Fredericksburg. It provides a 9-12 month residential program where both mother and child stay together as the mother is restored from their life-controlling situation.

It was founded by *Mike and Cindy Zello, Founders of Adult and Teen Challenge of Virginia*, to minister to women who avoided traditional available support because it meant being separated from their children.

The home provides a Christian faith-based curriculum that includes life skills training, continuing education for the mothers, grade school education for the children, and healthcare and childcare. The goal is to equip the family to transition to independent living successfully.

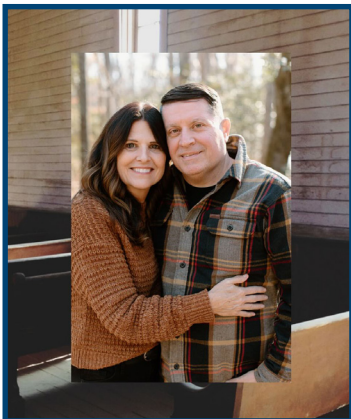
It recognizes that each resident is unique, and the program is tailored to meet their individual needs. It is not a one-size-fits-all program and meets each individual where they are. They believe this is one of their keys to success. Over the past eight years the home has been open, they have helped over 70 families including 14 pregnant women. Many of these families have transitioned into the local area.

The property for the home was acquired in 2013, dedicated in 2015, and opened in 2016. LOW Church has been a supporter of the home since its inception. Currently, eight church members are family sponsors, and a group of men regularly mow the 20 acres of grass on the property. They are always looking for additional volunteers and you can go to the church website, lowchurch.org, if you are interested.

Easter Egg Hunt - crafting resurrection stories

The annual Easter Egg Hunt was held on Sunday, March 24, on a clear, crisp spring day. The event started with a creative way to introduce the children to the creation and resurrection story through a craft project creating Resurrection Eggs. It had all the elements kids love: slime to play with, magical changing colors, and a great story. I am unsure who had more fun, the teens and adults helping or the kids!

Using shaving cream, school white glue, water, and food coloring, they told the kids the story of Adam and Eve while having the kids create a white slime. FOSTER CARE MINISTRY

November 2023, at The Lake of the Woods Church annual meeting, the congregation approved the re-opening of The Lake of the Woods Outreach Center. On March 1, 2024, the Trustees signed and entered into a one-year lease of a facility on Route 20, Locust Grove, directly beside the Living Water Community Clinic. The Center will be a multi-purpose facility under the Elder of Community Outreach.

Currently, we are in the process of obtaining bids for the build-out area that will house and perform many of the multi-purpose duties that our main LOWC might not be able to provide in the future. As we get closer to making this decision and awarding the bid, we will keep you informed.

Please pray for our Community Outreach Ministry. God's task is forever. We can never return enough thanks for God's never-ending and absolute love. Frankly, we need continued support to shape our community towards spreading The Lake of The Woods Church exposure to all surrounding communities.

Thrive Beyond 55 - Health, safety and crime prevention conference



The LOW Church is excited to host, for the second year, the Thrive Beyond 55 Health, Safety, and Crime Prevention Conference. What is this conference about? According to Deputy Ron Kesner, TRIAD Coordinator, Orange County Sheriff's Office, the conference provides information to help Seniors stay safe and secure. Does it mean you need to be 55 years or older to attend? Absolutely not. If you are a current caregiver or a near future caregiver of a senior living in the area or want to learn about senior living safety, you are welcome to attend.

This year, the conference will open with the presentation of colors by the Orange County High School Junior ROTC color guard. There are individual presentations related to senior services and safety. Barry Moor, President and CEO of the Better Business Bureau in Richmond is scheduled to present on what Better Business Bureau Certification means to both consumers and businesses. Deputy Kesner, Orange

County Sheriff's Office, will present on senior safety with an emphasis on how not to become a victim. His talk will include information on current scams being investigated today in the Orange County area and how to be aware and avoid them.

In addition to speakers, there will be 15 – 20 vendors that offer services to the senior populations in Orange County. They will have displays and representatives present where you can learn about their offerings and ask questions.

A light breakfast, refreshments, and lunch will be provided, as well as door prizes throughout the event. The conference is on Tuesday, April 16, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., free of charge.
