TEEN MISSIONARIES IN ACTION

This summer, a group of fifteen missionaries from our church—four adults and eleven teens—took a nine-day trip to Camp Good News Maine, a Christian camp. After a multi-mode journey, we joined over eighty staff members to serve more than one hundred campers from various northeastern states.

Life at camp was rustic, with our team staying in simple cabins alongside counselors who managed eight to ten campers each. Days were packed with activities like swimming, canoeing, arts and crafts, and chapel sessions—providing opportunities to share the gospel and grow in faith.

One teen, June Mahnel, expressed, "Maine was a good experience because we learned how to teach kids the gospel while learning the gospel and growing closer to each other and God." This summed up the experience, where we not only impacted the campers' lives but also deepened our own faith.

Philippians 4:8 became our guiding verse, urging us to focus on what is true, noble, and praiseworthy as we embraced the joy of service and community at camp.



From our Board of Elders

Jubilee Enhancements: Building a More Welcoming, Accessible, and Safe Church Community

Our mission is both straightforward and impactful: to transform our church into a place that is welcoming, accessible, and safe for everyone who comes through our doors.

First, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for the extraordinary generosity of our congregation. From the outset, we have pledged to pursue only those initiatives that align with the resources God provides, and we have been steadfast in this commitment every step of the way. Thank you for your faithfulness.

One common question that arises is, "Have we completed the Jubilee Enhancements?" The short answer is partially. We have made significant progress in enhancing accessibility. The elevator and ramp are now fully operational, the entry doors are equipped with power operation, and we have four accessible restrooms—two near the Gathering Place and two in the Discovery Zone. However, a few important tasks remain: installing grab bars where necessary, adding motion-sensor lighting in all restrooms, and assessing interior doors for improved ease of use.

In terms of safety, we are thrilled with the strides made but recognize there is more work ahead. We have applied for a FEMA grant aimed at expanding and upgrading our security system. Our vision includes an increased number and quality of cameras, a revamped control room, integration of monitoring and door systems, connection of all exterior cameras to a central network, enhanced access for LOW Association security viewing, improved exterior lighting, and fortified internal computer security. Should the grant be denied, we remain dedicated to pursuing this mission as resources allow—ensuring safety continues to be our utmost priority. We will provide more updates in the September issue.

We've also made significant strides in hospitality. We now offer additional handicap parking spaces with improved signage. Our congregation has united for two successful church-wide cleanup days, and the Youth area has been revitalized with fresh paint in the hallways. The

Board of Elders is currently prioritizing further projects to be completed in the coming year, which we plan to discuss in the October CrossCurrents.

As we work diligently to enhance our church facility to better serve everyone who enters, your continued support and prayers empower us in this endeavor. Thank you for being an integral part of this journey.






Scouting

"Church Membership Is a Gift to Be Treasured"


CHAPTER 6 - Rev. Jordan Medas, Sr. Associate Pastor

Editor's Note: Each month one of the Church's Pastors will write a commentary on a chapter from I AM a Church Member by Thom S. Rainer.

When I reflect on what it means to be a member of the body of Christ, both from Scripture and from I Am a Church Member, I am reminded how often we treat church membership like a club we join, a

duty we must fulfill, or even wonder why it matters. Afterall, I'm a Christian, I'm a part of the universal church, why do I need to be a "member" of a local church?

Scripture paints a far more beautiful picture. Church membership is not a checklist of responsibilities, a transactional relationship, or a burden. It is a gift. A gift of grace, flowing from the same heart that gave us salvation.



In Chapter Six of *I Am a Church Member*, Thom Rainer reminds us that we are to treasure our church membership as a privilege, not take it for granted as an obligation. He explains that many Christians slip into the mindset that membership is a legalistic requirement. But biblically, it's a commitment to each other within the local body of Christ and it's an opportunity to serve and to give, not a demand to do so. When we see church through this lens, our hearts shift from consumer to contributor, from obligation to a desire to serve.

Much like salvation itself, church membership is undeserved. None of us earns our place in the family of God. We are welcomed in by grace. And just as we live out our faith with gratitude for salvation, we are also called to live out our membership in the church, both local and universal, as God's chosen people.

In other words, as Rainer says, church is something to be treasured, not just attended. Membership isn't about privileges; it's about purpose. When we gather, serve, give, pray, and worship together, we are embodying what it means to belong to something eternal, the people of God, called by His name, set apart for His mission.

This truth affects not just our Sunday mornings, but our whole lives. We model this for our families, our children, and the community. We teach them that the church is not something we attend, but something we are, a family to which we belong. As we celebrate and serve in our local church, we are participating in the much larger work of the universal Church across time and place.

So I invite you to reflect: Do you treasure your church membership as a gift? Are you living into that gift with gratitude, joy, and sacrificial love?

Let's not take membership for granted. Let's celebrate it and live it out.

Good News Camp - Navajo Nation

"And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" — Romans 10:15 (NIV)

As I write this from New Mexico, my heart is full as our team engages in outreach with the Navajo children at the Southwest Indian Ministries camp, nestled 15 miles west of Gallup, NM. Our group of 25 arrived on Sunday, July 27, and we're set to return on Sunday, August 3.

Throughout our week here, we're excited to provide a range of activities that engage and uplift the children—sports, Bible studies, crafts, and shared meals, along with evening chapel services to foster spiritual growth. Additionally, four dedicated members of our team are contributing to the camp's infrastructure by installing metal siding on one end of the chapel and constructing a shed for our equipment storage.

"Therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." — Matthew 9:38 (NRSV)

In the months leading up to this mission, we prepared with hopeful anticipation, albeit with some uncertainty about whether any children would join us. We placed our faith in God, understanding that our responsibility was to step forward in obedience while trusting Him with the outcomes. The joy we felt on Monday morning when eight children arrived was indescribable. Though that number may seem modest, it was a tangible response to our prayers. We earnestly sought God to bring the children, and He did. With hearts full of gratitude, we recognize this as a testament to our faith in the Lord of the harvest.

As we look ahead, our church has been committed to serving the Navajo people since 2017, and this camp offers the best facilities we've ever experienced. It's clear that God is blessing this important work. We are fervently praying for a long-term relationship with the local Navajo churches and this camp, hoping to deepen our connection in meaningful ways. We invite you to join us in prayer as we seek God's guidance for what the future holds.

Mission Partner of the Month: India National Inland Mission (INIM)

"Bringing souls to Christ, Teaching souls in Christ, Sending souls for Christ" since 1964

(INIM), is headquartered in New Delhi, India, with outreach concentrated in the largely unevangelized northern states of India. INIM includes Grace Bible College to train native evangelists who go out into North India and establish churches. The organization also maintains a children's home for orphans.

I first met the Pillai family when Paul and Annie came to our church in Fairfax in mid-1980. After that visit, a small group formed an India Prayer group, which met monthly for 10 years to pray for INIM and India. Several years after meeting the Pillais, I stayed with them in New Delhi and met AJ, our representative here in VA, when he was a young boy. Sadly, both his parents have gone home to be with Jesus, but the ministry has continued. All AJ's siblings are in ministry, spreading the word of God internationally. INIM is a powerful ministry that serves over 1000 orphans and a large number of students attending Grace Bible College, teaching them how to evangelize and establish home churches. INIM continues to grow in the face of Muslim and Hindu opposition. INIM seeks prayers for safety, continued success of Grace Bible, a large harvest of souls, and success with home churches. Additionally, prayer is needed for the 1000 + orphans with housing and schooling. I am proud to say that 60% of the orphans after high school want to attend Grace Bible and establish their own home church.
