But this series will be more than Sunday sermons; it will be an experience! Together, we will:


- Host special film showings at the Outreach Center that connect us to the themes of Exodus.

The proceeds from the Craft Bazaar go to support LOWC Youth Missions throughout the year. This year, the work of the crafters helped to support Kingdom Builders training for the youth, where teens complete a training program to learn how to spread the Gospel to Elementary age children through story-telling, songs, and games. The youth then used their training to act as leaders and teachers throughout the summer at VBS, Good News Across Sports, Camp Good News in Maine, and at Good News Camp in Navajo New Mexico. As a result of the work of the crafters and the support of Lake of the Woods Church, our youth were equipped to advance the Kingdom of God by reaching over 200 children not only in Virginia, but in Maine and New Mexico as well.

The crafters work diligently throughout the year, but the scores of supporters giving of their time, skills, and donations to help them make a big difference. Because of this steadfast support, they have continued spearheading this fundraiser for nearly twenty years. So they wanted to say...... Thanks! God Bless! And see you at the Bazaar!







A Budget Snapshot from the Elders

As the air turns crisp and the leaves begin to fall, we're reminded that a new season is upon us. And as I sit down to write this, I find myself reflecting on the past few weeks—continually amazed by your generosity. Your time, your talent, and your financial support make ministry happen every single day. Thank you.

We'd like to give you a glimpse into our church's budget—not to overwhelm you with numbers, but to help you understand why we're asking for support through the Safety Fund (see the article Building a Safer, More Welcoming Church—Together), and why a capital reserve is so important.

We manage our finances through two main accounts:

General Fund – Funded by your general giving, this covers the day-to-day costs of running the church and most ministries.

Designated Fund – These are funds you've assigned to specific ministries. We honor those designations, which means that money can't be used for things like utilities or repairs.

Here's the reality: over 80% of our general fund goes toward essential expenses—utilities, staff compensation, IT systems, administrative costs, and the required 10% of general fund to missions and outreach. The remaining goes to those ministries without a designated fund. That leaves very little margin for the unexpected.

And unexpected things do happen. This year, we experienced two major roof leaks—first in the sanctuary, then in the worship center. The total cost to replace them was over \$50,000. Thankfully, because of your past generosity, we had a capital reserve—think of it as a savings account for rainy days (pun intended). Without it, we would've had to make an urgent appeal.

Looking ahead, we have 14 air conditioning units. Twelve have been replaced in recent years. We're praying the final two hold steady—but if they don't, we'll need to act quickly. Without a reserve, that means another ask.

To fully operate the church and support ministries that don't have designated funding, we need about \$100,000 per month. Right now, we're below that level. And when we're below, we can't contribute to the capital reserve.

Ideally, our capital reserve would be 10% of our general giving. That would allow us to respond to emergencies without interrupting ministry or launching special campaigns. It's not just good stewardship—it's wise preparation.

Thank you for walking with us, praying with us, and giving with such faithfulness. Together, we're building a church that reflects the heart of Christ—not only in spirit, but in stewardship, safety, and hospitality.

Ministry Partner Spotlight:

Serving Our Neighbors Through Home Helps & Mechanics Ministry

This month, we celebrate not one—but two powerful expressions of love in action. Our Ministry Partner of the Month shines on Home Helps and the Mechanics Ministry, two outreach efforts that meet real needs in our community with practical help and spiritual care.

Home Helps Workdays: October 17–18

This fall marks a special milestone—for nearly two decades, this ministry has been a steady heartbeat of compassion, offering tangible care to neighbors in need. What began as a simple idea has grown into a legacy of service, thanks in large part to the faithful leadership of David Blackistone. His steady hand, servant heart, and tireless coordination have helped shape Home Helps into a ministry that reflects the love of Christ in every rake, repair, and relationship.

Twice a year, we roll up our sleeves and step into the lives of neighbors who need a helping hand with basic home maintenance. Whether due to financial hardship or physical limitations, many homeowners simply can't keep up with yardwork or repairs. That's where we come in.

On Friday and Saturday, October 17–18, volunteers of all ages will gather at the church, form teams, and head out to serve. Most projects involve fall cleanup and exterior yardwork—no construction experience needed. Skilled volunteers are assigned to any complex tasks, so everyone can contribute confidently.

Each team is equipped with tools, assigned a morning and/or afternoon project, and treated to lunch back at the church. It's a beautiful way to connect with fellow church members

and bless homeowners with small gifts and big encouragement.

Mechanics Ministry: Repairing Cars, Restoring Hope

Launched in March 2023, the Mechanics Ministry is a dream realized—born from Eugene Slagle's vision to serve families burdened by rising costs and car troubles.

Each month from March through October, the team offers free light maintenance and minor repairs: oil changes, brake pad replacements, belt swaps, diagnostics, and more. But it's not just about fixing cars—it's about restoring dignity and sharing Christ's love.

The final service day of the season is Friday, October 11. If you or someone you know could benefit, don't wait—schedule a visit and let our team bless you with skilled hands and open hearts.

One unforgettable moment came on Easter Saturday, when volunteers repaired the vehicle of a homeless woman while others offered breakfast and prayer. She returned the next day—with two friends—to worship at our Resurrection Service. That's the power of compassion. That's the heart of outreach.

Building a Safer, More Welcoming Church—Together

An Update on Security Enhancements

We're excited to share a fresh update on our ongoing efforts to make our church a more welcoming, accessible, and safe place for everyone who walks through our doors.

Our current entry system has been difficult to manage, often causing access issues and lacking the user-friendly functionality we need. That's why, on September 29, 2025, we met with a contractor who specializes in integrated video surveillance and entry control systems designed specifically for churches. This marks the beginning of a multimonth journey to strengthen our security posture and increase situational awareness across our campus.

As we wrap up our initial upgrades focused on accessibility and hospitality, we're now increasing our attention toward safety. Within the next 30 days, we'll be transitioning to a new entry control system—saying goodbye to keypad codes and welcoming a smartphone-based access system. If you currently use a key code, we'll be reaching out to help you install the app and provide your activation code. Think of it like hotel room access or tap-to-pay technology: simple, secure, and smart.

We're also constructing a safety wall between the elevator and the Discovery Zone, with a remotely lockable door. The stairwell door to the youth area will receive the same upgrade. These two doors will be tied into the new entry control system, enhancing security for our children and youth spaces.

Our near-term goal is to equip all exterior doors

with automatic locking and unlocking capabilities, supported by upgraded control room equipment—allowing us to secure the building instantly with the push of a button.

In the event of a safety emergency, the Orange County Sheriff's Office will be electronically notified and granted live access to our camera feeds. This will help authorities respond quickly and effectively, with real-time insight into the situation.

We're aiming to have all this equipment installed and fully operational before Christmas. It's an ambitious timeline—but with God's help and your support, it's absolutely achievable.

We're also increasing the number of safety personnel, enhancing training, and expanding on-site coverage to ensure a consistent and visible safety presence.

Early next year, we plan to rapidly add 30 or more cameras to further improve our video surveillance.

Once the main church building upgrades are complete, we'll extend these improvements to the Living Water Outreach Center and the cabins—adding exterior lighting, cameras, and entry control systems.

We've had several people ask how they can support this initiative. If you'd like to help us achieve these ambitious goals, you can:

Volunteer for the safety team—women are serving as well as men. Even one hour a month makes a difference.

Give directly to the "Safety Fund". We've **recently** established a new Safety fund, so donations can be dedicated solely to that purpose. Every gift—large or small—helps us move forward with confidence and care.

Thank you for your prayers, your patience, and your partnership as we steward this space with wisdom and love. Together, we're building a church that reflects the heart of Christ—not only in spirit, but in hospitality – and safety.
