Coming Together During the Storm

The Sunday, Jan 25th, storm buried the area in snow and ice. The storm prevented in-person church services, but thanks to the Worship Team led by Sr. Associate Pastor Jordan Medas and Worship Minister Kevin Paxton, they prerecorded an uplifting worship service that was live-streamed on the Church's YouTube channel, with 259 people viewing from home.

The Church would like to thank the volunteers who braved the frigid temperatures and, after digging themselves out of the snow and ice, came to the Church to do it all over again to help clear entrances and sidewalks.

The Church remained closed until a heavy equipment contractor could get in to clear the parking lots of ice and snow. They worked for two consecutive days, breaking ice and removing snow piles from the upper and lower parking lots to enable the Church to reopen on Friday after the Sunday storm.

From our Senior Pastor: From Ashes to an Empty Tomb

Dear Church Family,

Each year, the season of Lent invites us to step away from the noise of everyday life and walk more intentionally with Jesus on His journey to the cross, and ultimately, to the empty tomb. Lent is not about gloom or obligation; it is about renewal, reflection, and returning our hearts to the One who first gave His heart for us.

We begin this holy season with **Ash Wednesday** February 18, at 7:00 pm, a sacred moment when we hear the ancient words spoken over us: “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19). These words are not meant to discourage us, but to ground us. They remind us of our deep need for God’s grace and mercy. As the prophet Joel calls, “*Return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning*” (Joel 2:12). Ash Wednesday opens the door to a season of honest repentance and hopeful restoration.

What Is Lent?

Lent is a 40-day journey (not counting Sundays) that mirrors Jesus’ time in the wilderness, where He fasted, prayed, and prepared for His ministry and sacrifice (Matthew 4:1–11). It is a season of intentional discipleship, an invitation to examine our lives, deepen our prayers, and realign our hearts with Christ. As C.S. Lewis once wrote, “Look for yourself, and you will find in the long run only hatred, loneliness, despair, rage, ruin, and decay. But look for Christ, and you will find Him, and with Him everything else thrown in.”

The Gift of Fasting and Letting Go

Many of us choose to “give something up” during Lent (not as a religious performance) but as a spiritual practice. When we fast from something that distracts, comforts, or consumes us, we create space for God to fill us instead. Jesus reminds us, “*Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God*” (Matthew 4:4). Fasting teaches us that our deepest hunger is not for what we can hold in our hands, but for the presence of God in our hearts.

The Sights and Sounds of the Season

Lent is also a season we see and feel. The colors in the sanctuary, the stoles worn by our clergy, and the paraments that adorn the altar all point us toward repentance, humility, and hope. These visual reminders quietly preach to us, calling us to slow down, to listen, and to prepare our souls for the joy of Easter morning. As the psalmist prays, “*Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law*” (Psalm 119:18).

Gathering at the Table and in Prayer

Throughout Lent, we invite you to join us on **WEDNESDAY EVENINGS** for simple fellowship and sacred worship. Our **Soup Suppers** are more than a meal, they are a reminder that Christian community is built around tables, conversations, and shared lives. The early church devoted themselves to “*the apostles’ teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers*” (Acts 2:42), and we continue that beautiful rhythm today.

At 5:00 PM, we gather for Vespers, a quiet service of prayer and Scripture, where we pause in

the middle of the week to rest in God’s presence. At 6:00 PM, we come together again for our Wednesday Night Eucharist, receiving the grace of Christ at His table, remembering His promise: “*This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me*” (Luke 22:19).

Growing in Our Faith and Witness


At 7:00 PM in the Worship Center, we will host our Lenten series on Sharing Your Faith, equipping believers of all ages to speak about Christ with humility, love, and confidence. (More details about this series can be found in this newsletter.) As the apostle Peter encourages us, “*Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have—but do this with gentleness and respect*” (1 Peter 3:15).

An Invitation to Be Changed

Lent is not just a season we observe; it is a journey we enter. God does not call us into these 40 days to remain the same, but to be transformed. “*Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me*” (Psalm 51:10). Whether through prayer, fasting, worship, study, or service, may this Lent become a holy turning point in your walk with Christ.

We invite you to walk this road with us—toward the cross, toward the empty tomb, and toward a deeper, truer, more joy-filled life in Jesus.

Meet Your Board of Trustees

Meet Your Board of Trustees and Treasurer: Stewardship, Accountability, and Faithful Oversight

As we continue introducing the leadership of our church, this month we highlight a group whose work is often behind the scenes but essential to our health, stability, and integrity: the Board of Trustees and the Treasurer. Their ministry centers on stewardship, legal responsibility, and financial oversight—quiet but vital work that allows our church to carry out its mission with confidence and clarity. Though their efforts may not always be visible, they provide the structure that supports every ministry and outreach of our church family.

The Role of the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees serves as the legal and financial guardian of the church. The Trustees ensure that the church's legal and financial affairs are handled with integrity, transparency, and full compliance with church policy and Virginia law. Their work protects the church's resources and helps ensure that ministry decisions are supported by responsible stewardship.

Key Responsibilities of the Trustees

- **Legal Representation:** Trustees sign legal documents involving the sale, purchase, mortgage, or rental of real property, as required by law or church policy. They hold legal title to all church property and carry out legal functions required by the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- **Congregational Accountability:** Trustees may not buy, sell, mortgage, lease, or transfer real property without the specific approval of the Congregation.
- **Financial Oversight:** Trustees maintain cognizance over the church's financial operations, ensuring that all financial activity is prudent, transparent, and aligned with established policies.

They oversee the Treasurer's work and arrange for the church's annual audit.

- **Advisors to the Elders:** Trustees serve as financial advisors to the Board of Elders, helping ensure that ministry decisions are supported by sound stewardship.
- **Contracts and Obligations:** Trustees sign all written contracts and may obligate the church for necessary legal and financial expenses such as payroll, insurance, taxes, benefits, legal fees, and other required expenditures. Verbal agreements must be confirmed by an authorizing email.

Composition of the Board

The Board of Trustees is composed of three members, each elected by the Congregation for a three year term. One Trustee is elected each year, creating three rotating classes. Trustees may be reelected without limitation. To avoid conflicts of interest, no one may serve as a Trustee if an immediate family member is currently serving as a church officer or staff member.

Newly elected Trustees are formally appointed by the Circuit Court of Orange County, as required for churches in Virginia. If a vacancy occurs, the Board of Elders appoints a Trustee to serve until the next Congregational Meeting.

The Role of the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer(s)

The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer(s) serve under the oversight of the Board of Trustees and play a crucial role in maintaining the financial health and accountability of the church. Their

work ensures that every dollar entrusted to the church is handled with care and accuracy.

Key Responsibilities

- Manage day to day financial operations
- Ensure accurate accounting, reporting, and record keeping
- Support the Trustees in maintaining fiscal integrity
- Assist with budgeting, planning, and stewardship processes
- Serve as a resource to ministry leaders and staff

Treasurers are elected for two year terms beginning January 1 and may be reelected without limitation. If a vacancy occurs, the Board of Elders appoints a Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer to serve until the next Congregational Meeting.

How do we talk about Jesus in a world that is often tired of arguments and pressure, but still deeply hungry for hope?

This Lent, we invite you to join us for Sharing Your Faith, a five-week training designed to help believers share their faith with humility, clarity, and love. This is not a program about scripts, salesmanship, or winning debates. Instead, it is a relational, conversational, and Spirit-led approach to evangelism rooted in listening, compassion, and genuine care for people.

As the saying goes, “People don’t care how much you know until they know how much you care.” This training begins right there.

Each week, participants will grow in confidence as they learn how to listen well, speak truth with grace, and keep Jesus at the center of everyday conversations.

We will explore God’s love, our shared brokenness, the hope of the cross and resurrection, the gift of forgiveness and new identity, and the lifelong journey of growing in grace, all in a way that is practical, biblical, and deeply encouraging.

Whether you come on your own or with others, this training is meant to be experienced in community. Individuals, small groups, Bible study groups, and Sunday School classes are encouraged to attend together. You are also invited to bring family members, friends, or neighbors who may want to grow in confidence and compassion as they learn how to share their faith in everyday life.

Lent reminds us that the way of Christ is not rushed or forced, it is shaped by love, repentance, grace, and transformation. In the same way, evangelism is not loud or pressured. It is patient, relational, and always led by the Spirit.

CHURCH VIDEO CAMERAS

There has been growing interest and many questions about the video cameras around the church.

Previously, we discussed the purpose and vision behind the upgraded access control and camera systems across our facilities.

This is a multi-phase project focused on replacing the current access control systems—covering exterior doors and key interior entry points—with integrated software that enhances accountability for after-hours access.

It also allows us to connect to live video feeds, quickly secure the building if necessary (note that it cannot prevent people from exiting), and remotely operate doors when we're not physically present, enabling us to respond swiftly to unexpected situations.

Additionally, we can share live video footage with the Orange County Sheriff's 911 center in case of emergencies.

Right now, the cameras primarily monitor the church's exterior and key interior areas, including the Discovery Zone, Children's classrooms, the approach pathways to the Discovery Zone and Fellowship Hall.

These cameras are visual-only and do not have sound, except for the two doorbell cameras at the Discovery Zone Entrance from the lower parking lot and the hallway outside the elevator door.

These two devices can communicate with the control room or an on-call administrator when the control room isn't actively staffed, helping us determine whether access should be granted.

We are also expanding this access control and surveillance package to the Living Water Outreach Center.

As its usage grows, it became clear that relying solely on physical keys and limited camera coverage was no longer practical. The new systems are designed to improve safety and convenience.

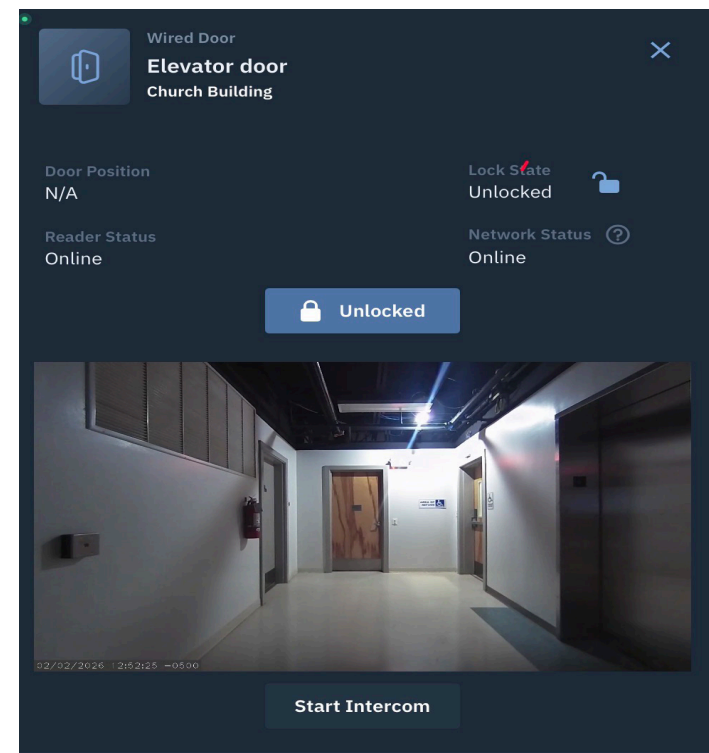
While the cameras are continuously recording, they are actively monitored during major church events, including Sunday worship, Wednesday night family activities, and other community events.

A dedicated team of control-room volunteers monitors all cameras and maintains radio contact with safety team volunteers, who can request assistance or coordinate responses.

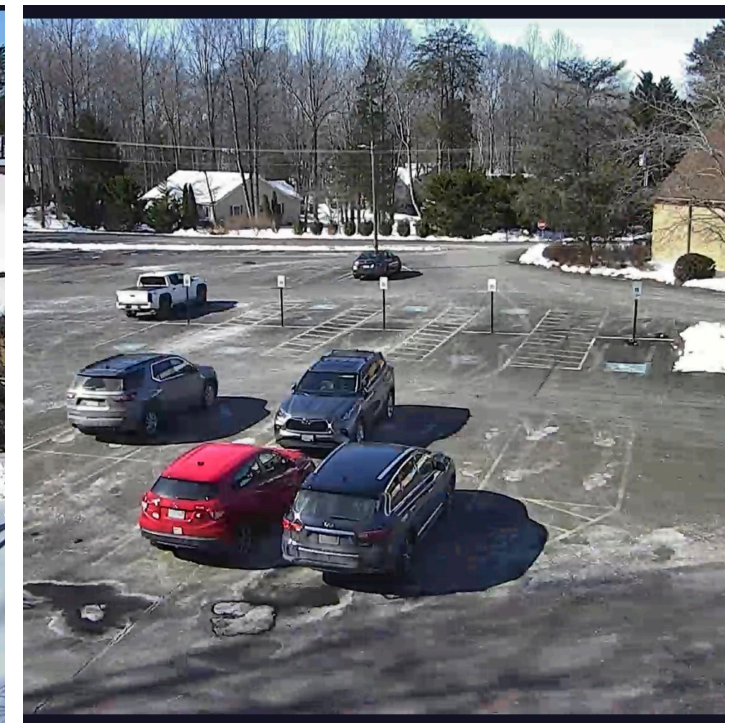
