

# **SESSION ONE**

### **BELMONT 2023 READING PLAN OVERVIEW**

We are excited that you are walking through the Bible with us this year.

### At Belmont, we are committed to being anchored in the Word and led by the Spirit.

**Our goal is love and joy as promised by Jesus** in John 15:9–11 - As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. **Abide in my love.** If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my <u>love, j</u>ust as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your **joy may be full.** 

### This is our hope in learning to abide in His love:

- 1. We want to invest in **reading** the whole context of the Bible
- 2. We want to **memorize** scripture so we can apply it to our life situations.
- 3. We want to **reflect** on scripture so we can pray and abide.
- 4. We want to **journal** what the Lord is saying.
- 5. We want to summarize the week in a **magnificat** by combining verses.

### Here is how this reading plan is organized:

- We will have **eight sessions** of our reading plan laid out in approximately 40-day sections (give or take a few days or a week).
- Each week will include five days of reading that will last seven weeks.
- Each week will **focus on a theme** that will include Old and New Testament readings with key verses to reflect on and a passage to memorize as a church.

### **BIBLE STUDY READING PLAN**

The sessions are broken up into eight segments :

- 1. Jan 2 Feb 21 In the Beginning An overview of the Old Testament
- 2. Feb 22-April 7 Knowing God The Life of Jesus in the gospels
- 3. April 10 May 28 From Easter to Pentecost The study of Acts and connected letters
- 4. May 29 July 16 From Pentecost into Summer Poetry and Parables
- 5. July 17 Sept 3 From Summer to Labor Day Old Stories and New Beginnings
- 6. Sept 4 Oct 22 From Labor Day to Fall Harvest Moments
- 7. Oct 23 Dec 2 From Fall to Advent Bad times, good times, and End times
- 8. Dec 3- Dec 31 Advent to The New year Prophecy and Poetry

If you complete all eight sessions, you will have read most of the Bible. Each week will have bonus readings, if read, will help you read the entire Bible.

### **REFI FCTION & PRAYER**

Each week will include a reading, verses to pray through, and a reflection that will provide further context to the week's theme.

We encourage you to pray through each passage, personalizing the truths and asking God to empower you to live out these words.

Praying the Bible is one of the most powerful ways to pray.

### MEMORIZE

Each week, we will highlight one passage to memorize for the week that will connect to the theme and provide encouragement.

### **LISTEN & OBEY**

We have provided a lined journal for you to capture your thoughts and answers to the questions below:

How is God speaking to you?

Where do you need to obey?

### **JOURNAL & PROCESS**

Take time to journal each day of any thoughts on the scriptures or how Jesus speaks to you. Journaling allows thoughts to become words and is a powerful way to discover and hear from God.

### WRITE A MAGNIFCAT

We encourage you to put together a "magnificat" of verses together at the end of each week.
