BELMONT 2023 READING PLAN OVERVIEW

We are excited that you are walking with us through the Bible this year.

At Belmont, we are committed to being anchored in the Word and led by the Spirit.

Our goal is love and joy as promised by Jesus in John 15:9–11 when He says, "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full."

This is our hope in learning to abide in His love:

- 1. We want to invest in **reading** the whole context of the Bible.
- 2. We want to **memorize** Scripture so we can apply it to our life situations.
- 3. We want to reflect on Scripture so we can pray and abide.
- 4. We want to **journal** about what the Lord is teaching us in His word.
- 5. We want to summarize the week in a **magnificat** by combining verses.

Here is how this reading plan is organized:

- 1. There are **eight sessions** laid out in approximately 40-day sections.
- 2. Each week includes **five days of reading**. There is an optional Psalm to read on Psalm Saturday that relates to the readings that week.
- 3. Each week will include **Old and New Testament readings** with key verses to reflect on and a passage to memorize as a church family.

READING PLAN SCHEDULE

THERE ARE EIGHT SESSIONS IN THE BELMONT READING PLAN:

- 1. Jan 2 Feb 21 In the Beginning An Overview of the Old Testament
- 2. Feb 26 April 7 Follow Me The Life of Jesus in the Gospels
- 3. April 10 May 28 We are Witnesses The study of Acts and Connected Letters
- 4. May 29 July 16 I Shall not Want Poetry and Praise
- 5. July 17 Sept 3 For Such a Time as This Stories of Trust
- 6. Sept 4 Oct 22 Be Careful- Old Testament Exhortations to Trust
- 7. Oct 23 Dec 2 The Time is Near- The End and the New Beginning
- 8. Dec 3- Dec 31 Consider Jesus The Beginning of Grace

If you complete all eight sessions, you will have read most of the Old Testament and the entire New Testament. Each week will have bonus readings, which if read, will complete the entire Bible.

BONUS RESOURCES:

We have included a map of the missionary journeys and a chronological outline for Paul's letters at the end of this session to help you put into context the locations and timing of the book of Acts.

REFLECTION & PRAYER

Each week will include a reflection section to ponder and pray through scriptures. Since we will be reading solely out of the gospels this session, each reflection section will include a passage from a correlated passage from the Old Testament law, poetry, and prophets.

We encourage you to pray through each passage, personalizing each truth and asking God to empower you to live out these words. Praying the Scriptures is one of the most powerful ways to pray.

We can be confident that God will always answer his word because it glorifies the Father to fulfill his promises.

MEMORIZE

Each week includes a passage to memorize that connects to the theme. Our hope is that these short verses will be both practical and helpful in your walk with Jesus. We encourage a consistent rhythm of reviewing and meditating on the verses. We have included a reference sheet for all the memory verses in this session at the end to help your review.

PRAYER

The prayer section provides a space to worship, give thanks, confess and/or present your requests to God. We encourage you to use this section to pray for your family, Belmont Church and our community.

JOURNALING

How is God speaking to you and how do you need to obey? What insights is the Spirit showing you? Take time to journal your thoughts on the Scriptures. Journaling is a powerful tool for growth in your relationship with God.

WRITE A MAGNIFICAT

We encourage you to put together a "magnificat" of verses at the end of each week. A Magnificat can be described as a song or a prayer to God using Scripture. The concept of the Magnificat came from Mary, the mother of Jesus in Luke 2.

In response to the news from Elizabeth, who through the Spirit acknowledged the baby in her womb, Mary's heart overflowed with praise. In this Magnificat, she prayed and sang Scripture from memory from 15 different passages from the law, history, major and minor prophets and poetry. She also praised God for six of His attributes. We hope you use this area to summarize, highlight the attributes of God you saw revealed, and pray the Scriptures you compiled back to God.

REFLECTION


