Reflecting on Our Recent Sermon Series: Church Foundations

As we bid farewell to our recent sermon series, we find ourselves invigorated and inspired by the timeless wisdom shared during these weeks of exploration. Our journey through the foundations of the church—Worship, Discipleship, Fellowship, and Evangelism—has been a profound one, and we invite you to catch up on these insightful messages online.

Week 1: Worship

In our first week, we delved into the transformative power of worship. Worship is not just a ritual; it's an encounter with God that can change our lives. We learned from Isaiah's encounter in Isaiah 6:1-8 that worship is a synesthetic experience that invites us to gather before God and leave changed.

Week 3: Fellowship

Acts 2:42-47 provided a model for us, emphasizing teaching, breaking bread, prayers, and sharing with those in need as essential building blocks of Christian fellowship.

Discipleship, as we discovered, is a patient and intentional journey. We explored the importance of patience and perseverance in growing as disciples of Christ. Like the early church, we are called to form habits that reflect the character of Christ, ultimately making us attractive to those around us.

Week 4: Evangelism & Mission

In our final week, we explored the art of evangelism and mission. We looked at the Apostle Philip's encounter with the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8 and learned the "ABC's of Evangelism": being available, biblical, and connectional in sharing our faith. Evangelism is central to our mission of helping people know Jesus, live Jesus, and share Jesus.

As we move forward, we're excited to announce our upcoming fall series on the Aldersgate Vision: **Know Jesus, Live Jesus, Share Jesus**. We had our first church conference as an independent church on August 13th, at 11:45 AM. Here's a quick summary of the discussion and the decision that was made. The primary purpose of the meeting was to discuss and vote on selling the parsonage. The meeting began with prayer.

Updates were provided on the following items:

- o Aldersgate is officially an independent church as of June 29th.
- o As of August 11, 2023, 238 people have transferred their membership to the new church.
- o There is a new member class on September 17 from 2:00-5:00 PM
- o The Vision, mission and values continue as in the past. The focus is to live-out our vision, Know-Live-Share Jesus.
- o We are continuing to use the same governance model and leadership structure Ministry Resource Team (MRT), Trustees, Staff Parish, and Finance committees.
- o The MRT is evaluating a simplified leadership structure that was recommended during Growing Effective Churches. If any change would be recommended, it would be discussed and approved by a vote of the church members at a church conference
- o Finances- remain strong as God continues to bless us. This includes giving to missions.
- o Discussion and a vote took place to sell the parsonage.
 - While the parsonage has served us well since 1983, it is no longer needed for pastor housing.
 - The members present voted unanimously to sell the parsonage.
 - The property will be place on the market as soon as possible.
 - Special thanks to Joanne Murr and the Trustees for their dedication to caring for this property and the families that lived in it over the years.

They are also working on the By-Laws we need to be able to have written policies and procedures that we can use to govern and manage our church. This is a hard process and it's taking time, so it's done correctly and legally.

Another thing they are doing is talking with our congregation. What are your dreams about Aldersgate? Where do you see us going and how do we get there? How do we do more ministry? How do we create more opportunities to serve in our church as well as our community? How can we communicate better and more clearly? How can we live out our vision for our church – Know Live Share JESUS?

In addition to the normal administration of the church, they are planning, envisioning, talking, praying together, listening for God's direction, and seeking His will for Aldersgate.

Your leaders are busy working for God and working for you and Aldersgate. Help them by your prayers and talking with them. Let them know your thoughts and how you might be able to help. Continue to support Aldersgate with your time, talents, and treasures.

FINANCE REPORT

Through July, we continue to find ourselves in a good place financially. July was a five Sunday month, which certainly helped to keep our income positive. With that considered, our giving has been trending below average since April. This is not uncommon for the summer season and we are certainly blessed to find ourselves over \$23,000 in the black at this point in the year. Our expenses have continued to track below budget. With the staffing level approaching normal, we can expect our expenses to be closer to budget going forward.

The loan for disaffiliation is currently sitting at \$300,000 after a recent payment of approximately \$217,000. We originally borrowed the full \$517,000 to simplify the closing process. The current plan is to amortize the loan of \$300,000 over 10 years and pay it off. That may be subject to change based on interest rates and capital plans.

Opportunities to Serve

Classroom Aide

If anyone is interested in being an aide in the classroom, we are now able to come into the building. Please contact me if you are interested, we can discuss grade choice, hours, etc.

Serving

There is an opportunity monthly that would ask for some volunteers to assist with serving breakfast to celebrate Students of the Month. This would be for a short time period, 1-2 hours, before school, celebrating achievements.

Bearcat Buddies

Older students are given an opportunity to read with kindergarten students on a regular basis. Guidance in assisting these students with the reading and understanding of the text would benefit all in this program, freeing the teachers to assist in other classroom activities. Dates and times would be given when this begins.

Girls on the Run

Jackson School is a participant in this Nationwide program which is an amazing program not only in athletics but also character building along with other benefits. The program is open to girls in grades 3-5. They meet 2 times per week, Fall and Spring, for 8 weeks, after school. Typically, this is a Monday/Thursday program, however, if anyone in the church, even older youth who love to run, would like to volunteer, this can be changed. If anyone in the church is trained, this would be an amazing opportunity. Since this is a Nationwide program, training is required, and that would be up to the individual volunteering to go through the training. The boys in the school have requested this same type of program for them, unfortunately there isn't one in place. However, that doesn't mean we couldn't use the same model and make a program for the boys. This truly is an amazing program! Our granddaughter participated in it for several years. I have seen the girls running on the Rail Trail many times for events. If you like to run, this would be a fun out-reach!

As you can see, the options for volunteering at the school have changed dramatically, but that doesn't mean we can't be involved in a new way!


God is on the move, opening doors here at Aldersgate Church and at Jackson School!!! Get ready, I believe He has GREAT things in store for us in Mission Outreach!!



This walk will focus on the aftermath of the battle, the burial of the dead and attitudes toward death, and the role that places like the Gettysburg National Cemetery play in the process of grief. 
