

"The Lord Will Have Compassion."

Isaiah 9:6-7

"For a child will be born for us, a son will be given to us, and the government will be on his shoulders. He will be named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace. The dominion will be vast, and its prosperity will never end. He will reign on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish and sustain it with justice and righteousness from now on and forever. The zeal of the Lord of Hosts will accomplish this."

This is a passage that many of you are already familiar with. It is one that is read mostly around Christmas time, as it tells of the coming Messiah who will lead in victory over all sin and death. But its meaning extends beyond just prophesying about Jesus.

In its day, this was a message of compassion and hope for the people of Judah. At the time this was written, the people of Judah were in bad shape. They were poisoned with a long line of Kings who simply did whatever they desired. Rarely was there one who did what was right in the Lord's sight. God warned them and pleaded with them to turn to him and to follow him, but the word says they still did what was evil in the Lord's sight.

It had finally gotten to the point where the Lord was tired of Judah's sin and pronounced judgment on them. They were to be attacked and exiled from God's presence. And yet, this passage marks a turning point in the Lord's judgment.

Yes, God had to punish his people for doing what was wrong. Yes, God's anger burned against the people of Judah because of their sin.

But there would be one coming who would wipe that all away. Though the people were ruled by king after king who did evil and though they were subject to oppression by foreign kings,

God would send one who would be the perfect king, who will have a kingdom of righteousness and justice, who would not allow evil to reign, but would reign over evil. Who would bring about peace to the children of God and be mighty in power and deed.

This message marked the end of God's punishment and the beginning of his rescue plan. No longer would earthly kings corrupt God's people, but a heavenly one would save and sanctify his people.

So friends, though our sins are many, God's mercy is so much more. Though there must be consequences for our actions, our Lord saves us and brings us into a right standing with him. Trust the Lord, give him your sins, and receive forgiveness from our Eternal Father."
