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## JOYFULLY SHARE YOUR ABUNDANCE WITH OTHERS

A few years ago, the church I pastored partnered with Out of the Garden Project, a nonprofit addressing food insecurity in the greater Greensboro, North Carolina area. Beyond planting seeds, pulling weeds, and exchanging gardening tips, Lily, our representative from Out of the Garden, shared a compelling vision: helping others learn to garden so they could provide food for themselves and experience personal abundance.

My ears perked up as I watched her passion for seeing neighbors harvest more food than they could even store. She was deeply convicted that such abundance could spark generosity, especially in communities where access to food was limited by transportation or resources. For Lily, abundance was never an end in itself; it was a pathway to generosity, community, and joy.

As I reflect on her proactive, millennial passion for addressing food insecurity, I see how closely her vision aligns with God’s heart. Simply put, it is God’s will that His people be generous. Scripture is clear: our abundance is meant to do more than enrich ourselves; it is meant to bless others.

Leviticus teaches us to leave the overflow of our harvest for those in need (Lev. 19:9–10) and to ensure that our abundance serves both the poor and the foreigner (Lev. 23:22). The Apostle Paul reminds us that we are to care for family members beyond our immediate household (1 Tim. 5:8). Our God provides so that we might generously care for family, neighbors, and fellow members of the body of Christ.

Paul declares, “He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness” (2 Cor. 9:10). When we give, we are not merely supporting a good cause—we are participating in the work of the Kingdom.

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# From the beginning,

God told Abraham that his descendants would bless the nations. While the proclamation of the Gospel remains central to that calling, so does the way we live as citizens of God's Kingdom, which entails sharing His generosity in tangible, life-giving ways.

History bears this out. When John Wesley preached throughout England, entire communities were transformed. As people were saved, regenerated, and sanctified, they not only pursued holy living but became faithful stewards. They cared for the poor, invested in startups, and helped others gain the means to provide for themselves. This should not surprise us. When people taste the generosity of God, they themselves become generous.

# Heart2Heart Ministries

## WHO WILL ROLL THE STONE AWAY?

*“When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, “Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?” And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large.” Mark 16:1-4*

As the women approached the tomb early on that first Resurrection morning, carrying spices to anoint the body of Jesus, they went with love, faith, and intention. Despite her grief, Mary Magdalene had kept her eye on Jesus through his death and burial – she knew where they had buried him (Mark 15:47). So, on the third day after his death, she and the other women bought spices and went to the tomb with faith that they would have access to Jesus. They had been devoted followers of Jesus and wanted to express their devotion, care, and commitment to Him.

As they walked, one question weighed on their minds: “Who will roll the stone away?” Mary knew the stone they placed in front of the tomb was large. It was a real obstacle that they had not planned for, like they did with the spices. They did not ask one of the disciples to come and help them. They did not know if the soldier guarding the tomb would help them roll away the stone or even allow them close to the tomb. Yet they kept walking toward the tomb anyway, full of hope that they would get to Jesus. They didn’t know that the stone had already been rolled away.

Are you facing any large stones in your life that just seem insurmountable? Perhaps you are facing a health diagnosis that only God can heal. Keep walking toward Jesus. Are you overwhelmed with grief and uncertainty from the death of a loved one? Keep leaning into the God who gives peace and comfort. Perhaps you are experiencing brokenness in your relationships. Trust the One who reconciles and brings healing in the midst of brokenness. During uncertainty, I encourage you to lean into Jesus: “Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.” (Hebrews 11:1)

## *This issue:*

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In many ways, discipleship begins in the same place. God often calls us forward before the obstacle is removed. We pursue relationships with unchurched women, trusting that God can remove the barriers that stand in the way of them getting to Jesus.

I recently experienced my own “stone” moment. Earlier this week, I had a meeting with one of my students. After we finished discussing the academic portion of our conversation, we moved on to talk about personal things. The student had just had a baby and was expressing how tough it was for them as a couple as they adjust to their new normal. I encouraged my student and felt the inclination to ask to pray with the student. The student is very warm toward me and often speaks freely with me about their faith and their life, but they are of a different faith that does not embrace Christianity.

I did not offer to pray with my student in that moment because of their beliefs and practical wisdom in my role, but I left the door open for my student to talk to me about anything marriage and parenthood. I left the conversation feeling like I missed an important opportunity. I wondered how I can represent Christ in a way that will not jeopardize my job, yet still exercise faith that God is opening a door to indeed share the gospel. It felt like standing before a large stone, unsure how God would make a way.

Have you ever been there, wanting to express your faith but felt like there was a large barrier in front of you? Mary Magdalene and the other women felt the same way when they approached the tomb. The women did not yet know that God had already moved the stone. But they showed up anyway. Disciple making often looks and feels the same way—taking faithful steps toward Jesus even when the path is unclear. The Resurrection reminds us that the power of God is already at work before we arrive. Our calling is to walk faithfully, trusting that the stone will not have the final word.

Sometimes the “stones” we face in ministry look like exhaustion, discouragement, leadership pressure, fear, caring for others while neglecting ourselves, and other crises. Yet the resurrection story shows us something powerful: **God honors those who keep walking toward Jesus, even with unanswered questions.**

Discipleship is not about having every obstacle solved. It is about faithfully following Christ, leading others to commit to Jesus, and multiplying followers along the way.

This Easter season, consider:

- Who is walking behind you that you can disciple?
- What stone might God already be moving that you cannot yet see?
- Where is Jesus inviting you to walk forward in faith?

The women came carrying spices to anoint the body of a dead Savior. They left, encountering the **resurrected Christ**. That is the promise of discipleship. The stone may look heavy. The path may feel uncertain. But resurrection power is already at work. So, keep walking toward Jesus. Because when we move toward Jesus in faith, we often discover **the stone has already been rolled away.**

# Sonlife Disciple-Making Conference: A Transformational Weekend of Learning and Growth

Bishop Trevor & Aileen Reid, along with 13 student ministry leaders from around the state, attended the **Sonlife Disciple-Making Conference** in St. Augustine, Florida, February 23-26, 2026. The **Sonlife Disciple-Making Conference** is a powerful gathering designed to equip leaders and believers with practical strategies for making disciples the way Jesus did. The conference focuses on helping churches move beyond simply maintaining programs and toward **intentional disciple-multiplication modeled after the ministry of Christ**.

A central theme of the conference was the **“Four Chairs” discipleship framework**, which illustrates the spiritual journey Jesus used when calling and developing His disciples. This model highlights the progressive stages of spiritual growth:

- **Chair 1: Come and See (John 1:39)**
- **Chair 2: Follow Me (John 1:43)**
- **Chair 3: Become a Fisher of Men (Matthew 4:19)**
- **Chair 4: Go and Bear Fruit (John 15:16)**

We were challenged to recognize where people currently sit in their spiritual journey and intentionally guide them toward the next stage of growth and multiplication.

## Learning from the Model of Jesus

Throughout the sessions and workshops, we studied the life of Jesus in chronological order to better understand **His intentional strategy for disciple-making**. Rather than simply gathering followers, Jesus invested deeply in individuals, meeting them where they were while continually challenging them to grow.

Amy Quesinberry, Student Ministries Central Region, reflected on the impact of seeing Jesus’ ministry through this framework:

“*Walking through the chronological calling of the disciples revealed the intentional, relational journey Jesus led them on—meeting each person exactly where they were and guiding them toward their next step in their growth.*”

This perspective helped us to realize that disciple-making is not accidental. It requires prayer, focus, and a willingness to invest intentionally in others.

“Come and see.” – John 1:39

Jesus first invited people to encounter Him. Disciple-making begins with invitation and relationship.

## A Personal Challenge for Leaders

For many leaders in attendance, the conference served as both encouragement and personal evaluation.

Ronisha Robinson, Love Fellowship Ministries, Miami Gardens, shared how the teaching challenged her own leadership: “Even as a leader, sitting in the workshop, as a student, challenged me to evaluate where I’m personally sitting in the 4 Chairs. It stretched me, corrected me, and reminded me that leadership requires continual growth and surrender. I had to ask myself if I’m truly multiplying disciples or just maintaining movement.”

She also expressed excitement about bringing the framework back to her church: “I can already see how this framework will help our youth clearly understand where they are and what their next step is... **because no one is meant to stay in the same chair!**”



Others echoed this sentiment, noting that the conference helped clarify their calling as leaders.

Cherisse Hodge, also a leader at Love Fellowship Ministries, described the experience as enlightening: “My experience at the conference helped me clarify the kind of leader I want to become and reshaped my thinking in meaningful ways. I left feeling inspired and motivated to apply what I learned in practical ways.”

## A Vision for Intentional Discipleship

Team members repeatedly emphasized how the conference reinforced the importance of intentional ministry and responsibility in disciple-making.

Sheila Mathis, Student Ministries Northwest Region, reflected on the example of Christ: “Jesus prioritized His ministry. The disciples reorganized their priorities to follow Him, and Jesus prepared them to become fishers of people. This has challenged me to be more intentional, disciplined, and mission-minded in my own walk and service.”

Others were particularly moved by how clearly the conference explained the process of disciple multiplication.

Hadassah Davis, Ocala COGOP noted: “What I loved most was how they simplified deep strategies so that anyone can understand and share them. By repeating these truths, they weren’t just giving us head knowledge—they were embedding these strategies into our hearts.” She also emphasized the importance of community in the discipleship process, recalling meaningful discussions with fellow attendees that brought the proverb “iron sharpens iron” to life.

## A Blessing for First-Time Attendees

This was our first time attending the Sonlife conference, and the experience left a lasting impact.

Marsha Colley, Miami 19th Ave. COGOP shared: “It was truly a blessing to be there. Attending the conference allowed me to think about the 4 Chair method and how to use it with the youth in my local church.”

Jania Boucher, Leigh Acres COGOP described the experience as eye-opening:

“I received a large amount of Spirit-led information while I was there. I got clarity on the method Jesus used to create disciples. His strategy was intentional and it’s really the blueprint for how we should be living and making disciples.”



Even practical insights about discipling younger believers stood out. Sis. Linda Mullings, Westway COGOP, Tallahassee, noted the importance of beginning discipleship early: “I was surprised to learn that we need to start teaching our elementary students how to be disciple makers.”

In the evenings, the team debriefed about the instruction and how to implement the model in our local churches, fellowshiped over dinner, challenged each other in a game of dominoes, and worked hard to stay on top of the leaderboard. We were successful in holding off our Canadian challengers and dominated the top ranks. Bishop Trevor, the fiercest competitor, won of course!

Beyond teaching and workshops, many participants described the weekend as spiritually transformative. Gia Roberts, Student Ministries South Region, reflected:

“This weekend at the Sonlife Conference was more than a learning experience—it was transformational. I am excited and expectant to see how God will use these disciples to grow, multiply, and faithfully carry out Christ’s ministry.”

For many, the conference reinforced a simple but powerful truth: **discipleship is the mission of the Church**. When believers intentionally follow Jesus’ example—investing in others, training them to make disciples, and sending them out to bear fruit—the gospel continues to multiply.

As we return to our churches and communities, we carry with us not only new strategies but also renewed passion and vision to help others move forward in their journey with Christ—because, as Ronisha noted so clearly, **“No one is meant to stay in the same chair!”**

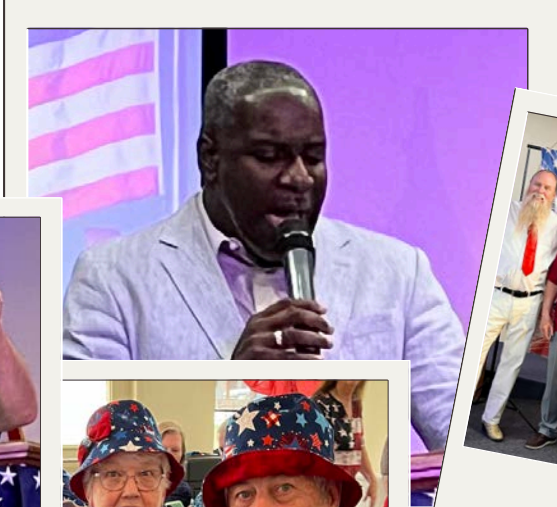
